SECOND REVISED NOTICE

- To: All Members of the Milwaukee Common Council
- From: The Public Safety Committee
- Re: Report of the Revocation of the public passenger vehicle driver's license of Opinder Singh.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Opinder Singh (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a public passenger vehicle driver's license in the City of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expires at midnight, October 31, 2013.
- 2. On October 16, 2012, the City Clerk's Office provided notice to the Licensee pursuant to Section 100-54-12 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances that said license was subject to revocation based upon information contained in a police report, Criminal Complaint and Judgment of Conviction from Milwaukee County Case No. 2012-CF-2788 that were attached to the notice. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report, Criminal Complaint and Judgment of Conviction on October 24, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did appear and was represented by Attorney Caitlin Noonan of Kim & Lavoy, S.C.
- 3. The following was considered by the Public Safety Committee and was made part of the record on October 24, 2012:
 - A. On May 31, 2012, the Licensee was arrested by West Allis Police department for child enticement (§ 948.07-felony), false imprisonment (§ 940.30-felony) and 2nd degree sexual assault of a child (§ 948.02-felony). These offenses occurred while operating Yellow Cab #133.
 - B. The Criminal Complaint filed in Milwaukee County Circuit Court Case No. 2012-CF-2788 documented the facts surrounding the criminal charges.
 - C. The Judgment of Conviction in Case No. 2012-CF-2788 documented the applicant was convicted of disorderly conduct and 4th degree sexual

assault on July 24, 2012 in Milwaukee County Circuit Court.

D. The above-described offenses substantially relate to the Licensee's public passenger vehicle driver's license because these offenses were committed through the use of a taxicab.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the Licensee, Opinder Singh, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to continue holding his public passenger vehicle driver's license based upon the licensee's conviction of sexual assault and disorderly conduct while operating his taxicab.
- 3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to revoke the public passenger vehicle driver's license of the Licensee based upon the record as outlined above.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee by vote of three (3) ayes, one (1) absent and one (1) excused recommends that the public passenger vehicle driver's license of Opinder Singh be revoked.
