Property Description of work

1060 E Juneau First Ward Triangle HD

There are nine stained glass transom windows at the 2nd floor Front, East, and West Sides of the building. These windows are visible from the street but not visible at the interior. It is believed units were plastered over during a remodel of the interior in the 1910's. Because the glass has been subject to temperature differentials the leaded caming has become unstable and presenting a danger of the stained glass falling out.

We propose to expose the windows from the interior, have Conrad Schmitt Restoration remove the existing sashes and repair the stained glass. They will also build and install new storm windows to protect the repaired glass from the exterior. Storm windows to be milled from Douglas Fir and match previously completed units (see photos)

The interior will be cased using the same profiles as existing. The exterior storms and sashes will be primed and painted in the same color as existing.
