Substitute resolution relating to the reallocation of administration funding for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 to various City departments.
This resolution provides that the Community Development Grants Administration (CDGA) is directed to amend the administration allocation for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP2) as follows:

The allocation for the Community Development Grants Administration is decreased by \$28,000.

The allocation for the Office of the Comptroller is decreased by \$13,600.

The allocation for the Department of City Development is decreased by \$128,000.

The allocation for the Department of Neighborhood Services is decreased by \$17,600.

The allocation for the Health department is decreased by \$12,800.

The allocation for the Police Department is increased by \$200,000.

Those agencies that have their NSP2 administration funding decreased by this action shall be made whole in an aggregate amount up to \$200,000 from the first dollar available to the 2011 Community Development Block Grant contingency account.

Whereas, Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP2) is a component of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; and

Whereas CDBG's primary objective is developing viable urban communities through decent housing, a suitable living environment and economic opportunity; and

Whereas, Quality of life issues which have an adverse impact on neighborhoods will be aggressively enforced; and

Whereas, Abandoned and foreclosed properties become havens for vandalism, arson and drug crimes; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Community Development Grants Administration is directed to amend the administration allocation for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 as follows:

The allocation for the Community Development Grants Administration is decreased by \$28,000.

The allocation for the office of the Comptroller is decreased by \$13,600.

The allocation for the Department of City Development is decreased by \$128,000.

The allocation for the Department of Neighborhood Services is decreased by \$17,600.

The allocation for the Milwaukee Health department is decreased by \$12,800.

The allocation for the Milwaukee Police Department is increased by \$200,000.

; and, be it

Further Resolved, That those agencies that have their NSP2 administration funding decreased by this action shall be made whole in an aggregate amount up to \$200,000 from the first dollar available to the 2011 Community Development Block Grant contingency account; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the Police Department shall submit budgets and activity reports in the amounts and according to any conditions approved by the Common Council, the Community Development Grants Administration and the City Comptroller for review and approval; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the payments for NSP2 costs incurred shall be paid in accordance with approved NSP2 reimbursement policy based on the approval by the Community Development Grants

Administration and the City Comptroller.
