Carferry Drive in the City of Milwaukee (hereinafter referred to as "Property") which is depicted in the diagram attached hereto as Exhibit A and which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS the Lease Agreement terminates on December 31, 2010; and

WHEREAS the City and the Tenant have agreed to further extend the term of the Lease Agreement and to amend certain parts of its terms and conditions, as specified in this Amendment to and Extension of Lease Agreement; and

WHEREAS the Tenant has at no time elected to terminate the Lease Agreement and that, consequently, the Lease Agreement has continued to be, and remains, in full force and effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, the City and the Tenant agree to amend the Lease Agreement dated August 30, 2007 as follows:

1. <u>Term</u>.

A) The term of this Lease will commence at 12:01 A.M. on January 1, 2011 and will terminate at 11:59 P.M. on December 31, 2011 (the "Initial Term").

The term of this Lease shall be extended for three (3) additional one (1) year periods (the "First, Second and Third Extension Terms") each successively under the same terms and conditions unless either party shall deliver to the other party a written notice of termination within one hundred eighty (180) days prior to expiration of the then current term.

B) This Lease may be terminated prior to the date of its stated expiration date by the mutual written consent of the Port Director and the Tenant.

2. Base Rent.

- A) As and for rental of the Property during the Initial Term of this Lease, Tenant shall pay to City an annual "Base Rental" equal to \$5.75 per unit of container on flat car (COFC) and \$2.75 per unit of trailer on flat car (TOFC) received or delivered by rail, on the basis of a minimum of 7,500 COFC units per year.
- B) On January 1, 2013 the base rental shall be adjusted to the amount determined by applying to it the percentage increase if any, in the "All Commodities" line (Code 2500) of the "Producer Price Indexes" published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (or its successor organization ((1982=100) for the prior two-year period; provided, however, that in no event shall the new base rental, as adjusted by the foregoing method, be decreased to an amount below that for the rental during the Initial Term.
- 3. **No Slavery Affidavit**. The Tenant shall execute the Affidavit of Compliance attached hereto as Exhibit _____ contemporaneously with its execution of this Lease.
- 4. Open Records Law. Both parties understand that the City is bound by the Wisconsin Public Records Law, and as such, all of the terms of this Lease Agreement are subject to and conditioned on the provisions of Wis. Stat. §19.21, et. seq. Tenant acknowledges that it is obligated to assist the City in retaining and producing records that are subject to The Wisconsin Public Records Law, and that the failure to do so shall constitute a material breach of this Lease Agreement, and that the Tenant must defend and hold the city harmless from liability under the law. Except as otherwise authorized by law, those records shall be maintained for a minimum period of seven years.
- 5. <u>Incorporation by Reference.</u> All other terms and conditions of the original Lease Agreement and Lease Extensions between the City and the Tenant are incorporated herein and are to continue in full force and effect insofar as they are not inconsistent with the terms and conditions of this Extension and Amendment. In any case of inconsistency, the terms and conditions of this Extension and Amendment will govern.

MILWAUKEE, a Wisconsin corporation, by and through its Board of Harbor
Commissioners (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "City").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City and the Tenant have entered into a Lease Agreement dated October 24, 2005 for the period from March 1, 2005 through December 31, 2007 (hereinafter referred to as the "Lease Agreement") as amended for the lease of 7.615 acres of real property located on the Grand Trunk Property of the City of Milwaukee, but at all times excluding any property identified as wetlands (hereinafter referred to as the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the city and the Tenant desire to further extend and amend their Lease Agreement in the manner hereinafter set forth; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, the City and the Tenant agree to further extend and amend the Lease Agreement dated October 24, 2005 as amended as follows:

1. <u>Term</u>. The Initial Term of this Lease Agreement shall be for a period of twenty-five (25) years (the "Initial Term") commencing on January 1, 2011 and terminating at 11:50 p.m. on December 31, 2036.

Tenant shall have the right to extend the term of this Lease Agreement for two (2) successive periods of (15) years each (the "First Extension Period" and the "Second Extension Period" respectively). In order to exercise each option to extend this Lease Agreement, Tenant shall provide City with written notice of its intent to do so no less than twelve (12) months prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or any extended term as applicable.

Tenant shall have the right to terminate this Agreement in the event: (1) that the Tenant reasonably believes that the Purpose of the Agreement, as set forth herein, cannot be fulfilled, or (2) Tenant is sold in an arms-length transaction or ceases operations.

Tenant will give City a six-month prior written notice of its intent to terminate this Agreement. Also, Tenant will contact and consult with the Municipal Port Director sixty days before sending such notice to allow City the opportunity to rectify, if possible, the situation necessitating termination.

2. Purpose of Agreement. To provide Tenant sufficient land space to consolidate its various operations at one location, including the construction of a new company headquarters building of approximately 10,000 square feet upon financial terms satisfactory to the Tenant. Tenant will also operate a dockside reception and load out facility for stone rip rap and other common construction aggregate materials, and general marine construction work. Property will be used for the storage, erecting and maintenance of materials and equipment related to the Tenants marine contracting business. No hazardous materials are to be handled on the Property. Other operations may be performed provided the express written consent for said operations is obtained from the Municipal Port Director.

City agrees to cooperate with Tenant in attempting to secure Harbor Grant Funds or other federal, state, or other funds, including entering into TIF or other taxing or other agreements to finance the required improvements to the leased Property.

3. Conditions of Use of Property.

A) Due to weight limitations necessitated by the dockwall construction, Tenant will maintain a 50-foot setback from the dockwall when handling or storing stone products or other materials and cargo. Tenant will cooperate with City during any repairs to the dockwall, and will be responsible for all dockwall damages caused by its operations and incurred after the date of this Agreement, excluding improvements required by the City which increase or maintain the value of the land. Tenant also agrees not to load more than 600 pounds per square foot without permission of the Port's Harbor Engineer.

- B) Tenant's Barge Fleet Berth. With reference to the barge docking agreement between City and Tenant dated July 26, 2005, this Agreement also allows the Tenant to pay an amount yearly for the right to utilize dockwalls adjacent to this Property and Tenant's Property at 1801 South Carferry Drive for mooring of it Barge and Tug Fleet. Tenant shall repair any damages to a dockwall caused by its fleet. If the Tenant elects to reserve this right for any given year, Tenant shall only pay the amount set forth in Section 4(A).
- C) Tenant shall have preferential, but not exclusive use of the berthing space on dockwall adjacent to the Property.

4. **Rent**.

- A) The rental rate under this Agreement shall be Ten Thousand and no/100th Dollars (\$10,000) per acre per year or Seventy Six Thousand One Hundred Fifty and no/100th Dollars (\$76,150) for total leasehold. Rent shall be payable quarterly, in advance on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. Each rent payment shall be for the immediately succeeding quarter.
- B) On January 1, 2012 and on each anniversary date thereafter during the terms of this Agreement, the annual rent for the Property shall be adjusted to the amount determined by applying the percentage increase, if any, of the "Consumer Price Index" published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (or its successor organization) (1982=100) for the one-year period prior to the beginning of the new rental period, to the rental figure payable during the previous year of this Lease; provided, however, that in no event shall the new base rental, as adjusted by the foregoing method, be decreased to an amount below that for the rental during the previous period.
- C) <u>Throughput on Stone Products</u>. Tenant further agrees to pay City a throughput charge of forty cents (\$.40) per metric ton (2,204 pounds) of material, as described in Paragraph 2 above that is received upon the Property. Tenant agrees to throughput a minimum tonnage of 7,500 metric tons per year during the term of this Agreement. Throughput shall be escalated annually according to Section 3(B).
- D) Wharfage on Other Cargo. Tenant agrees to pay City the wharfage fee based upon the appropriate provision of the Municipal Port Tariff (Item 215) in effect at the time of cargo movement.

- E). <u>Tenant Fleet Dockage</u>. Dockage charge on Tenant owned barges and tugs shall be billed at \$1,800 per month, payable quarterly as specified in Section 4(A). This charge shall be escalated annually according to Section 3(B).
- 5. <u>Possible Future Relocation.</u> It is anticipated that the City may determine during the term of this Agreement that it would be advantageous to lease the Property to a different tenant or sell the Property, which would require relocation of the current Tenant.

In this event, the City and Tenant must give a minimum of three (3) years advance written notice of its intent to relocate Tenant to other City waterfront real estate on a navigable waterway, in contemplation of a re-leasing or sale of the Property.

AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT

This Amendment to and Extension of Lease Agreement made and entered into at
Milwaukee, Wisconsin as of this day of20, by and between
EDWARD E. GILLEN COMPANY, a Wisconsin corporation, (hereinafter referred to as
"Tenant"), and the CITY OF MILWAUKEE, a Wisconsin corporation, by and through its
Board of Harbor Commissioners (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "City").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the City and the Tenant have entered into a Lease Agreement dated December 20, 1999 which, with various amendments and extensions, remained in effect until December 31, 2006; and (hereinafter referred to as the "Lease Agreement") for the lease of .921 acres of real property located at 1801 South Carferry Drive in the City of Milwaukee (and hereinafter referred to as the "Property"); the Property was expanded to 1.15 acres on January 1, 2007 and is depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS the Lease Agreement was amended and extended on January 1, 2007 for a term expiring on December 31, 2010; and

WHEREAS the City and Tenant have agreed to further extend the term of the Lease Agreement and to amend certain parts of its terms an conditions, as specified in this Amendment to and Extension of Lease Agreement; and

WHEREAS the Tenant has at no time elected to terminate the Lease Agreement and that, consequently, the Lease Agreement has continued to be, and remains, in full force and affect;

NOW, THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, the City and Tenant agree to amend the Lease Agreement dated as follows:

1. **Term**.

A) The term of this Lease Agreement shall be extended for twenty-five (25) years commencing at 12:00 a.m. on January 1, 2011 and terminating at 11:59 p.m. on December 31, 2036 (the "Extended Term"). This Lease may be extended for two (2) additional fifteen (15)-year extension terms (the "Second Extended Term" and the "Third Extended Term" respectively) at Tenant's option in writing one hundred eighty (180) days prior to expiration of the then current term.

B) This Lease may be terminated prior to the date of its stated expiration date by 90 day written notice of tenant, Landlord or by the mutual written consent of the Port Director and the Tenant.

2. Rent.

- A) Tenant shall pay to City during the first year of the extended term, the sum of Twenty Three Thousand and 00/100ths Dollars (\$23,000) per acre per year or \$26,450 for the entire Property payable quarterly in arrears.
- B) On January 1, 2012 and on each anniversary date thereafter during the terms of this Lease, the annual rent for the Property, shall be adjusted to the amount determined by applying the percentage increase, if any, of the "Consumer Price Index" published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (or its successor organization) (1982=100) for the one-year period prior to the beginning of the new rental period to the rental figure payable during the previous year of this Lease; provided, however, that in no event shall the new base rental, as adjusted by the foregoing method, be decreased to an amount below that for the rental during the previous period.
- 3. <u>Insurance</u>. Tenant shall maintain in full force and effect throughout the currency of this Lease, the following insurance covering any and all liability or obligations which may result from operations by Tenant, Tenant's employees, agents, contractors or subcontractors as aforesaid in this Lease:
- A) Property insurance coverage protecting against physical damage (including but not limited to fire, lightning, extended coverage perils, vandalism, sprinkler leakage, water damage, collapse and other special extended perils) to the extent of the replacement cost of Tenant's personal property and improvements as well as goods or property in Tenant's care, custody and/or control.
- B) Comprehensive General Liability Insurance (including but not limited to Products and Completed Operations and Contractual Liability, as applicable to Tenant's obligations under this Lease) with limits not less than:

Each Occurrence Limit: \$2,000,000 Products/Completed Operations Aggregate: \$2,000,000 General Policy Aggregate: \$2,000,000 C) Automotive Liability Insurance with Limits not less than:

Bodily Injury and Property Damage

Combined Single Limit:

\$1,000,000 per occurrence

D) Worker's Compensation Insurance in accordance with Chapter 102, Wisconsin Statutes and any applicable Federal law.

E) Umbrella Coverage:

\$10,000,000 in aggregate

4. Environmental Compliance and Obligations.

- (A) <u>Compliance with Environmental Regulations</u>. Tenant shall fully comply with all statutes, regulations, or other applicable requirements imposed by any federal, state, or municipal agency with respect to the environmental condition of the Property and/or with respect to any activities or operations that Tenant may conduct upon the Property (hereinafter referred to as "Environmental Requirements"). Tenant shall not cause, permit or suffer the existence or commission by Tenant, its agents, employees, contractors or invitees, or by any other person of any violation of any Environmental Requirements upon, about or beneath the Property or any portion thereof.
- (B) Environmental Laws. The term "Environmental Laws" shall mean and include (a) the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, 42 U.S.C. § 6901-6987, as amended by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984; (b) the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986, 42 U.S.C. § 9601-9657; (c) the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act of 1975, 49 U.S.C. § 1801-1812; (d) the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 U.S.C. § 2601, et. seq.; (e) the Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7401, et. seq.; (f) the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, 7 U.S.C. § 136, et. seq.; (g) Chapters 280-299 of Wisconsin Code; and all similar federal, state, or local environmental laws, ordinances, rules, codes and regulations, and as any of the foregoing may have been amended, supplemented, or supplanted and any other federal, state or local laws, ordinances, rules, codes and regulations now existing relating to the environment or the regulation or control or imposing liability or standards of conduct concerning toxic or hazardous waste, substances or materials.
- (C) <u>Hazardous Material</u>; <u>Environmental Liens</u>. Except to the extent commonly used in the day-to-day operation of the Property, and in strict compliance with all Environmental Requirements (including those relating to storage, use and disposal), Tenant shall not cause, permit or suffer any "hazardous material" or "hazardous substance" (as defined by applicable

Federal or State statutes or regulations) to be brought upon, treated, kept, stored, disposed of, discharged, released, produced, manufactured, generated, refined, or used upon, about, or beneath the Property or any portion thereof by Tenant, its agents, employees, contractors, tenants or invitees, or any other person without the prior written consent of the City. Any request by Tenant for such consent by the City shall be in writing and shall demonstrate to the reasonable satisfaction of the City that such "hazardous material" or "hazardous substances" is necessary to the conduct of the business of Tenant and will be stored, used, and disposed of in a manner that complies with all applicable Environmental Requirements. Tenant shall not create or suffer to exist with respect to the Property any lien, security interest, or other charge or encumbrance of any kind relating to the environmental condition of the Property, including (without limitation) any lien imposed pursuant to Sec. 107(f) of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act 1986 (42 U.S.C. § 9607(L)) or any similar State Statute.

- (D) Obligation to Investigate and/or Remediate. Tenant shall, upon demand of the City, and at its sole cost and expense, promptly take all actions to investigate and/or remediate the environmental condition of the Property which may be required by any federal, state or local governmental agency or political subdivision, which remediation is necessitated from, or attributable to, the presence upon, about, or beneath the Property of any "hazardous material" or "hazardous substances" or any violation of Environmental Requirements caused by the Presence of and/or activities or operations conducted by the Tenant upon the Property. Any such investigation and/or remediation shall be performed by and under the direction of a qualified environmental consulting or engineering firm approved by City in advance of the commencement of the work. Tenant agrees to allow entry upon the Property by the City, or agents, contractors or employees of the City for purposes of conducting environmental audits and/or other tests for the purpose of determining the impact of Tenant's presence and/or activities or operations upon or with respect to the Property upon the environmental condition thereof. In the event that Tenant performs any such environmental audit and/or test on its own behalf, it shall promptly provide to the City full and complete copies of any results and/or reports that are generated in connection with the above activities.
- (E) <u>Survival of Obligations</u>. Tenant's obligations with respect to the environmental condition of the Property (as more fully set forth in Subsections (A) through (D) above) shall survive the expiration or termination of this Lease.
- F) Nothing in this agreement shall be deemed to be or constitute a waiver by the City of any defense available to it as a governmental entity pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 9601 (35) (A) (ii) and § 9607 (b) (3) or Wis. Stat. § 292.11(9)(e), 292.23(2), 292.24(2) and 292.26.

- 5. Open Records Law. Both parties understand that the City is bound by the Wisconsin Public Records Law, and as such, all of the terms of this Lease Agreement are subject to and conditioned on the provisions of Wis. Stat. §19.21, et. seq. Tenant acknowledges that it is obligated to assist the City in retaining and producing records that are subject to the Wisconsin Public Records Law, and that the failure to do so shall constitute a material breach of this Lease Agreement, and that the Tenant must defend and hold the city harmless from liability under the law. Except as otherwise authorized, those records shall be maintained for a minimum period of seven years after receipt of finally payment under this Agreement
- 6. <u>Incorporation by Reference.</u> All other terms and conditions of the original Lease Agreement and Lease Extensions between the City and the Tenant are incorporated herein and are to continue in full force and effect insofar as they are not inconsistent with the terms and conditions of this Extension and Amendment. In any case of inconsistency, the terms and conditions of this Extension and Amendment will govern.
- 7. **No Slavery Affidavit**. The Tenant shall execute the Affidavit of Compliance attached hereto as Exhibit _____ contemporaneously with its execution of this Lease.
- 1. The other terms and conditions of the Lease Agreement as have been in effect during the Initial term and subsequent extensions shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect throughout the Extended Term.
- 5. <u>Approval</u>. IT IS FURTHER AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD that this Lease Amendment must be submitted to the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee and that the same must be approved by the Common Council and its execution authorized.




Further Resolved, That whenever permission for the cameras and appurtenant facilities is discontinued for any reason whatsoever, including public necessity whenever so ordered by resolution adopted by the Common Council, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation shall not only remove all construction work executed pursuant to this permissory resolution, but shall also restore to its former condition and to the approval of the Commissioner of Public Works the curb, pavement or other public improvement which was removed, changed or disturbed by reason of the granting permission for said cameras and appurtenant facilities. Such grantee shall be entitled to no damages due to the alteration and/or removal for such purposes.



KILBOURN TUNNEL ROUTE SCHEMATIC



Delivery will not necessarily be in a "just in time" manner. Store the equipment until field installation. Provide location details and a contact for delivery coordination upon contract Notice to Proceed.

Intelligent Transportation System -

General.

2.

A Description

The work herein is included in the contract items for furnishing and installing elements for an Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) in or along the existing roadway as shown on the plans.

Unusual aspects of this project include:

 The project includes working on cables and equipment that are carrying data between roadside equipment and the WisDOT Traffic Operations Center (TOC). This work must be done in a way that minimizes communication outages for the existing equipment. • Some of the equipment to be installed will be furnished by the department. Make a reasonable effort to discover defects in that equipment prior to installing it.

A.1 Surge Protection

Equip every ungrounded conductor wire entering or leaving any equipment cabinet or camera housing with a surge protector. For purposes of this section, multiple cabinets on a single pole or foundation are considered a single cabinet.

B Materials

B.1 General

All equipment and component parts furnished shall be new and have high quality workmanship. All controls, indicators, and connectors shall be clearly and permanently labeled in a manner approved by the engineer. All equipment of each type shall be identical.

All electrical equipment shall conform to the standards and requirements of the Wisconsin Electrical Code, the National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA), National Electric Safety Council (NESC), Underwriter's Laboratory Inc. (UL) or the Electronic Industries Association (EIA), when applicable. All materials and workmanship shall conform to the requirements of the National Electrical Code (NEC), Rural Electrification Administration (REA), Standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM), American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO), requirements of the plans, these Technical Special Provisions, the standard specifications, and to any other codes, standards, or ordinances that may apply. All system wiring, conduit, grounding hardware and circuit breakers shall be in conformance with the National Electrical Code. Whenever reference is made to any of the standards mentioned, the reference shall be considered to mean the code, ordinance, or standard that is in effect at the time of the bid advertisement.

B.2 Outdoor Equipment

All conductive connectors, pins (except pins connected by soldering), and socket contacts shall be gold plated. Acrylic conformal coating shall protect each circuit board side that has conductive traces. Except for integrated circuits containing custom firmware, all components shall be soldered to the printed circuit board.

To prevent galvanic corrosion, all connections between dissimilar metals shall incorporate a means of keeping moisture out of the connection. Where the connection need not conduct electricity, interpose a non-absorbing, inert material or washer between the dissimilar metals. Use nonconductive liners and washers to insulate fasteners from dissimilar metals. Where the connection must conduct electricity, use a conductive sealant between the dissimilar metals. Alternatively, use an insulating gasket and a bond wire connecting the two metal parts.

B.3 Custom Equipment

Equipment that is not part of the manufacturer's standard product line, or that is made or modified specifically for this project, shall conform to the following requirements:

Where practical, electronics shall be modular plug-in assemblies to facilitate maintenance. Such assemblies shall be keyed to prevent incorrect insertion of modules into sockets.

All components shall be available from multiple manufacturers as part of the manufacturers' standard product lines. All must be clearly labeled with the value, part number, tolerance, or other information sufficient to enable a technician to order an exact replacement part.

Lamps used for indicator purposes shall be light-emitting diodes.

The printed circuit boards shall be composed of "two-ounce" copper on 1/16" thick fiberglass epoxy or equivalent type construction. Holes that carry electrical connections from one side of the boards to the other shall be completely plated through. Multilayer printed circuit boards shall not be used. The name or reference number used for the board in the drawings and maintenance manuals supplied to the department shall be permanently affixed to each board.

All components shall be mounted so that the identifying markings are visible without moving or removing any part, if practical.

B.4 Environmental Conditions

Equipment shall continue to operate as specified under the following ranges of environmental conditions, except as noted in the specifications for individual pieces of equipment.

- **Vibration and Shock**: Camera assemblies, vehicle detectors, detection classification sensors, and any other equipment mounted atop poles or on structures shall not be impaired by the continuous vibration caused by winds (up to 90 mph with a 30 percent gust factor) and traffic.
- Duty Cycle: Continuous.
- **Electromagnetic Radiation**: The equipment shall not be impaired by ambient electrical or magnetic fields, such as those caused by power lines, transformers, and motors. The equipment shall not radiate signals that adversely affect other equipment.

Electrical Power:

- 1. Operating power: The equipment shall operate on 120 volts, 60 Hz, single-phase unless otherwise specified. It shall conform to its specified performance requirements when the input voltage varies from 89 to 135 volts and the frequency varies + 3 Hz.
- 2. High frequency interference: The equipment operation shall be unaffected by power supply voltage spikes of up to 150 volts in amplitude and ten microseconds duration.
- 3. Line voltage transients: The equipment operation shall be unaffected by voltage transients of plus or minus 20 percent of nominal line voltage for a maximum duration of 50 milliseconds. Equipment in the field shall meet the power service

transient requirements of NEMA Standard TS-2 when connected to the surge protectors in the cabinets.

• Temperature and Humidity:

- **1. Field equipment**: Equipment in the field shall meet the temperature and humidity requirements of NEMA Standard TS-2. Liquid crystal displays shall be undamaged by temperatures as high as 165 degrees F, and shall produce a usable display at temperatures up to 120 degrees F.
- **2. Equipment in Controlled Environments** shall operate normally at any combination of temperatures between 50 degrees F and 100 degrees F, and humidity's between 5 percent and 90 percent, non-condensing, and with a temperature gradient of 9 degrees F per hour.

B.5 Patch Cables and Wiring

All cables and wiring between devices installed in a single cabinet, or in separate cabinets sharing a single concrete base, will be considered incidental to the installation of the devices and no separate payment will be made for them. It is anticipated that this will include fiber optic patch cables between termination panels and Ethernet switches, 10 / 100 MBPS Ethernet cables, RS-232 cables between individual devices and terminal servers, and power cables between individual devices and power sources within the cabinets.

B.6 Surge Protection

Low-voltage signal pairs shall be protected by two-stage, plug-in surge protectors and shall be installed on both ends of camera control cables. The protectors shall meet or exceed the following minimum requirements:

- The protectors shall suppress a peak surge current of up to 10K amps.
- The protectors shall have a response time less than one nanosecond.
- The protector shall clamp the voltage between the two wires at a voltage that is no more than twice the peak signal voltage, and clamp the voltage between each wire and ground at 50 volts.
- The first stage of protection shall be a three-element gas discharge tube, and the second stage shall consist of silicon clamping devices.
- The protector shall also contain a resettable fuse (PTC) to protect against excessive current.
- There shall be no more than two pairs per protector.
- It shall be possible to replace the protector without using tools.

Loop detector cables and cables carrying power to camera assemblies shall be protected at the cabinet by grounded metal oxide varistors of appropriate voltages. The varistors must be at least 0.8 inch in diameter.

Coaxial cables carrying video signals shall be protected at each end by suppressors designed for baseband CCTV signals. The suppressors shall conform to the following:

- Surge: 18,000 amps with an 8 x 20 microsecond waveform
- Turn-on time: 4ns for 2 kV/ns
- VSWR: 1.1:1 or less

Insertion loss: 0.3 dB or lessFrequency range: DC to 30 MHz

BNC connectors

• Operating voltage: 1.5 volts

• Impedance: 75 ohms

C Construction

C.1 Communication Vaults

All openings in communication vaults must be cored or blocked out at time of fabrication, or cored at time of placement. Where multi-cell or standard nonmetallic conduit is terminated at manholes, the coring or boxout shall be no larger than 6 inches in diameter or 6 inches square respectively for each conduit. Where multi-cell, directional bore or nonmetallic conduit special is terminated at manholes, a boxout of no more than 14 inches by 6 inches high by 3 inches deep positioned at 90 degrees will be allowed.

C.2 Thread Protection

Rust, corrosion, and anti-seize protection shall be provided at all thread assemblies of metallic parts by coating (non-spray) the mating surfaces with an approved compound. Failure to use an approved compound will result in no payment for the items to which coating was to have been applied.

C.3 Cable Installation

When new cables are to be installed into conduits containing existing cables, remove the existing cables and reinstall the existing cables simultaneously with the new cables. Take every precaution necessary to protect the existing cables. In the event of avoidable damage to the existing cables, replace all damaged cables, in-kind, at no additional expense to the department. When cables are pulled into conduit, use a cable pulling lubricant approved by the cable manufacturer. Submit documentation supporting manufacturer approval of the lubricant to the engineer.

When cables are installed in conduit before the proper installation of bushings or bell ends on the conduit or without the use of cable lubricant, the cables will be paid at 50 percent of the contract unit price if testing shows no damage to the cables. Replace all cables which testing shows to be damaged at no cost to the department.

C.4 Wiring

Every conductor, except a conductor contained entirely within a single piece of equipment, must terminate either in a connector or on a terminal block. Provide and install the connectors and terminal blocks where needed, without separate payment. Approved splice kits shall be used instead of connectors and terminal blocks for underground power cable splices.

Permanently label and key connectors to preclude improper connection. The labeling method(s) must be approved by the engineer prior to use.

Terminal blocks must be affixed to panels that permanently identify the block and what wire connects to each terminal. This may be accomplished by silk screening or by installing a laminated printed card under the terminal block, with the labels on portions of the card that extend beyond the block. Installation of terminal blocks by drilling holes in the exterior wall of the cabinet is not acceptable.

Use barriers to protect personnel from accidental contact with all dangerous voltages.

Do not install conductors carrying AC power in the same wiring harness as conductors carrying control or communication signals.

Arrange wiring, including fiber optic pigtails, so that any removable assembly can be removed without disturbing wiring that is not associated with the assembly being removed.

Communication and control cables may not be spliced underground, except where indicated on the plans.

Cables in the Traffic Operations Center or in communication hubs, that are not contained within a single cabinet, shall have at least 10 feet of slack.

C.5 System Operations

If the contractor's operations interrupt Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) service, notify the engineer immediately and restore service within 24 hours. Repair all damaged facilities to the condition existing before the interruption. If service is not restored within 24 hours, the department may restore service to any operating device and deduct restoration costs from payments due the contractor.

C.6 Surge Protection

Arrange the equipment and cabinet wiring to minimize the distance between each conductor's point of entry and its protector. Locate the protector as far as possible from electronic equipment. All wiring between the surge protectors and the point of entry shall be free from sharp bends.

D Measurement

No separate measurement will be made for the work described in this article.

E Payment

No separate payment will be made for the work described in this article. All work described in this article shall be included under the ITS items in the contract.

3. Intelligent Transportation Systems -

Conduit.

Add the following to subsection 671.2: 671.2.5 Locate Wire

Furnish and install a No. 14 AWG stranded copper wire for future locate purposes through each conduit run. Connect the locate wire by the use of a wire nut at each pull box, manhole, or other access point. Alternatively, use a single wire through the access points. A Description

4.

This special provision describes installing proposed conduit into an existing manhole, pull box, junction box, or other structure.

B Materials

Conduit, as provided and paid for under other items in this contract. Backfill material, topsoil, fertilizer, seed, and mulch conforming to the requirements of pertinent provisions of the standard specifications.

C Construction

Carefully expose the outside of the existing structure without disturbing any existing conduits or cabling.

Drill the appropriate sized hole for the entering conduit at a location within the structure that will not disturb the existing cabling and will not hinder the installation of new cabling within the installed conduit.

Fill any void area between the drilled hole and conduit with an engineer-approved filling material to protect against conduit movement and entry of fill material into the structure.

Carefully tamp backfill into place.

D Measurement

The department will measure Installing Conduit Into Existing Item by the unit, acceptably installed. Up to five conduits entering a structure per entry point into the existing structure will be considered a single unit. Conduits in excess of five, or conduits entering at significantly different entry points into the existing pull box, manhole, or junction box will constitute multiple units.

E Payment

Payment is full compensation for drilling holes; furnishing and installing all materials, including bricks, and coarse aggregate; for excavation, bedding and backfilling, including

any sand or other required materials; furnishing and placing topsoil, fertilizer, seed, and mulch in disturbed areas; for disposal of surplus materials; for making inspections; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work

5. Ground Rod, Item SPV.0060.206.

A Description

This special provision describes installing a ground rod and ground wire.

B Materials

Ground rod shall be copper clad steel with cladding 13 mils thick. The minimum diameter is 5/8-inch and the minimum length is eight feet. Ground wire shall be AWG # 6 bare, solid copper.

C Construction

Use exothermic welding to connect the ground wire to the rod. Install the rod vertically, or as close to vertical as conditions permit. Select locations with moist soil, if available. Place the rod at least six feet from all other ground rods.

D Measurement

The department will measure Ground Rod by the unit, acceptably installed.

E Payment

The department will pay for the measured quantity at the contract unit price each under the following bid item:

Payment is full compensation for installation of the ground rod and ground wire; welding and connections at both ends of the ground wire; and for furnishing all labor, tools, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work.

6. 2-Circuit Electrical Service Meter Breaker Pedestal, Item SPV.0060.207.

A Description

This special provision describes furnishing and installing a 2-circuit electrical service meter breaker pedestal and all associated construction and restoration.

B Materials

Provide an approved meter breaker pedestal, conduit fittings, and two 50 amp circuit breakers (22,000 AIC or larger as required by power companies), and connections and all necessary conductors and equipment required by the State of Wisconsin Electrical Code and the utility for a service connection.

The meter breaker pedestal must be approved by both the department and the power utility, WE Energies.

Topsoil, seed, fertilizer, and mulch conforming to the requirements of sections 625, 627, 629, and 630 of the standard specifications.

Metallic conduit conforming to the requirements of section 652 of the standard specifications.

C Construction

Coordinate a 100 amp, 120/240 volt, single phase, three wire underground electrical service lateral to be furnished and installed by the local utility at the meter located in a meter breaker pedestal mounted as shown in the plans, or as required by the local power company and approved by the engineer. Notify the engineer when the cabinet assembly is ready for connection to the power mains. The department will pay power company installation and energy costs.

Install the electrical service in accordance to power company requirements and in accordance to the department's "The Policy For The Accommodation of Utilities Within Highway Right-of-way". Furnish the power company with a wiring affidavit, certifying that the service has been installed in accordance to the State of Wisconsin Electrical Code.

Fill and grade the service trench and replace topsoil that may have become lost or contaminated with other materials. Fertilize, mulch, and seed all areas within the highway right-of-way that have been disturbed by the power company and by the installation of the meter breaker pedestal.

Use a bare, solid AWG # 6 copper wire to connect the meter socket to one or more ground rods. Use a device that measures resistance to ground using the three-point fall-of-potential method to ensure that the resistance from the meter socket to earth ground does not exceed 2 ohms. Add more ground rods if necessary to achieve this requirement. If the meter is within ten feet of the cabinet it is supplying, then the same ground rods can serve both the meter breaker pedestal and the cabinet. Otherwise, the ground rods for the meter breaker pedestal shall be separate from the ground rod(s) for the equipment cabinet.

D Measurement

Whereas, A site visit revealed the presence of two decorative buoys in the public right-of-way; and

Whereas, Said covered walk and decorative buoys may only legally encroach into the public right-of-way by granting of a special privilege resolution adopted by the Common Council; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee that Bartels Limited Partnership, 826 North Plankinton Avenue, Suite 600, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53203, is hereby granted the following special privilege:

1. To construct and maintain a 9-foot 5-inch wide covered walk projecting 11 feet into the north, variable width sidewalk area of West Wells Street. Said covered walk is centered approximately 120 feet east of the eastline of North Plankinton Avenue.

Said covered walk shall generally be constructed in accordance with the policies set forth in Common Council Resolution File Number 62-1211-a, adopted July 24, 1962. No sign or advertising device shall be hung from, attached to, printed or painted on any part of the covered walk. The name, street number, or character of the business may be indicated only on the vertical portion of the covering and shall not exceed 8 inches in height.

The grantee is required to keep a "Loading Zone" or "No Parking" status adjacent to the covered walk as long as the covered walk occupies the public right-of-way.




