1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The goal of this project is to support the planning and establishment of a one-stop-shop facility to provide wrap around services for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, by combining a comprehensive group of services and resource under one roof, making access to the many necessary service more readily available to victims and their families. A facility of this kind would enhance the coordination of required services to the target population. Services would include:

- A central intake service
- On-site information sharing
- On-site counseling for victims
- Opportunities to obtain restraining orders
- Legal assistance and representation for victims
- Links to medical and mental health professionals in the community
- Limited medical services
- Childcare
- Assistance with emergency transportation
- Vouchers for public transportation
- Food Vouchers
- A strong volunteer component
- M.A. Outreach
- Training/Education

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The goals of the City are to provide a safe environment for victims of domestic violence (women and children). This includes holding abusers accountable for their actions. The Commission on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault promote communication, collaboration building, legislative action and support services. The Milwaukee Health Department's goals relate to outreach, health care access, prevention, education and capacity building and healthy behaviors.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Grant funds are needed in order to provide a method of integrating services to victims of domestic violence. Lack of such coordination is usually the problem that leads to victims receiving less than a full array of support services. The grant also will bring together community combined resources for the first time (administration, staff, space, etc.)
