Dear Council Members:

This letter is in written to clarify the root of the complaint submitted by the complainant concerning the above listed case file.

May 13, 2013 a hearing with The Judicial & Legislation Committee was in session to attempt to resolve this matter. During the Hearing the City Attorney described the complaint as a harassment complaint, the complaint is not and never was a harassment complaint. The complaint describes and seeks justice for a serious violation of civil rights, the federal codes attached within the actual complaint is very descriptive to this fact

Also the City is under the impression that since a judge signed a warrant that it makes it a valid warrant, this is not always true. We challenge the validity of the warrant Under a Supreme Court of the United States Holding:

Where a warrant affidavit contains a statement necessary to the finding of probable cause, that is demonstrated to be both false and included by an affiant knowingly and intentionally, or with reckless disregard for the truth, the warrant is not valid see (Franks v. Delaware)

It is contended that the warrant obtained by the Milwaukee Police is not valid because it was obtained from false statements given by informants that were under duress to provide information to law enforcement in an attempt to find leniency in their own legal situations. Also the statements were false because of the obvious, there were no guns found either where the informants statement said they were or anywhere on the property. The main problem with informants of this type is that they are required to obtain information under penalty and sooner or later they just simply run out of legitimate information and are forced to make it up upon request.

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The purpose of obtaining this forum with the Committee is a formality, within the conclusion of all legal matters the question will arise from a magistrate, "did the complainant seek to resolve this matter, and if so did they agree on a settlement". That is all that is sought from this Honorable Committee.
