TYRONE DANIELS

passed from this life on May 8, 2026, at the age of 72, and services were held for family and friends on May 19 and 20, 2026, at Grace Fellowship Church, 3879 N. Port Washington Rd.; and

***WHEREAS,** Tyrone Daniels was a respected community leader, civil rights advocate, protector of culture, and devoted servant to the people of Milwaukee whose life reflected courage, faith, dignity, and unwavering love for his community; and*

***WHEREAS,** Tyrone Daniels was a man of many accomplishments, including answering the call for justice during the Civil Rights Movement as a member of the NAACP Commandos, helping provide protection and security for marchers, families, churches, and neighborhoods during one of the most difficult and defining periods in Milwaukee's history, including the 1967 unrest and the fight for fair housing and equal rights; and*

***WHEREAS,** Tyrone Daniels devoted over fifty years of his life serving Milwaukee's Juneteenth Day Celebration, was a dedicated advocate for Milwaukee's senior citizens, and was an energetic volunteer and committed advocate with Career Youth Development, among many other causes he fought for and supported; and*

***WHEREAS,** Tyrone Daniels faithfully served the people of the State of Wisconsin for more than ten years as an assistant to Gary George, where he brought dedication, leadership, community knowledge, and compassion to public service and advocacy efforts throughout Milwaukee and Wisconsin; and*

***WHEREAS,** Tyrone Daniels remained a steadfast mentor, father, grandfather, community protector, and man of deep Christian faith who inspired others through both word and example, leaving behind a lasting legacy carried forward by his beloved family and friends; now, therefore, be it*

***RESOLVED,** That the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee herewith offers its sincerest condolences to the family and friends of Tyrone Daniels and mourns the passing of this loving and strong man; and, be it*
