**ROBERT “BOB” TRIMMIER**

*passed from this life at the age of 67 on January 5, 2014 and a memorial gathering was held at the Milwaukee Irish Fest Center in Wauwatosa on January 11, 2014; and*

***WHEREAS,** Born in Milwaukee on November 22, 1946, Robert “Bob” Trimmier proudly served his country in the U.S. Army and was stationed at Fort Sheridan during the Vietnam War; and*

***WHEREAS,** In 2008, Bob Trimmier retired after more than 23 years of service to the City of Milwaukee, where he served in various roles in the Department of City Development, the Redevelopment Authority of the City of Milwaukee, the Milwaukee Economic Development Corp. and other city departments; and*

***WHEREAS,** An avid bicyclist, Bob Trimmier’s service on the City of Milwaukee Bicycle and Pedestrian Task Force and involvement in the annual Bike to Work Week brought attention to the importance of bicycles as a viable transportation option; and*

***WHEREAS,** Bob Trimmier – a founding member of the Story Hill Neighborhood Association – was a gifted writer, and used those gifts to foster effective communication between City government and Milwaukee’s business community and as a community columnist for the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel; and*

***WHEREAS,** Bob was co-founder of CASH (Citizens Aligned for Safe Highways) and was a tireless advocate for the City of Milwaukee, was quite knowledgeable about baseball and other sports, was a big fan of the arts in Milwaukee (including the Rep and the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra), was a connoisseur of fine dining in Milwaukee, loved his family was always proud of his daughters; and*

***WHEREAS,** Bob Trimmier leaves to cherish his memory his beloved wife, Mary, daughters Maggie and Miranda and a supportive network of loving relatives and friends; now, therefore, be it*
