# NIDC Resources



- Common Council allocated \$150,000 to NIDC for implementation of the Healthy Neighborhoods Initiative and Community Improvement Projects during 2013.
  - 41 projects were approved for over \$144,000
- Funding is available to operate the program at the same level in 2014

# Bloom & Groom 2013



- NIDC coordinated 18 neighborhoods citywide to distribute over 50,000 flowers and plants for neighborhood planting days.
- All 9 Healthy Neighborhoods participated in Bloom & Groom.
- This was a \$45,000 investment in neighborhood beautification, Lowe's provided over \$17,000 of in-kind support.
