**1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):**

The goal of project is to increase awareness and education of HPV infection; to elucidate this significant health concern among the high risk, urban population, and ultimately increase intention to vaccinate among parents/guardians and adolescents. Although it is beyond the scope of this project, ultimately, the goal is to increase HPV vaccination rates, resulting in reduction in the incidence HPV infection, the incidence of short-term HPV related disease, and the reduction in morbidity of short-term HPV-related disease. This outcome would subsequently lead to the desired long-term impact—the reduction of the morbidity and mortality from malignancy associated with HPV infection. The project is a collaboration between the City of Milwaukee Health Department, the Medical College of Wisconsin and the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Milwaukee. The proposed intervention utilizes social media to deliver peer education on HPV prevention to adolescents.
