Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

P.S. Power Lounge & Grill came door to door in our neighborhood telling us this was going to be a RESTAURANT!!!!!!

This report is written by Police Officer Penny Monreal, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 03/10/24 at 10:17p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting at 4323 N. 60th St. On arrival officers observed the victim inside the establishment with multiple gunshot wounds. Despite life-saving measures, the victim succumbed to their injuries.

Interview of witnesses on scene revealed the victim and associates had access to the unlicensed, currently closed establishment and were "lounging". Officers observed multiple scales, baggies and remnants of suspected marijuana, as well as a firearm. A few of the witnesses stated they were gambling with the victim inside the establishment, prior to the incident.

A property owner was identified, however, refused to meet with police or provide a statement. A check with License Information Reporting Administration revealed the applicant has applied for the license under an LLC, which listed the property owner as a registered agent of the LLC, and the principal office listed as 4323 N. 60th St. Video surveillance was recovered.

UPDATE

I, PO Adam LUEBBE, reviewed photographs taken of the scene. While reviewing these photographs I observed a table which appeared to be a homemade craps table with two dice on it. This table was located on the second floor, and it had bar stools around it. The homemade craps table, the dice, and the chairs around the table are items used for gambling. The second floor appeared to be lounge area with a couch, a chair, a futon, a barber's chair and two tv's. This second floor had a full bathroom as if it was a residence. Also in the area near the homemade craps table was a bar area. On top of the bar was a silver tobacco grinder, a clear plastic sandwich bag, and what appeared to be a hookah. These items combined together are used for smoking marijuana.

I conducted a search on the City of Milwaukee License Search website and observed that the license applicant is Rickey L ADAMS (B/M 09/13/1979) and he had an LLC under the name of Power Lounge & Grille LLC. I then conducted a search on the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions (WDFI) website and located Power Lounge & Grille LLC. WDFI has the registered agent of Power Lounge & Grille LLC as Rickey ADAMS and Jarrell JONES of 5840 N 37th St and their principal office as 4323 N 60th St (Power Lounge and Grille).

7. On 06/15/11 at 12:46 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4323 N 60th to investigate a Shooting complaint. Upon arrival, police observed security from the bar with the victim who believed he was shot to the head. The victim was taken to an area hospital where he received four staples to a laceration to his forehead. Police spoke with the victim who stated he walked a friend to her car when a male approached him from behind and demanded their property. They gave the suspect their money and a purse when the victim stated he then heard a shot and felt an impact to his head. Police also interviewed the witness who gave a similar statement but further provided that the suspect hit her friend over the head with the gun, which was followed by a "bang". One casing was recovered from the scene.

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8. On 03/25/12 at 2:34 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4323 N 60th Street for a Shots Fired Complaint. Investigation revealed two patrons of Gene's Supper Club were exiting the bar and began arguing with each in a parking lot, when an unidentified male that was standing near the two patrons, fired a shot in the air. The females ran the parking lot when another unidentified male walked up behind the shooter and was shot. The suspect then ran in between two yards dropping the magazine and a holster in a yard. The suspect then ran back to Gene's Supper Club where he threw his gun to a security guard, identified as Michael Miller with the suspect entering the bar. Officers located the suspect in the bar and place him into custody. The gun was recovered from Miller who provided a statement to police as well as other witnesses. No part of this incident occurred inside the bar.
9. On 04/03/12 at 1:00 pm, District Seven personnel and James Robinson Jr met to discuss several dangerous incidents that occurred at his bar and to provide helpful tips to reduce future occurrences. Robinson was advised that he is responsible for the safety of his patrons while they walk to and from their vehicles whether they are parked in the parking lot or across the street from the bar. Police also advised Robinson that he is responsible for his patrons littering in the neighborhood. Robinson stated to police that every year, he goes door to door in the neighborhood to listen to citizen complaints that are directly related to his business. Robinson stated he enforces a dress code and that he only allows people thirty and older to enter the bar. Robinson stated he has unarmed security guards who are from Extreme Security. Robinson stated he trusts his security staff and that they have worked for him for approximately two years. Robinson further stated he has one guard at the door checking ID's of patrons as they enter and that his staff also uses a wand to check for weapons. Robinson stated he has twelve cameras at his establishment, but only one is on the outside. Police were going to provide a security survey for Robinson. Meeting concluded.
10. On 08/08/12, the agent for Gene's Supper Club, James Robinson, received a nuisance letter from an officer at District Four in regards to two violent crimes that occurred at 4323 N. 60th Street within one year. On 08/18/12, Robinson sent an email stating that he did not feel that 80-10 was warranted and said that there were false accusations made regarding incidents at Gene's Supper Club. On 08/27/12, the Administrative Appeals Board received an appeal from Robinson regarding 80-10. A meeting was arranged with Robinson to discuss issues that were occurring at his club. The meeting took place on 09/11/12 at 10:00 am. Present were officers from District Four, ACA Nicholas DeSiato, and Safe and Sound partner Michael Totoritis. An employee of James Robinson who works as security for the club was also present. At this meeting, discussion was made of dropping the outstanding 80-10 nuisances if Robinson agreed to better security measures at his club. Also discussed were several issues that police had had with club in the past which included the following:
 - Raise age limit to 30+ to enter the club
 - Barred 10 patrons completely from entering the club
 - Capacity is 160
 - Use of cones to guide people out of the parking lot
 - Women would always go through a weapon wand, men would be patted down but not through a scanner
 - Security would have a ID scanner and a dress code
 - Prohibit troublemakers from re-entering the club; however, the bouncers do not have a formal process regarding "banned people"

According to Robinson, there have been more issues with women fighting and throwing drinks
Downloading issues of DVDs off from the video system

Robinson agreed to the age limit of 30+, banning people for good if they commit a felony on his premise, scanning drivers license and everyone with a wand.

Robinson was to submit this written plan by October 1, 2012. On Wednesday, September 26, 2012 Robinson submitted a new written course of action stating the above policy changes.

11. On 01/20/13 at 1:52 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4323 N 60th Street for a Shots Fired complaint. Upon arrival, police observed two bullet holes in front of the location and patrons exiting tavern. No shooting victims were found. Officers recovered two casings from the parking lot of the tavern. Officers spoke with James Robinson who stated there was a fight inside the club that involved several patrons with security escorting several of those patrons outside to the parking lot. Robinson stated that shortly after those patrons were escorted out, there were shots fired into the tavern, from the parking lot, by an unknown subject. A security guard, Michael Miller, observed the shooting and provided police with his statement. Miller stated the shooter has been in the club on other occasions, but that he did not know the suspect's name. Police were later advised of a shooting victim at St Joseph's Hospital. The victim stated to police that a fight took place inside the Gene's Supper Club and as she was gathering up her belongings, she exited the club when she heard one gunshot and turned to walk back into the club, when she realized she had been shot to the top of her head. The victim then made contact with her aunt, who was also in the club, and had her aunt drive her to the hospital. Officers notified Robinson of the shooting and requested video surveillance of the incident. Case is pending.

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12. On 02/06/13 at 9:41pm plainclothes officers conducted an investigation at Gene's Supper Club at 4323 N. 60th St. The officer and the sergeant observed two security guards standing in the parking lot in front of the entrance. One of the security guards approached the sergeant and the other walked into the building. The sergeant was patted down before he was allowed to enter the building and he was not asked for identification. The female officer was not asked for identification. The officer had identification in her very large purse. There was no age verification scanner being used at that time. The officer's ID reflected that she was 24 years old and not 30 years old which is the age restriction. The security guard did not use a wand scanner to check the female officer, her purse or the male sergeant for weapons. The security guard did not look in the purse.

13. On 02/18/13 at 4:15pm officers met with the applicant at Gene's Supper Club located at 4423 N. 60th St. regarding compliance with mandatory security measures. The applicant showed the officers the security system which was located on the second floor. The applicant had twelve cameras and added four new cameras: two for the inside of the establishment and two for the outside. The security system only recorded for one week and the footage could not be transferred onto a disc. The officer stated to the applicant she didn't think the measures he took met the ordinance requirements and she would check and get back to him.

After verifying MCO 68-4.3 and 105-91 the officer contacted the applicant to advise him his security system did not meet the criteria for the ordinances. Specifically all digital video records shall be stored on CD-R's or DVD-R's and maintained in good viewing order for 30 days after recording and made available upon request to the licensing committee and law enforcement officers. In addition he was advised that cameras installed in a Class B tavern shall be installed so as to provide a clear image of the entire premises as described on the license as well as the public right of way abutting the premises and any off street parking lot used expressly for patron parking. The applicant was advised to read the above listed city ordinances so he would not be in violation of the letter.

14. On 03/04/13 at 7:39pm officers were dispatched to Gene's Supper Club to investigate a complaint of a possible suspension violation. The officers made contact with the applicant and advised him of the complaint. The applicant showed the officers both the front and back bars and stated that he had locked up all of the liquor until the suspension is lifted. No liquor was observed by the officers. The applicant showed the officers an email from the City Attorney's office indicating that Gene's Supper Club could remain open during the suspension and serve food as long as they were closed by midnight.
15. On 04/02/13 an officer received a telephone call from the applicant regarding Gene's Supper Club and his compliance with security measures. The applicant stated he updated his security system by adding an additional camera and having the capability to record for 30 days. The officer met the applicant at the premises and he showed the officer the updated system. The officer observed that he installed an additional camera, which captures 60th St. The officer stated the applicant's security system appears to be in accordance with MCO.
16. On 04/12/13 officers were dispatched to an Entry at 4323 N. 60th St. Securitas Security was on the scene and well as the applicant. Officers checked for suspects but none were found. Security camera footage showed at 2:59am a suspect throw a landscape stone through a glass door and leave. The first suspect returned at 3:03am with another suspect acting as a lookout. Suspect #1 entered the bar through the broken window and picked up the cash register. The video further shows suspect #1 exit the bar with the cash register and he and suspect #2 flee southbound.
17. On 07/30/13 at 11:03 pm officers conducted a licensed premises check at 4323 N. 60th St. Officers identified three employees; two bartenders and a security guard. Both bartenders had Class D operator's licenses. The security guard was posted at the main entrance and conducts ID checks of patrons and pat downs of outermost clothing. The security guard is unarmed and did not have equipment like metal detector wands or an ID scanner. No violations were found and the applicant was notified via voice mail of the licensed premises check.

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18. On 05/05/2016 Milwaukee police conducted a tavern check at 4323 North 60th Street (Genes Supper Club). During this check, an officer discovered a patron of the business who is 22 years old. The tavern has a 30 year old age restriction on their Class B tavern license. The applicant was cited.

19. On 06/17/2016 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting complaint at 4323 North 60th Street (Gene's Supper Club). Investigation revealed the victim had been shot inside the business after being involved in an altercation with the suspect. During this encounter, officers discovered several patrons inside the business under the age of 30, in violation of the terms of the applicant's license. The applicant was cited.

When the officer told the applicant that it is a violation of city ordinance not to allow a uniformed officer into the business, the applicant stated he did not care. The applicant then whispered something to one of the security guards. Shortly thereafter, there was an announcement inside the business that the police were there and were checking ID's. The DJ also announced that they did not have to comply and provide ID cards. At that time patron's starting leaving the bar. As patrons left, the officer began asking them for identification. The second person to leave the tavern was Jasmine Davis (06/29/1990). When the officer asked for her ID, the applicant stepped towards her and stated that she did not have to show her ID card. The applicant was instructed to step back or he would be arrested for obstruction. The officer informed the applicant that it was a violation of his class B tavern license to have patrons inside under the age of 30. The applicant stated his food dealer license does not have an age restriction. After completing the tavern check, the officer attempted to gather information from the security guards, but they would not cooperate and provide the officer with their information. The officer then spoke to the head security guard, Michael Miller, who stated he would provide the officer with all of the security officer's information by email. As of 08/10/2016, Miller still had not contacted the officer. The applicant received two citations.

21. On 10/18/2016 Milwaukee police, along with Special Agent Gerogeann King of the Wisconsin Department of Revenue and Assistant District Attorney Hanna Kolberg, conducted a licensed premise check at 4323 North 60th Street. During this check, it came to the officer's attention that liquor was being purchased from an unauthorized dealer, and that liquor bottles were being refilled. Agent King decided to confiscate all liquor on the premise. Additionally, an expired gallon of milk was found in the refrigerator and undated food was found in the freezer. Standing water was located in the basement and the tavern was closed based on the observed violations.

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Item #18, #19 and #20 previously reported, disposition added 12/07/2017.

22. On 02/26/2017 a Milwaukee police officer, working as Acting Desk Sergeant at Milwaukee police district #7, took a walk in complaint from Michelle Veasley who stated she had been a patron at Gene's Super club when another patron exposed himself to her and touched her on the buttocks. Veasley told the bartender and the owner but the suspect was not told to leave. Veasley stated she felt the owner was trying to shut her up by giving her a drink. Milwaukee police incident report #170570003 filed.

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23. On 03/14/2019 officers conducted underage tavern enforcement in District 7. An underage Police Aide attempted to gain entry to Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The Police Aid was denied entry at the door when he stated he did not have an ID.

24. On 08/24/2019 officers investigated a battery complaint. The victim stated he was attacked in the parking lot of Gene's Supper club at 1am. The victim stated he was leaving the club when a subject stopped him, stating he (the victim) sideswiped his car. The victim was talking with this subject when an unknown person hit him from behind, knocking him unconscious. The victim was treated at Mt Sinai and suffered an orbital fracture and a fracture to his right foot. The officers went to Gene's Supper Club and talked with the head of security, Michael MILLER. MILLER stated he had contact with the victim inside the tavern when he found him in the bathroom on the floor with his head in the toilet. He escorted the subject outside and had him sit on a retaining wall. The subject then walked to his car and MILLER observed him sideswipe the car next to him. MILLER went to get the owner of the car that was hit. After a few minutes the parking lot security guard called MILLER over and he observed the victim on the ground. MILLER stated he did not observe anyone hit the victim, he thought he was just intoxicated, so he put the victim in a car with his friend, who drove him home. The officer watched the security footage but it did not show the incident.

25. On 09/06/2019 officers conducted a licensed premise check at Gene's Supper Club based on an aldermanic complaint of loud music. The officers observed several illegally parked cars and requested DPW Parking Enforcement patrol the area on weekends to assist in controlling the parking problems which contribute to the traffic congestion at closing time. The officers spoke with the head of security about the aldermanic complaint, and he stated he would advise the applicant of the complaint.

26. On 10/26/2019 at 2:00am officers conducted a licensed premise check Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The officers observed a patron leaving after closing time. They entered the tavern and observed about 30 patrons still inside, several with alcohol in their possession. The officers spoke with the applicant, who was on scene and cooperative. They advised him all patrons must be out of the tavern by the 2:00am closing. He stated they did not pour any of the drinks after 2am and drunk people are difficult to deal with. The applicant was issued a citation for Allow Patrons After Hours.

27. On 11/15/2019 the applicant was cited in the City of Milwaukee at 3809 N. 16th St for Building Code Violations.

28. On 02/01/2020 at 2:34am officers were dispatched to a Shooting at N. 60th St and W. Marion St. The investigation revealed the victim was on a "party bus" that arrived at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St, at 2:00am. The occupants of the bus went into Gene's until 2:30am and reentered the bus. The bus was driving on N. 60th St when shots were fired into it. The officers located casing in the road on N. 60th St. The officers went to Gene's and spoke with the applicant and security, who remained on scene. The applicant was cooperative and had surveillance video ready for the officers.

29. On 06/21/2020 officers were dispatched to 4323 N. 60th St for a Theft of Firearm. The caller stated she parked her car at 4276 N. 62nd St at midnight and went to Gene's Supper Club. She returned to her car at 2:00am and found the passenger side window broken. She checked her car and found her firearm missing.

30. On 06/26/2020 at 3:05am officers investigated a battery that occurred at Gene Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St, earlier in the night. The victim stated he was at the club and went out to smoke a cigarette. When he attempted to reenter the club the security guard would not let him back inside. He admitted becoming upset with the guard. He stated the guard then punched him 4 times to the face, causing a laceration to his lip. The officer went to the club but it was closed. On 06/28/2020 officers interviewed the security guard who stated the victim went out to smoke but was told he had to wait in line because of the lower capacity limits. He stated the victim became upset and spit at him, hitting him on the neck. He admitted hitting the victim. The officer spoke to the applicant who offered to allow the officers to view the video, but because of a backlog of assignments the officers could not meet the applicant at the business. The case was ordered in to the DA's office.

31. On 08/05/2020 officers conducted a license premise check at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St, based on aldermanic complaints of loud music, parking violations and littering. The officers observed a vehicle exit Gene's parking lot, drive west on W. Marion Av and turn up their music to an excessive level. The officers stopped the auto and observed two open bottles of liquor on the passenger seat. The driver stated he bought one of the bottles from Gene's Supper Club. The driver was issued citations.
32. On 08/08/2020 at 2:00am officers conducted a license premise check at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The officer observed approximately 20 vehicles illegally parked in the area. The officer issued 2 citations to vehicles blocking the alley. The owners of those cars stated they were coming from Gene's. The officer was pulled from the assignment for a higher priority call but heard numerous vehicle playing loud music from the parking lot and adjacent alleys.
33. On 08/09/2020 at 2:14am officers conducted a license premise check at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The officer observed 8-10 cars illegally parked on W. Marion St and 10 vehicles parked on N. 60th St in an area that is closed for road construction. The officers heard a car parked in the parking lot playing loud music for 10 minutes. The security guards made no attempt to address the loud music. The officer spoke with the applicant, who was on scene. The officers advised him of the violations and he admitted his car was one of the ones parked on N. 60th St. He was advised to not park on the closed roadway in the future.
34. On 08/14/2020 at 1:07am officers were dispatched to Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St, for a Shooting. The investigation revealed the victim and suspect were in the bar and had an argument. Both subjects went outside and armed themselves with firearms. The subjects fired shots at each other and the victim was shot 5 times. A total of 32 casings were recovered in the parking lot.
35. On 10/25/2020 at 2:23am officers investigated a shooting at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The victim stated he was leaving Gene's Supper Club at 2:30am and was walking to his car when he heard shots being fired. He got on the ground to take cover behind a car at 6029 W. Marion St. He did not see who was shooting or where they were coming from. The victim had wounds to his leg and hand. On 11/04/2020 an officer conducted follow with the Health Department regarding the current capacity of Gene's. The officer was advised by Rose at the Health Department that Gene's has submitted a Covid-19 plan but she was not able to say if the plan was approved. The officer stated that the tables and bar stools did not appear to be placed 6 feet apart. Rose stated they have received complaints regarding Covid violations from this location and would pass on the information to the inspector.
36. On 11/19/2020 a meeting was held at District 7 regarding recent incidents at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The applicant was present and stated the construction on N. 60th St has been causing traffic to back up when customers are leaving the tavern. He also stated he has noticed a change in his customers since the start of the pandemic. The applicant stated he has security inside and outside to help maintain order. He also has security cameras and an ID scanner. He does not allow loitering but does give people several minutes to leave once they are asked. He stated he wants to work with the Police to improve his safety plan to prevent future incidents.
37. On 12/22/2020 at 12:27am officers were dispatched to a Battery call at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The officers spoke with an employee, who stated a female was upset stating her car was stolen. She became aggressive with him stating she did not think he was doing enough to help her. The female threatened to spit on him and lunged at him, causing him to

pepper spray her. The female walked off. The officers located her and she began yelling at them and attempted to spit on them. She was arrested. The employee stated the female had never been in the bar.

38. On 01/06/2021 at 2:08am officers were dispatched to a Shooting at Gene's Supper Club, 4323 N. 60th St. The officers located a vehicle running in the parking lot that had been hit by gunfire. They also located 25 casings of different calibers. The witnesses stated an accident occurred in the lot, which led to occupants of both vehicles to shoot at each other. One victim was transported by private vehicle to the hospital, with a gunshot wound to the back. The officers located another victim at 6227 W. Medford Av, with a gunshot wound to the leg. The officers were able to confirm the victims and suspects were customers of Genes by the card reader and video provided by the business.

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39. On 08/07/21 at 2:15am, a subject walked into the Seventh District Police Station and wanted to make a complaint regarding a subject with a gun which occurred at 4323 N. 60th Street. The subject told officers that she was in the parking lot of the location when a male "flashed" a gun causing her to fear for her safety.

40. On 10/10/21 at 3:59pm, a subject walked into the Seventh District Police Station to report that her firearm was stolen. She told officers that she parked her vehicle on W. Marion Street and N. 61st Street and walked into the tavern located at 4323 N. 60th Street. When she returned, her firearm and purse were missing.

41. On 01/02/22 at 11:40pm, a subject walked into the Seventh District Police Station to report that her vehicle was stolen. She stated that she parked her vehicle in the parking lot at 4323 N. 60th Street and walked into the tavern. When she returned, her vehicle was missing along with her purse, a firearm, and he State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections Badge.

42. On 04/08/22, Milwaukee Police conducted follow-up at 4323 N. 60th Street regarding a shots fired, subject stop with an arrest, and a subject with gun complaint which occurred on 04/08/22 at 12:01am. The bartender told officers that she did work the night in question but saw and heard nothing. The officer observed four surveillance cameras which might have captured the incident, but the bartender stated that she does not have access to the surveillance cameras. The officer tried to contact the applicant but received no answer.

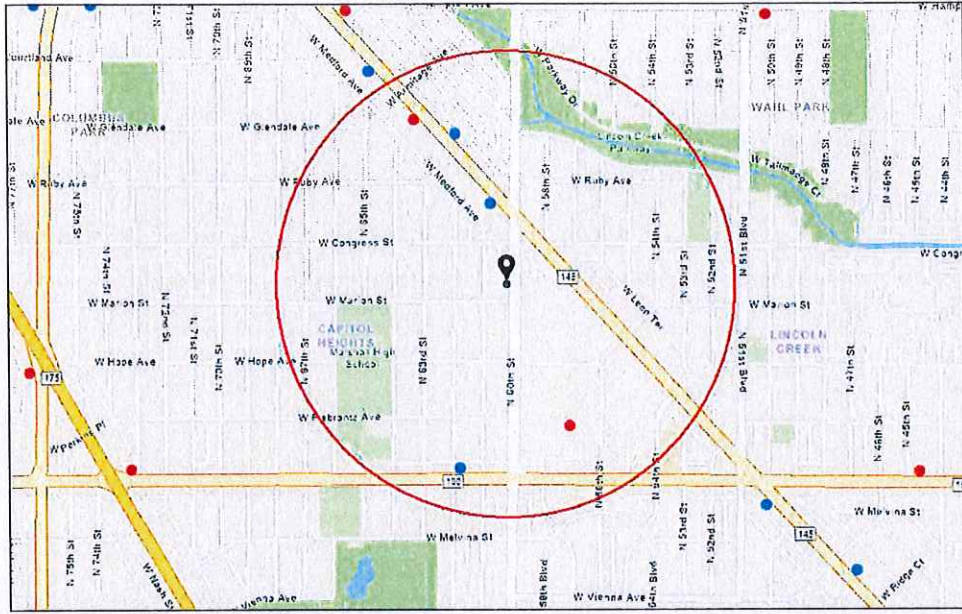

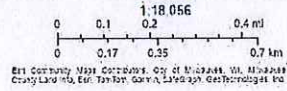

5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)
6. You may then provide testimony.
 - a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
 - b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
 - c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
 - d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.

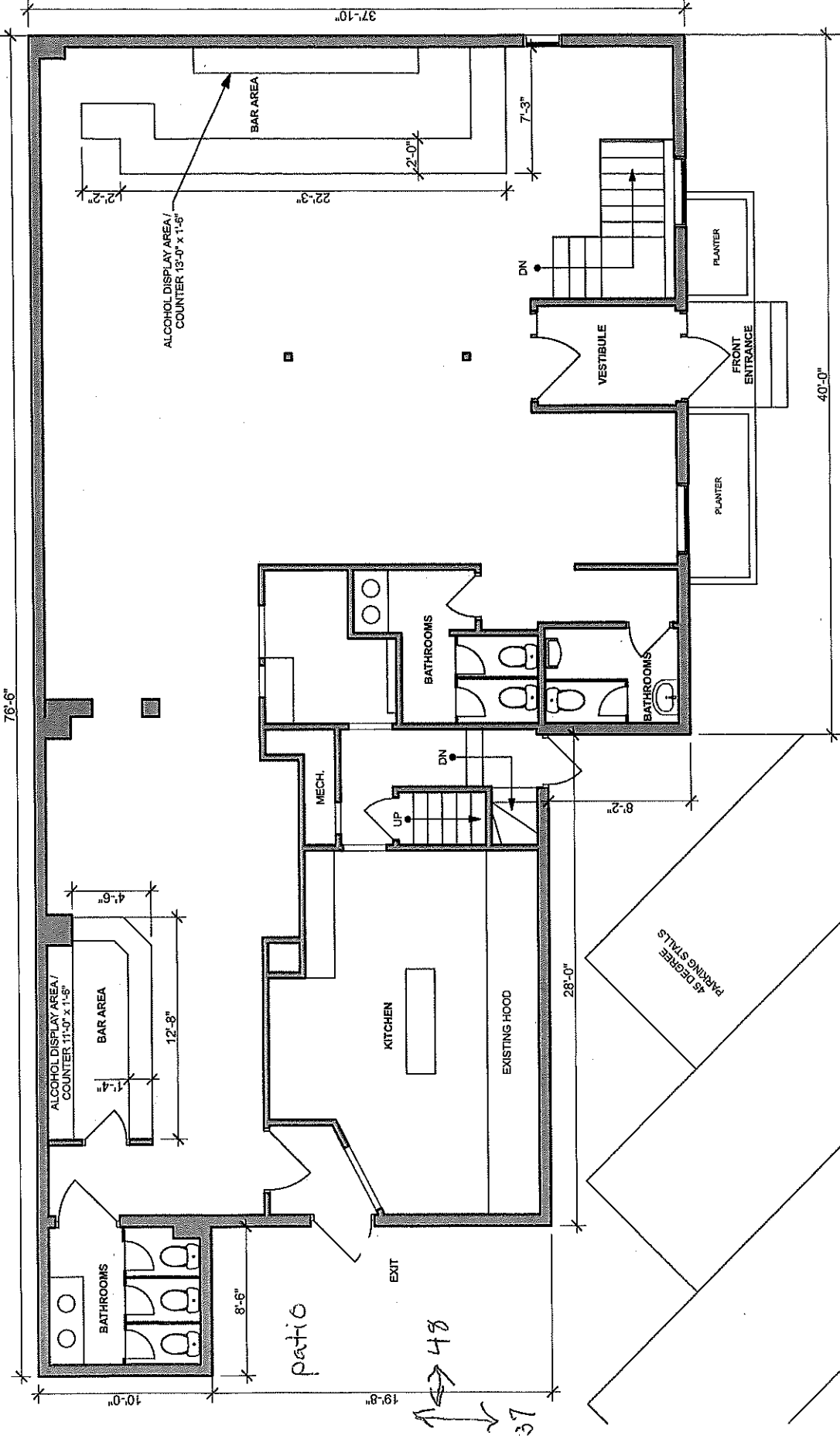
