Regarding: Your Class B Tavern, Public Entertainment Premises, and  Dealer License Applications Requesting Instrumental Musicians, Bands, and Disc Jockey as agent for "Walkers Lounge & Events LLC" for "Walkers Lounge & Events" at 626 S 5TH St.

There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.



During this search, none of the items taken during the burglary were located. While speaking to him, the officer smelled burnt marijuana on Mr. Velazquez and in his office. Mr. Velazquez eventually admitted to the officer that he had been smoking marijuana just prior to the officer's arrival. Because the officer did not locate any marijuana, no additional action was taken. Milwaukee police incident report #13-010-0077 was filed regarding the burglary.

11. On 09/07/2014 Milwaukee police responded to an anonymous complaint of underage patrons inside the business at 626 South 5th Street (Club Kana). Officers did not observe any violations.

12. On 01/18/2015 Milwaukee police officers observed a subject screaming and taking off his shirt outside of Kana Mojito Club. This subject told officers he had been punched in the head by an unknown subject near the front door of the business. Officers were unable to locate additional witness's and the victim declined to file a police report.

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13. On 02/21/2016 Milwaukee police responded to a fight complaint at 626 South 5th Street (Kana Mojito Club). Security at the business, as well as the applicant's son, stated there had not been any fights outside or at the establishment. Officers did not observe any signs a fight had taken place and they were unable to view video from the business.

14. On 02/27/2016 Milwaukee police took a battery complaint from a citizen that walked into Milwaukee police district #2 (245 West Lincoln Avenue). The citizen, Dennis Wojciechowski, told officers he had been at Kana Mojito Club (626 South 5th Street) to celebrate his birthday, when he was battered and sprayed with pepper spray by one of the security guards for no reason. Officers conducted follow up at Kana Mojito Club (626 South 5th Street) and spoke with security guard, Rigoberto Delatorre, regarding the incident. Delatorre told officers that a bartender had observed Wojciechowski push a female in the face with his hand. Security then asked Wojciechowski to leave. Wojciechowski refused to leave and was escorted out by 5 security guards. Once outside, Wojciechowski attempted to get past Delatorre and reenter the club. Delatorre then sprayed Wojciechowski in the face with OC spray and he, along with other security guards, carried Wojciecowski outside. Officers then viewed video footage of the incident which confirmed Delatorre's version of events.

16. On 10/15/16, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a battery complaint at St. Luke's Hospital. A witness, Jocelyn Soto-Varelas, stated on the night of 10/14/16, she was at Kana Mojito Club (626 S 5th St), with her friend, Alexandra Calderon, who was attacked by a known subject, Joanne Valdez. Soto-Varelas and Calderon were in the bathroom when Valdez attacked Calderon. The witness observed the suspect punching the victim, smashing her head into the walls and toilet, and dragging her on the floor. The witness stated a friend of the suspect posted a video of the incident on Facebook. The victim suffered a broken orbital socket, brain trauma, sprained elbow and abrasions. Officers spoke to the agent, Angel Velazquez regarding the incident. He stated that security advised him that there was a fight in in the women's bathroom. He went inside and observed a female with a swollen eye. Velazquez went to get ice for the victim but when he returned she already had left. Velazquez was unaware that victim and suspect were under the age of 21. The establishment was cooperative.

The applicant stated that from 10a-3p he will be serving brunch and food, closing for several hours, then re-opening for the evening. He stated that after 9pm, when they have bands/DJ's playing music they will have a cover charge and 25+ age restriction, plus dress code. He is installing 9 total cameras, with 3 being installed outside and the remaining 6 inside. The applicant was advised that if incidents occur that security cannot handle, it's not a bad thing to call the police for assistance, I explained to him that it's when an incident does occur, and police

are intentionally not called, it is looked at negatively by the Common Council and Licensing Committee.

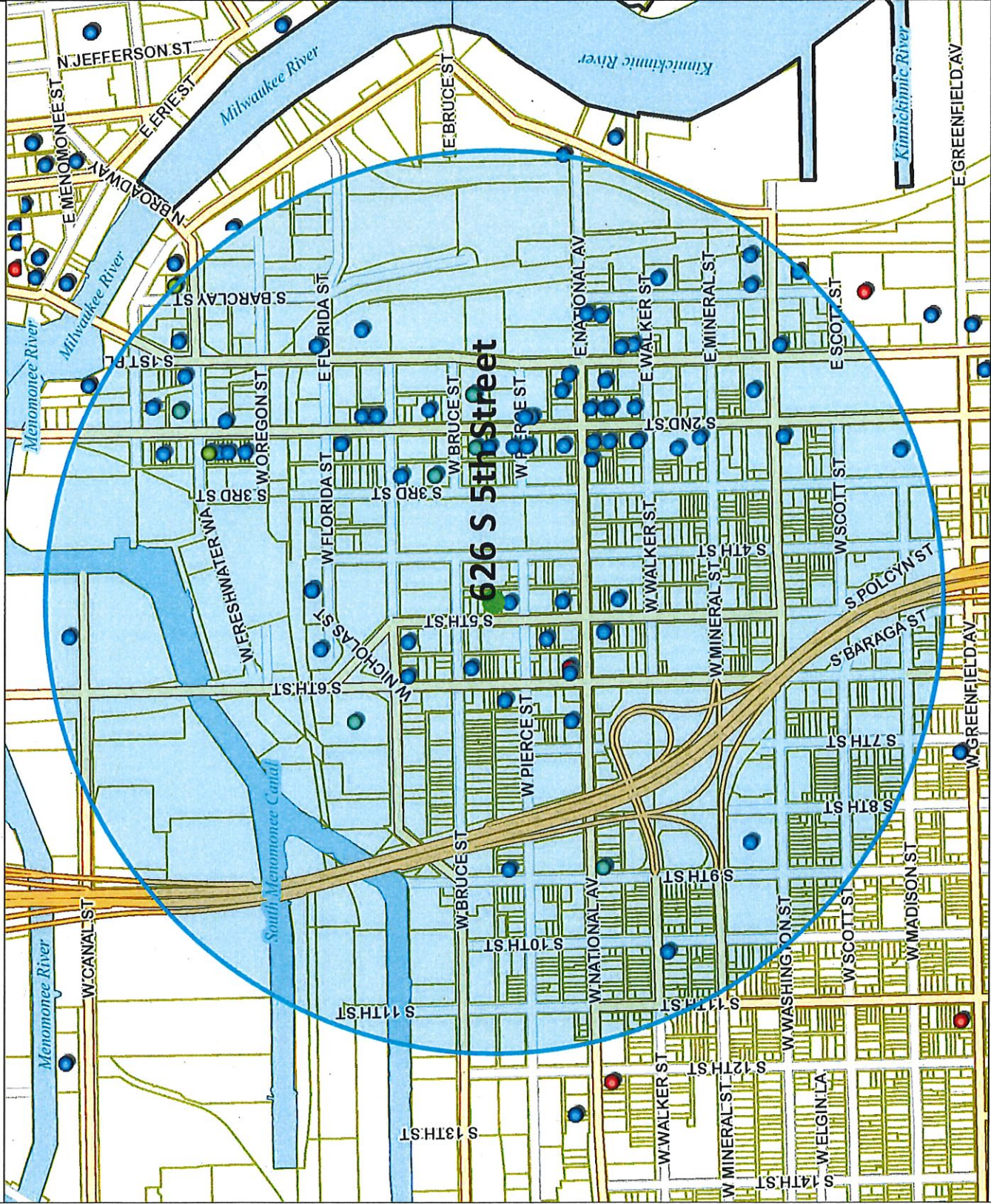

Officers spoke to the applicant who stated he was aware of the complaints and had hired additional security to monitor the parking lot. He stated the activities have since ceased. No violations were observed.

The event security is Midwest Intelligency Agency, who provides interior and exterior security. The security also assists at closing time to clear additional businesses where patrons of the event go after closing.
12. On 02/23/2018 officers conducted a licensed premises check at VIP Lounge, 828 S 1st St. The business was closed but the applicant was on scene and allowed the officers inside. The officers located 13 bottles contaminated with fruit flies and 12 bottles missing labels. WI Department of Revenue Agents seized 18 boxes of hookah tobacco, which the applicant says he supplies free to patrons. The applicant does not have a Tobacco License. The agents also seized 100 bottles of beer and 62 bottles of liquor that were not purchased from a distributor.
13. On 03/24/2018 officers responded to VIP Lounge, 828 S 1st St, to assist with a large crowd exiting the Fresh Empire event. The officer observed 100 people standing in the street and 200 on the sidewalk. When the subjects walked to surrounding businesses they walked in the roadway affecting traffic. The organizer Travis CHAMBERS stated there was a fight inside between two females. CHAMBERS had security empty the building. Several fights then occurred outside. He stated he gives away 1,500 tickets but only allows 300 inside. There were several calls for service regarding patrons from Fresh Empire. There were 2 arrests for Disorderly Conduct and 2 arrests for Resisting or Obstructing an Officer.
14. On 04/28/2018 at 7:45pm officers conducted a licensed premise check at VIP Lounge, 828 S 1st St., which was holding the Fresh Empire underage event.
