As requested at the 1/31/23 Zoning and Neighborhood Development Committee meeting, attached is a spreadsheet containing all orders issued by DNS with electrical violations for 2018-2022. Additionally, below is a chart outlining the total number of orders either referred to court or in the process of being referred to court.

Please note, Adjudication means the inspector is in the process of referring an order to court for further enforcement.

For additional context, I have calculated the percentage for each category as well as the percent change of number of violations issued from year to year.

Litigated Dismissed (percentage of total violations)	0.11%	0.09%	0.00%

Currently, once an order is referred to Court, the case is scheduled by the court 6-8 weeks later. Cases can take an additional 90 days after the initial hearing if the owner requests additional time, putting it at approximately 5-6 months for an order to go through the court process.
