Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

2. On 02/14/2009 at 2:23am Milwaukee Police were dispatched to an altered currency complaint at 3501 N. 6th Street. The applicant was on the scene and told officers that a subject had attempted to purchase an alcoholic beverage with a \$100.00 bill that the applicant determined to be counterfeit. The applicant determined the bill was counterfeit by use of a counterfeit identification pen. Officers confiscated the counterfeit bill and placed it on inventory. The subject who initially attempted to use the bill, identified as Thomas Washington, was questioned on the scene by officers and then released.

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3. On 12/26/2009 at 1:10am Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a fight at North 6th Street and West Keefe Avenue. Officers observed a crowd walking away from Elim's lounge (3501 North 6th Street). Investigation revealed several patrons had been arguing inside the bar. These patrons exited the bar and were no longer in the business when officers arrived. Officers observed no violations and no additional reports or citations were filed.

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5. On 07/30/2011 Milwaukee police responded to shots fired at Elim's Bar and Lounge (3501 North 6th Street). Investigation revealed a patron of the business retrieved a pistol from a vehicle and fired several shots into the air in front of the business.
6. On 11/05/2011 Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check at Elim's Bar and Lounge (3501 North 6th Street). A head count of patrons revealed 105 customers inside the business, which has a posted capacity of 80. Officers discovered one of the patrons was under the age of 21. Following a meeting with Captain Gordon at police district #5 on 11/22/2011, the applicant was not cited.
7. On 11/12/2011 Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check at Elim's Bar and Lounge (3501 North 6th Street). A head count of patrons revealed 102 customers inside the business, which has a posted capacity of 80. An officer spoke with the licensee, Ivory Elim, who agreed to close the bar early for the night.

13. On 04/13/2014 Milwaukee police went to Elim's Lounge (3501 North 6th Street) to check on an anonymous complaint that there were underage patrons at the business drinking. Officers discovered one patron at the bar that had not yet attained the legal drinking age of 21. This patron was cited. No additional citations or reports were written.
14. On 08/08/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a Shooting complaint at 3501 North 6th Street (Elim's Lounge). Investigation revealed there had been a fight inside the business. While being escorted from the business by security, one of the combatants ran to a car and returned to the bar with a gun, shooting two people. Milwaukee police incident report #142140008 filed.

This report was written by PO Michael WALKER, assigned to District Five, Late Power Shift.

On Sunday, January 12, 2014 at 10:00 pm squad 5464 (PO Chauncey HARRIS and myself) along with squad 5411 (Sgt. Adam ZIEGER), and District Five Shift Commander Boris TURCINOVIC met. with Ivory ELIM, the owner and Licensee of Elim's Lounge, at District Five Police Station. The purpose of this meeting was to address over capacity issues at his establishment, particularly a violation that occurred on 1/1/14. Also present during this meeting was Mr. Elim's wife, Brenda ELIM (B/F 3/19/67).

The following issues were discussed during this meeting:

- District Five's responsibilities in patrolling all Taverns in the District, particularly on New Year's Eve.
- The capacity violation that occurred on 1/1/14, which included what Officers observed during this Tavern Check on this date and the how uncooperative his door man "JAY" was with Officers during this check. Mr. Elim was advised, as a licensee, of how important it is for him and his staff to cooperate with officers during investigations and tavern checks as it relates to his establishment.
- Elim's Lounge Operation Plan was reviewed. From this plan Mr. Elim was advised that under his current Class B Tavern License he still has an age restriction of 25 and up. Mr Elim was advised that it is his responsibility to enforce this restriction at the door. Mr Elim stated he is in the process of setting up security surveillance cameras inside and outside his establishment. Mr Elim estimated that these cameras would be installed in approximately two weeks.
- Mr Elim was issued Citation # 48960211034 for being over capacity by 10 patrons on 1/1/14. Mr. Elim was advised on how the cost of this citation was determined.
- Mr. Elim stated he understood all of these issues and wants to cooperate with fully with Officers in the future. Mr Elim related that he understands how a good working relationship with Officers can be help in deter problems at his tavern.

This report is written by PO Shawn HUMITZ assigned to District 5, late shift, Sq 5369. On Sunday, April 13, 2014, Sq 5341 (PO Jason STACHOWIAK/PO Marcus PAGE), Sq 5331 (PO Joseph DOLKIEWICZ/PO Matthew WAGNER), Sq 5310 (Sgt. Gregory FLORES), Sq 5312 (Sgt. Todd KAUL), and I were sent to a contributing to the delinquency of minor complaint at Elim's Lounge, 3501 N 6th St. An anonymous caller was stating that there were ten 19-20 year old black males at the location who were drinking alcohol. They were sitting at a table in the rear of the bar near the women's bathroom and pool table.

Upon our arrival, we informed the security guards at the location our reason for being there. They stated they didn't believe there were any underage patrons. Sgt. KAUL, PO PAGE, PO STACHOWIAK, and I entered the bar. Sgt. KAUL had me contact the bartenders while they went to the rear of the club to check for underage patrons. Sgt. KAUL stated that there appeared to be a group of underage patrons that scattered when they saw the police. They were able to stop Kadeem JEWELL (B/M 09/14/93). JEWELL did not have an ID on him but provided his information. He stated that he would be 21 in September. JEWELL was seen drinking alcohol and was escorted out of the bar where PO DOLKIEWICZ and PO WAGNER issued him a citation for underage consumption of alcohol.

Sgt. KAUL spoke to the security guards at the bar. They stated that they remember the JEWELL coming to the bar and that they checked his ID which they stated showed that he was 21. They asked us to search JEWELL again for the ID. We were still unable to locate an form of ID. It is possible that the subject may have either thrown the possible fake ID away or given it to a friend while in the bar.

I spoke the bar owner, Ivory ELIM. I informed him of our reason for being there. He stated that he didn't believe that there were any underage patrons in the bar and that he had been there all night. ELIM provided me with his ID and access to the bars Tavern License. ELIM was then informed that there was at least 1 underage patron in the bar and that he may receive a citation for serving underage patrons after consulting with the District 5 tavern car.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)
6. You may then provide testimony.
 - a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
 - b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
 - c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
 - d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

This report is written by P.O. Laurel Lammers, assigned as the District Five Community Liaison Officer. On Thursday, July 17th, 2014 at 12:30 pm, I met with Barbara Lathan regarding her application for a new public entertainment license and Class B Tavern license for 634 W. North Ave., which will be under the business name of PNC.

The proposed business is located on the north side of West North Ave, just east of North 7th Street, which is an entrance location to the freeway. The location is currently opened under the business of Just Jazz and Blues bar. The main entrance to the business is on the south side of the building facing out onto North Avenue. I could clearly see into the business from outside and could see the bar area where employees would normally be working. The front windows of the business were clear and free of signage. I did observe one light above the entrance door, but since it was daytime, it was not on. I did not observe any other exterior lights on the building itself, or any cameras. There is street lighting that would appear to possibly light the business, but I did speak with Ms. Lathan about installing more exterior lighting and cameras. Parking for the business would all be street parking.

The interior of the business appeared neat and clean. I did not observe any interior cameras. There was no posted capacity at the time of the inspection but Ms. Lathan stated that she would be keeping the capacity the same as the previous business, which she thought was 62. Ms. Lathan stated that she plans on having a minimum of five employees staffed at the business to include herself. She plans to have contracted security personnel on an as needed basis, for special events. Ms. Lathan stated that she does plan to enforce some type of dress code and she will be enforcing an age restriction of thirty and up.

I did speak with Ms. Lathan about adding interior cameras and where to place them. I also spoke with her about having a safe installed for the handling of cash.

In addition to the camera program information, I did also mail Ms. Lathan a copy of the District Five contact guide so that she would have emergency and non-emergency contact numbers. There is no phone at the business at this time, but she does plan on getting one installed once the business is up and running.

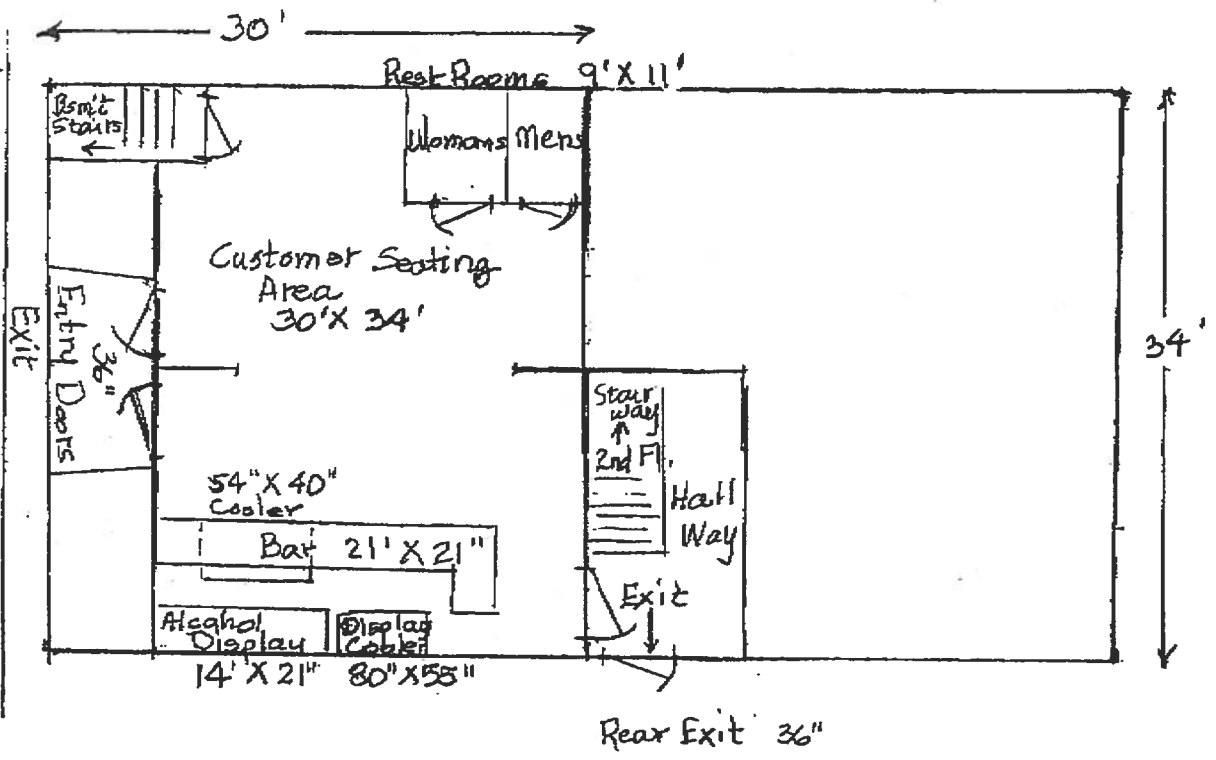

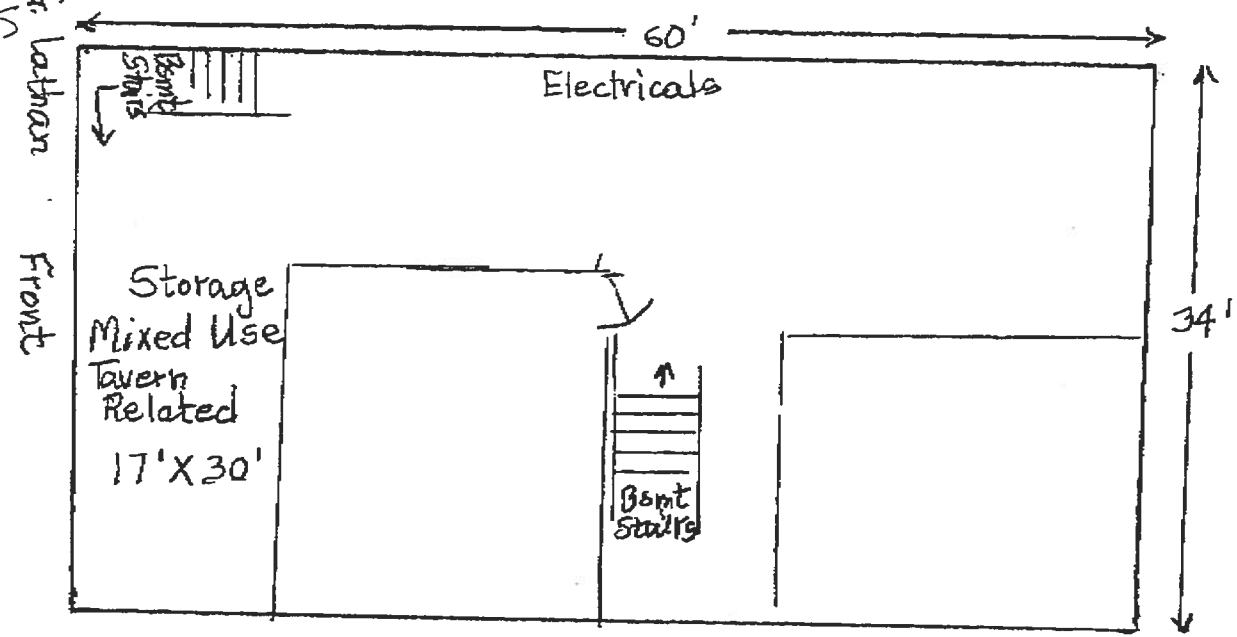

This report is written by P.O. Laurel Lammers, assigned as the District Five Community Liaison Officer. On Thursday, May 29th, 2014 at 11:30am, I met with Mr. Anthony McGaughy regarding his application for a new liquor and public entertainment license for 2053 N Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. which will be under the business name of The Big Eazy.

The proposed business is located on the south west corner of W. Lloyd St. and N. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. The main entrance is on the east side of the building and faces east out on to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. and there is a secondary entrance on the north side of the building that faces out onto Lloyd. Both of the entrances appeared to have adequate lighting, although it was daytime hours and the lights were not on at the time of my survey. There is a parking lot immediately to the south of the building. That parking lot is for the business just to the south, East Bank Storage, which also owns the building that the Big Eazy is opening into. That parking lot is monitored by two cameras that are mounted on the north side of the East Bank Storage building and one camera that is mounted on the south side of the Big Eazy building. Mr. McGaughy stated that they already have an agreement in place that they will be able to use the parking lot after business hours and on weekends.

I also conducted an inspection of the interior of the business. As I entered through the main entrance that is located on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr., I entered into the smaller front assembly hall. Mr. McGaughy stated that area will be used primarily for the restaurant, but will also be used as a reception area for when the business is hosting events. As I continued through the business (to the west) I observed two brand new men's and women's bathrooms. Beyond that was an all new kitchen, and beyond that was the rear assembly hall, which will be used as the event and banquet area. I also viewed the basement storage and office areas of the building. All of the interior area were well kept, and neat and orderly.

Recommendations made:

I did speak with Mr. McGaughy about installing more exterior cameras as well as an interior camera system. Along with that, I gave him information regarding the Surveillance Camera Program that is being sponsored by the Milwaukee Police Department and Safe & Sound. We also spoke regarding cash handling techniques. Mr. McGaughy stated that they would be using a point of sale (credit) system. I did recommend that they purchase a safe that can be either floor or other method mounted to keep any cash that they may receive. I also spoke with Mr. McGaughy about any security concerns for larger parties. I did recommend that he possibly contract with a security company when .

PO John SHIPMAN assigned to District 5, Late Power Shift types this report. On 4-20-14 at 2:25am sqd 5448 (PO SUTYAK and I) conducted a license premise check at 1806 N Dr Martin Luther King Dr (Total Game Sports Bar). Prior to conducting the check I was informed by Sgt Chad RADEN of the license investigation unit that Total Game Sports bar license had been granted but not issued due to a lack of payment. Since the license had not been granted Total Game sports bar was not supposed to be open.

As I entered the bar I observed approximately 10 customers in the bar drinking. The owner John MOORE (B/M 9-25-64) approached me and he explained that he had renewed the license and paid in cash at city hall. MOORE showed me a receipt that listed a payment made at city hall on 3-24-14. (Receipt# 01613288) I asked MOORE why his license was not displayed behind the bar as required by city ordinance.

MOORE stated he usually kept the license on his person and produced a license from his wallet that expired on 10-11-13. (License # BTVN 0200361) When I pointed out that that license was expired MOORE stated they had the new license displayed but and moved them recently when they had been cleaning. MOORE directed the bartender Anthony L BOWIE (B/M 3-24-75) to search for the licenses behind the bar. BOWIE was unable to locate the licenses. I asked BOWIE to show me his bartenders license and BOWIE couldn't find it saying it had been misplaced when he had been cleaning.

A records check by PO HARRIS confirmed that the class B license for Total Game Sports Bar was granted but not issued due to non-payment and that BOWIE's bartending license expired in 2012. MOORE was advised that he could not be open until he was issued a valid class B license by the City of Milwaukee. MOORE was also advised that the license needed to be displayed in the establishment. MOORE agreed to close voluntarily and stated he would not reopen until he had obtained a license.

Sqd 5369 (PO SEELOW) checked Total Game Sports Bar on 4-21-14 at approximately 1:00am to confirm they were closed.

PO WALKER assigned to the District 5 CPU issued MOORE a citation for Liquor Licence Required (ordinance 90-31-1 \$3,234.06) via mail.






- A. Food storage in the home must be limited to commercially packaged, non-potentially hazardous snack foods such as gums, candies, and chips.
- B. All food must be stored in its original container. There can be no storage of unwrapped bulk food products or removal of product from its original package for repackaging of any kind.
- C. No food can be stored in any room used as living or sleeping quarters. Food storage must be in a separate room, used exclusively for food storage. No other non-food items can be stored in this room. The room must also be equipped with a tight-fitting, self-closing door. No pets are to be kept or allowed in the food storage area.
- D. No food can be stored in a garage or other buildings outside the dwelling unit.
- E. Foods must be stored off the floor and away from the wall in rodent/insect proof containers (i.e., plastic or metal containers with tight-fitting lids).
- F. There shall be no sales made in or around the dwelling unit.
- G. This approval is only applicable to vending machine owners, peddlers, and distributors without retail operations or warehouses, and storage is limited to what can be sold in a week's time.
- H. Operator must agree to unannounced annual inspection of the storage area by the Milwaukee Health Department as a condition of licensing. Violation of any of the above requirements is grounds for denial or revocation of a license.
- I. Operator must have a Statement of Home Occupation on file with the Department of Building Inspection.
- J. Vehicles used in transporting foods are also subject to inspection and approval by the Health Department.
- K. No food can be stored in an attic unless the attic is properly finished and ventilated.
