

## Grant Award Summary

### 2026 Impaired Driving Enforcement Grant

**Grant Type:** New Grant

**Grantor:** Wisconsin Department of Transportation Bureau of Transportation Safety

**Grant Period:** December 1, 2025 - September 30, 2025

**Award Amount:** \$97,510.61 (\$78,008.49 from Grantor, \$19,502.12 local match)

**Match Required:** \$19,502.12 (in-kind )

**Fiscal Agent:** Milwaukee Police Department (MPD)

**Allocation Purpose:** The 2026 Impaired Driving Enforcement Grant will fund deployment of multi-jurisdictional sworn officers to conduct an enforcement campaign targeted at operating while under the influence of an intoxicant or controlled substance, excessive speed and aggressive driving violations.

**Partners:** The multi-jurisdictional Traffic Safety Task Force includes the Milwaukee Police Department, Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office (MCSO), and Marquette University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Police Department. The award breakdown includes \$53,008.49 for MPD, \$20,000 for MCSO, and \$5,000 for Marquette University.

**Program Goal:** The goal of the Traffic Safety Task Force is to decrease traffic crashes and obtain voluntary compliance with traffic regulations to reduce fatalities and serious injury collisions. This grant will fund a coordinated campaign with all Task Force partners targeting enforcement action based on violations observed/detected for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant or controlled substance.

**Data:** According to WI Department of Transportation data, alcohol was listed as a contributing factor in 5.6% of all crashes in Wisconsin in 2025. 27.27% of all fatal vehicle crashes in 2025 were alcohol-related, resulting in 168 deaths. Alcohol-impaired driving is associated with other high-risk behaviors that increase the likelihood of a crash and of significant injury or death occurring; these include speeding, and failure to wear seat belts.
