File No. 050246 is a resolution authorizing the transfer and expenditure of \$18,262 from the Neighborhood Commercial District Street Improvement Fund for the Historic Third Ward Commercial District Enhancement Project, in the 4th Aldermanic District. (DCD)

### **Background**

- 1. The Historic Third Ward Association and City of Milwaukee have invested in many improvements within the historic third ward area, including creating a business improvement district (BID No. 2 via Resolution No. 870501) and a tax incremental district (TID No. 34 via Resolution No. 970388)
- 2. The area is generally bounded by East Clybourn Street, North Water Street, East Erie Street, North Broadway and the Milwaukee River.
- The 2005 Capital Improvement Budget appropriated \$500,000 for the Neighborhood Commercial District Street Improvement Fund to support local business associations' street enhancement initiatives.

#### **Discussion**

- 1. This resolution approves a \$18,262 grant transfer and expenditure from the Neighborhood Commercial District Street Improvement Fund (NCDSIF) capital account to the Historic Third Ward Business Improvement District No. 2.
- 2. The contribution will fund additional trash receptacles and other street amenities.
- 3. BID No. 2 will match the \$18,262 city contribution.

## **Fiscal Impact**

As of 6/26/05, the aggregate NCDSI fund balance, including previous years' authority, totaled \$1,425,000, according to a FMIS query.

Adopting File 050246 authorizes a \$18,262 transfer and expenditure from the Neighorhood Commercial District Street Improvement Fund parent account ST04080000 to the Historic Third Ward Commercial District Enhancement Project account ST04083800.

## **Other Information**

BID No. 2's 18-Yr. Operating Plan budget is \$584,288, according to Exhibit D in Common Council Resolution 040720. Revenues from the general BID and private property assessments will fund expenditures for operating, riverwalk construction and maintenance, special assessments and dockwall reconstruction

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
