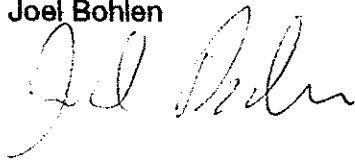
While I acknowledge the historical significance of these homes, only the example of 2522 closely resembles the original. All other cottages have undergone modifications over the past century.
