My name is Hannah Medrow, and I am a homeowner at 3029 N Booth St., in Milele Coggs' district. A large part of my neighborhood is also in Nik Kovac's district.

I am opposed to the proposed city ordinance to restrict the painting of murals on private property. As a homeowner and a taxpayer I see no reason why I need city approval or a paid permit to paint my own property, as long as the content isn't indecent or profane.

I and 16 of my neighbors participated this past summer in a wonderful project called Art in the Alleys. A number of local artists worked with homeowners to design murals which were painted on garage doors and fences.
