1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This new project, if funded, will assess the level of environmental allergens in the homes of children with severe asthma. Furthermore, low level environmental interventions will be implemented and evaluated for effectiveness. Approximately 100 children in high risk zip codes will receive this environmental intervention. Additionally, the homes of more than 1,000 children will be evaluated for environmental triggers in collaboration with Milwaukee Allies Against Asthma grant funding.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

Controlling pediatric asthma is a major priority for school age health and home environmental health programs.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Almost 3,000 Milwaukee County children are hospitalized or treated by emergency rooms due to severe asthma annually. The most heavily impacted areas are located in the City of Milwaukee. This grant funding will focus on environmental assessment and interventions in collaboration with comprehensive case management services funded by Milwaukee Allies Against Asthma.
