# SERVICE INVENTORY | 53206

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## Introduction

Since 1867, the City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) has served the residents of the city of Milwaukee, seeking to improve and protect the health of all who live, work, and play within the city. Over 150 years later, the MHD remains committed to that mission by ensuring that everyone in the city of Milwaukee lives their best life. In support of that vision, the department offers a variety of services designed to improve birth outcomes, protect families from environmental hazards such as lead, identify and treat communicable diseases, and make our neighborhoods safer.

This inventory provides an overview of all of the services that the MHD offers. Although most of the services are available to any resident within the city, the MHD is intentional about making sure that the neighborhoods most impacted by poor health outcomes are able to access the services they need.

The services in this inventory are organized alphabetically and include a brief description of the service, the eligibility criteria needed to receive the service, the availability of the service, and contact information to learn more. The inventory also designates if the service is exclusively for residents in living in 53206 and a total number of residents who received the service in 2018.

## Inventory of Services

414LIFE	
<b>Description</b>	The 414LIFE violence interruption program implements the nationally-researched model called Cure Violence, which addresses violence from a public health lens. Credible messengers take action to gain community trust and perform conflict mediations that remove the threat of violence. While part of this program focuses in the Garden Homes neighborhood, certain employees are also positioned to work citywide, which includes attention paid to the violence interruption needs of 53206.

<b>Description</b>	Running Rebels' Be the Change program is a subcontracted partner of MHD-Office of Violence Prevention's ReCAST MKE program. Be the Change is a leadership program which incorporates cultural and social development, Rites of Passage programming, and college and career readiness.

Beach Monitoring	
<b>Description</b>	The Environmental Health Recreational Water Quality program operates seasonally to monitor water quality at each of the city’s three public beaches and issues daily water quality notifications to the public. This service utilizes direct testing of indicator bacterial levels as well as predictive modeling to inform decision-making. Seasonal and historical data on beach health are also available through this program.
<b>Eligibility</b>	This service is provided to the general public.
<b>Availability</b>	This service operates from Memorial Day through Labor Day annually.

Birth and Death Certificates	
<b>Description</b>	<p>Vital records are records of life events kept under governmental authority, including birth and death certificates.</p> <p>Vital Statistics issues both certified and uncertified documents; certified copies are official copies that can be used as a form of identification.</p>
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>The Office of Vital Statistics has access to birth records for all State of Wisconsin births, as well as death certificates for anyone who died at a City of Milwaukee hospital, institution, or residence prior to September 2013. Additionally, the Office has death records for anyone who died in Wisconsin from September 2013 to the present. Birth records date back to 1893 and deaths back to 1869.</p> <p>An individual is only able to obtain a copy of a birth certificate if: it is their own birth certificate; it is that of an immediate family member (i.e., a spouse, child, parent, sibling, grandchild); or, if the certificate is needed for the determination or protection of personal or property rights. If an individual is requesting a sibling's certificate, the parents of the siblings must be the same and the parents must have been married at the time of the birth.</p> <p>An individual is only able to obtain a copy of a death certificate if: they are a member of the decedent's immediate family (i.e., spouse, child, parent, sibling, or grandparent); they are an authorized legal representative; or, if the certificate is needed for the determination of personal or property rights.</p> <p>Individuals must show a current unexpired ID when requesting a certificate.</p>
<b>Availability</b>	<p>The Office of Vital Records is located on the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor of the Frank P. Zeidler Municipal Building (841 North Broadway, Room 115). The office is open Monday through Friday, 8AM - 4:30PM, accepting applications until 4:15PM.</p>

Breast and Cervical Cancer Screenings	
<b>Description</b>	The Milwaukee Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness Program is the local coordinator and provider for the Wisconsin Well Woman Program (WWWP), which provides breast and cervical cancer screenings to eligible women.
<b>Eligibility</b>	This service is targeted toward Milwaukee resident women who are uninsured/underserved between the ages of 35 to 64 (older than 64 with exceptions) who meet 250% of the poverty level. The program assists women in accessing breast and cervical cancer screenings at the Health Department’s Southside Health Center or at area providers and hospitals. If a woman does not have insurance (Well Woman is payer of last resort) the upper age limit is not a factor. Income guidelines must be met to enroll in the program as well. The WISEWOMAN program is an umbrella program under Well Woman that provides cardiovascular risk reduction services. Women must be enrolled in and receive services under the Well Woman Program to receive WISEWOMAN services.

<b>Description</b>	Employ Milwaukee’s Career Plus program is a subcontracted partner of MHD-Office of Violence Prevention’s ReCAST MKE program. Career Plus embeds a Career Coordinator in four MPS high schools to offer participating students work experience, social-emotional learning, and career pathway planning and support.

Environmental Complaints	
<b>Description</b>	The Milwaukee Health Department Environmental Health Program conducts investigations and surveillance, and provides education to the public about environmental health issues including recreational and drinking water quality, indoor/outdoor air quality, fugitive odors, potential chemical exposure hazards, mold intrusion, extreme weather, ectoparasites, and animal bites/wounds that may present a risk of rabies exposure.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Anyone may submit a complaint to the City of Milwaukee Health Department regarding an environmental health concern.

Food Complaints	
<b>Description</b>	The Division of Consumer Environmental Health (CEH) protects the health, safety, and consumer rights of those who live, work, or visit in Milwaukee. CEH receives and reviews any concerns with any food establishment, weights and measures device (gas pump, scale), and tattoo or body art facility received by the public by conducting inspections.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Anyone may submit a complaint to the Milwaukee Health Department against a food establishment, place of business that uses weights and measures devices, or tattoo or body art facility at any time provided they submit basic relevant information including their name and contact information as well as the name and contact information of the business in question. Individuals may also request to remain anonymous for any complaints.

<b>Description</b>	Assist individuals and families in enrolling in health care coverage.
<b>Eligibility</b>	All healthcare programs have different eligibility requirements. The Community Healthcare Access Program assists with enrollment for BadgerCare, Foodshare, Childcare, Family Planning Only Services, Medicaid and Marketplace Insurance, as well as with renewals for all programs.

Home Visiting-DAD Project	
<b>Description</b>	The Direct Assistance to Dads (DAD) Project is a free, voluntary program that provides home visits to fathers and their families and children. The DAD Project uses the evidence-based ‘Parents as Teachers’ home visiting model to provide parent support, identify potential child hood delays and improve school readiness.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Any Milwaukee teens or adult male residents who are expecting a baby, or fathers with children aged 0 to 12, are eligible for services through this program. The DAD Project works with fathers (whether first-time or not), father figures, or caregivers who identify as fathers, regardless of custodial standings.

Home Visiting-Empowering Families of Milwaukee	
<b>Description</b>	Empowering Families of Milwaukee (EFM) uses evidence-based models and partners with the community to provide frequent and long-term home visits to pregnant women and their families, working with the families until the target child is 3 years old. Each family receives services from a dual partnership including a Public Health Social Worker and a Public Health Nurse to provide access to health care, resources, school readiness, and social and child development support.
<b>Eligibility</b>	This service is available to any Milwaukee teenaged or adult resident of who is pregnant.

Home Visiting-PNCC	
<b>Description</b>	Parents Nurturing and Caring for their Children (PNCC) is a Medicaid benefit that helps pregnant women get the support and services they need to have a healthy baby, utilizing a team of nurses providing Prenatal Care Coordination via home visits during and after the pregnancy until the baby turns two months old.
<b>Eligibility</b>	All Medicaid eligible pregnant residents of the City of Milwaukee who are interested in learning more about having a healthy baby are eligible to participate in PNCC.

<h2>Immunizations</h2>	
<b>Description</b>	The Immunization Program seeks to reduce the incidence of vaccine-preventable disease by increasing access to immunizations, increasing demand for immunizations, and reducing missed opportunities to vaccinate.
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>Children (under the age of 18) who meet one of the following criteria are eligible for free vaccine:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Child is uninsured (no medical insurance)</li> <li>• Child is enrolled in or eligible for Medicaid/BadgerCare</li> <li>• Child is Native American or Alaskan Native</li> </ul> <p>Adults (anyone 19 or older) who do not have health insurance may also be eligible granted they meet certain risk factors specific to each vaccine.</p>

Lead-Environmental Investigations	
<b>Description</b>	Home Environmental Health Division (HEH) investigates cases of children, primarily the residence/s of children, screened and identified by a Primary Care Physician with elevated blood lead levels to determine the causes as well as the best preventative methods of lead poisoning.
<b>Eligibility</b>	There must be a child identified with an elevated blood lead level (greater than or equal to 20 µg/dL) determined to be living at an address or addresses within the City of Milwaukee in order to receive this service.
<b>Availability</b>	This service is available regularly Monday – Friday, 8 am – 4:45 pm across the City of Milwaukee at community residences (the program is housed in the 1 <sup>st</sup> Floor of the Zeidler Municipal Building, 841 N Broadway).

<h2>Lead-Soil Testing</h2>	
<b>Description</b>	Lead is naturally found in soil at very low levels and is not considered hazardous at those levels. Homes built before 1978 very often have exterior lead-based paint, which can chip or peel resulting in increased lead levels in soil. For people living near major roadways, soil analysis can help identify yard or garden areas which may have elevated lead levels and help determine ways to minimize possible lead exposure. The Public Health Laboratory supports the Lead Poisoning and Prevention Program providing reference analytical testing for lead in soil samples, which are collected by the CLPPP on-site at the residence(s) of the Case child or children.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Soil testing is conducted to determine, in part, the cause of lead poisoning in lead-exposed cases at property or housing that are already receiving lead abatement health services through the Home Environmental Health’s Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (CLPPP) interventions. Any such request is processed through CLPPP to decide if those properties are qualified for service.

Lead-Nursing Case Management	
<b>Description</b>	The City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) provides interventions and nursing case management to children under 6 years old who have been lead poisoned. Nurses frequently conduct home visits to case children but may also offer limited services at specific MHD locations or partner clinics.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Nursing case management services are provided in instances where children under 6 years old have been determined to have blood lead levels greater than or equal to 20 µg/dL.

Lead-Water Filters	
<b>Description</b>	<p>The Healthy Homes and Community Outreach program provides education on healthy home topics, including: water quality; trip hazards; and pest management; as well as providing water testing during elevated blood lead level investigations, City Charter Schools, and after lead service line replacements at licensed and certified childcare facilities.</p> <p>This program also manages water filter distribution to targeted populations and supports the city-wide efforts centered on all lead hazards, including lead-in-water concerns. This program also works with community partners to ensure children, families, and facilities receive the education necessary to understand all potential lead hazards in their environment.</p>
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>Filter distribution is eligible to the following individuals and locations, <b>with or without a lead service line (LSL)</b>, in the City of Milwaukee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Infants who are bottle-fed</li> <li>• Children with reported elevated blood lead levels (EBLLs) greater than 20 µg/dL</li> <li>• State of Wisconsin License or Certified childcare facilities</li> </ul> <p>Filter distribution is also eligible to the following populations in the City of Milwaukee <b>who are served by Lead Service Lines (LSLs)</b>, as determined by the Milwaukee Health Department:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children under 6 years of age</li> <li>• Children with blood lead levels greater than 5 µg/dL</li> <li>• Pregnant women or women who may become pregnant</li> <li>• Breastfeeding women</li> </ul>
<b>Availability</b>	<p>This service is based out of the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor of the Frank P. Zeidler Municipal Building (841 N. Broadway), but frequently makes community visits with various local partners.</p> <p>A limited supply of free drinking water filter starter kits are available for eligible families through community-based organizations including the Social Development Commission, Sixteenth Street Community Health Centers, and area Women, Infant and Children (WIC) programs. These are distributed during the agencies' posted hours.</p> <p>Additionally, Milwaukee residents may also come to the 1<sup>st</sup> floor to the Home Environmental Health (Lead Program) in the Frank P. Zeidler Municipal Building (841 N. Broadway).</p>

<h2>Newborn Screening</h2>	
<b>Description</b>	The City of Milwaukee Health Department has two Newborn Screening programs to identify conditions in newborns that affect the outcome of their health and development: the Newborn Hearing program, which aims to identify hearing impairment early; and the Newborn Screening program which uses blood from a heel prick to identify 44 different genetic, endocrine and metabolic disorders.
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>The Newborn Hearing program screens newborns that are born in the home, failed their first newborn hearing screen, left the hospital without a screen, or are lost to follow-up with their primary care physician.</p> <p>The Public Health Nurse Coordinator performs some blood draws on newborns that were not screened before they left the hospital, but the majority of the screens are for newborns that need retesting. More specifically, a retest is completed when there was a problem with the way the first blood sample was collected or the test result was abnormal. The PHNC will also do confirmatory whole blood draws on newborns suspected of having a sickling disorder.</p>

<b>Availability</b>	Pregnancy testing is available at any Milwaukee Health Department walk-in clinics. Hours vary by location.

<b>Description</b>	The City of Milwaukee Health Department's (MHD) Men's Health Program offers preventive health education, noninvasive health screenings, and medical or social service referrals. The program focuses on many different areas of men's health, including retinopathy screening, education, and referral.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Services are available to Milwaukee males age 14 and above at the MHD's three health center locations.

<b>Description</b>	Provide safe sleep education and free safe sleep items, including Pack ‘n Plays, sleep sacks, crib sheets, and pacifiers to families in need of a safe sleep place for babies.

<b>Description</b>	<p>Lead is naturally found in soil at very low levels and is not considered hazardous at those levels. Homes built before 1978, most likely has exterior lead-based paint, which can chip or peel resulting in increased lead levels in soil. People living near major roadways, soil analysis can help identify yard or garden areas with elevated lead levels and ways to minimize possible lead exposure.</p> <p>Backyard gardening is a popular urban practice. TB Screening & Care	
<b>Description</b>	The City of Milwaukee Health Department has the primary responsibility for preventing and caring for those with Tuberculosis (TB) in the city. The Tuberculosis Prevention and Care Clinic (TPCC) uses evidence-based interventions to assure that all persons needing to be evaluated for TB are identified and treated, and that appropriate course of action is taken to mitigate the spread of TB.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Anyone can get TB, however TB disproportionately affects minorities, people of color, foreign- born (including resettled refugees), and those with low socioeconomic status. Special attention is given to resettled refugee populations and recently persons reported with latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI) as a condition, as designated by Wis. Admin. Code Ch. DHS 145 in Wisconsin, effective July 1, 2018.
