Estimated first-year savings of a 15-member Common

Council; estimated savings 2004-2012

Date:

March 18, 2003

The following estimates have been prepared in response regarding the fiscal impact of decreasing membership of the Common Council from 17 to 15. These estimates are prepared both for first-year savings commencing in 2004, and estimating total savings over an 8-year period, 2004-2012.

### **Estimated First-Year Savings**

A. Personnel Costs

#### **Assumptions**

- 1. Common Council members' salaries for the 2000-2004 term are based on the fifth step of pay grade 10 for the year 2000, and will increase by one step (3.1%) annually until the end of the term. Then, at the beginning of the 2004-2008 term, Council members' salaries will be reset on the fifth step of pay grade 10 for the year 2004. Pay for year 2004 is based on pay increases granted to management employes; see note #3.
- 2. Legislative assistant salaries are based on the first step of pay grade 2 as estimated for 2004; see note #3.
- 3. 2003 and 2004 "across the board" increases for management employes are estimated at 2.75% each year.
- 4. Fringe benefit costs are 33% of salary.
- 5. Private transportation and private telephone allowances, which are provided to Council members per the Milwaukee Code, are estimated to increase 2.5% annually between 2000 and 2004.
- 6. Service and supply costs are based on costs developed initially for a 1991 memo and subsequently updated in 1998, 2000 and 2001.

## Estimated Savings, 8-year Period 2004-2012

#### **Assumptions**

- 1. The Common Council will not consider changing the number of council member districts until after the next decennial census; census data will be released in 2011.
- 2. Savings (cost avoided) after the first year will conservatively increase by 2.75% annually (based on salary step increases of 3.1% annually and lesser increases for nonsalary expenses), yielding savings of almost \$3,130,000; note, the 8-year period calculated is the third Tuesday in April 2004 to the third Tuesday in April 2012.
