
APPEAL PETITION

Milwaukee County by Susan L. Baldwin, statutorily appointed Director of Parks, Recreation and Culture under whose control the building in question is assigned, by the Office of the Milwaukee County Corporation Counsel, attorneys for Milwaukee County and Susan L. Baldwin, does hereby object to and appeal to the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee the August 20, 2001 decision of the Historical Preservation Commission concerning granting interim Historical Preservation status to the Former U.S. Coast Guard Station, 1600 N. Lincoln Memorial Drive, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

The grounds for this appeal are that:

- 1) The criteria for the finding were not met;
- 2) The finding creates a hardship on the community utilizing McKinley Marina and surrounding parklands. The Milwaukee County Parks Department and Milwaukee County officials have been working with the community on plans to redevelop the park. The interim designation prevents the department from completing planning for this area of the park and will delay future park development;
- 3) The finding creates a fiscal hardship on Milwaukee County. The high cost of preservation, without having a building whose location and design meets the needs of the community, is not fiscally responsible to the taxpayers;
- 4) If the findings of the Historical Preservation Commission are upheld, effectively and practically, what would remain would be a building that was no longer functional nor capable of meeting the current needs of the community.
- 5) The City lacks jurisdiction over Milwaukee County, over its parks and parklands, pursuant to §27.05, Wis. Stats., taken together with the Supreme Court decision in Green County v. Monroe, 3 Wis.2d 196 (1958) and §44.42, Wis. Stats.




