Starting in 2007, the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) requires the City recognize an actuarial valuation for OPEB expenses in the financial statements of enterprise funds. GASB does not require OPEB costs be reported in governmental funds. The Budget for OPEB provides the legal authority for the Comptroller to record OPEB expenses on the City's financial records of the enterprise funds. Any decision to start funding the actuarial valuation of OPEB is a policy decision of the Common Council and Mayor.
DPW-Sewer Maintenance Fund Water Quality Projects I & I Reduction Project	\$400,000.00	\$400,000.00	A Stipulation agreement was reached in 2005 between the State DOJ and MMSD and its tributary communities (including Milwaukee) that prescribed actions to reduce Sanitary Sewer Overflows. The \$3 million I&I reduction program funds phase I of the effort to comply, but additional funds are needed. In particular, bids to conduct Storm Sewer Flooding and Sanitary Sewer Televising were higher than anticipated. Funds available in the Water Quality Projects program were intended to cover city costs for a bioretention facility in the Menomonee Valley. The scope of that project was reduced to complete the work within budget and the remaining funds are now available for reprogramming.
