I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed development of the land at Downer Ave. and Belleview with the construction of a 5-story parking structure. I live in a neighborhood just south of this area and appreciate the beauty and architectural interest in this east side area. This is why I live where I do. I am not a Milwaukee native but moved here from Buffalo, New York some years ago and was very impressed with the beauty of Milwaukee's lake front and the historic homes and other buildings in the neighborhoods along the east side corridor. This is one of the prime reasons that I chose to continue living in Milwaukee. Preserving and respecting the uniqueness and beauty of our architectural heritage is important for quality of life. It is important in showcasing the uniqueness of our city and drawing both new residents and commerce to the city. It is also important to consider the impact on current residents, who value living where they do for the same reasons I do. I understand the economic motivation for development of land to bring in revenue to the city. However, development can be planned in a way that is respectful and preserves the beauty and architectural integrity of an area that truly deserves that and that is recognized for it's historic value! The proposed parking structure is not compatible with the neighborhood in its size or its appearance.

I am also writing on behalf of Thea and Peter Kovac, owners of the home on the adjacent lot, because of problems and safety issues with their home that would be caused by the proposed parking structure.
