K. MINIATURIZED RED DOT SIGHTS (MRDS)

- 1. The Firearms Section recognizes there are significant advantages to fielding miniaturized red dot sight (MRDS) equipped pistols which can be beneficial to Milwaukee Police Department members.
- No department member shall carry a MRDS equipped firearm on or off duty until after successfully completing the Milwaukee Police Department Firearms Section's or Tactical Enforcement Unit's MRDS Transition Training course.
- 3. Members may only carry a MRDS equipped firearm in a holster approved by the range master. The range master shall establish written protocols for members to carry an MRDS equipped firearm either on or off duty to include:

- Training required to carry a MRDS equipped firearm;
- b. Approved MRDS equipped firearms and holsters;
- c. Required associated equipment for MRDS equipped firearms;
- d. Required inspection and ongoing maintenance requirements; and
- e Off-duty carry requirements.

- 6. Police members may wear privately owned body armor that meets department specifications, upon approval by both the quartermaster and the range master, or another designee of the commanding officer of the Training Division. Police members may elect to make a personal purchase upgrade of approved soft body armor. All armor must meet the existing current National Institute of Justice (NIJ) standards. The department will continue to pay the contract price of the current level IIIA armor. The member will be responsible for the remaining balance of any upgraded soft body armor selection. All soft body armor expires after five years from the date of issuance. All soft body armor remains property of the department and shall be returned to the quartermaster at expiration.
