PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO Penny BROWN assigned to the License Investigation Unit. On Saturday, October 18, 2014, I was assigned to work the Wisconsin WINS Tobaccao Initiative, which checks area vendors for age compliant tobacco purchases. Assisting in this assignment was Xavier T. ASHFORD B/M 4506 N. 21st. Milwaukee, WI 53209. ASHFORD is 17years old and not of legal age to purchase tobacco.

At approximately 9:41A, ASHFORD entered Bright Food Mart, located at 2500 W. Lisbon Ave., and purchased a 3 pack of White Grape flavored Show Cigars, from the cashier described as A/M wearing a grey sweater and blue jeans.. I entered the store and identified the cashier based on the description given as: Haitham A. Al Qasem A/M 10/25/76 of 1409 W. Granada St. #2 Milwaukee, WI 53221. Al QASEM adamantly denied the sale, even after I showed him a photo of ASHFORD. AL QASEM continously asked me "where is he now, show me him". I explained to AL QASEM that ASHFORD was already gone, however, I had a complete description of him based on ASHFORD entering the store and making a purchase. AL QASEM stated ASHFORD was never in the store. Due to this being a CLASS A establishment I requested to see AL QASEM Class D Operator's License, to which he provided me with a Responsible Server Certification. I explained this was not the license. AL QASEM insisted he did have a license, however, a check with the City of MIlwaukee License Division LIRA system showed AL QASEM had applied 02/14/14, however, it was never granted.

This supplemental report is written by P.O. Laurel Lammers, assigned to District Five early shift as the Community Liaison Officer.

On Monday, June 22, 2015 at 2:30 pm, I met with Kanwarvir Singh regarding his liquor license application for the store located at 2816 W. Fond du Lac Ave. Officer Ciano accompanied me during the survey.

Mr. Singh stated that the store previously belonged to his brother and that he was now applying to take over the license. Mr. Singh stated that his brother had operated the store for approximately 9 years.


Upon my initial arrival, I observed that the outermost entrance door was made of clear plexi glass, but it was covered with signage, which obstructed my ability to clearly see into the business. The second entrance door which was just past a small foyer past the main outer

entrance door was also covered with signage. I did mention this as a safety issue to Mr. Singh and he removed all the signage which then improved visibility into the business.

I observed many cameras covering both the inside and the outside of the business. The camera picture was very clear, and included multiple views of persons entering the store. Mr. Singh stated that all of the employees do know how to retrieve footage from the system, but he does prefer that they contact him to do so. The main camera and computer center is located in an upstairs office that Mr. Singh only has access to.

I spoke with Mr. Singh regarding taking the Robbery Prevention training. He stated that he has taken it, but that some of the employees have not. I did provide him with the phone number for the Department of Community Outreach and Education, to have the remaining employees trained when possible.

Mr. Singh did sign a standing complaint form for the location to which I did provide him with the commercial no loitering, no trespassing signs. He did already have one sign posted in the entryway foyer.
