That is what I was imagining and it's a hard no. The building was not designed for lamps there and I have to look at the facade as a whole, not just entrance by entrance. The rules for the district state specifically "There shall be no changes to the existing trim or ornamentation except as necessary to restore the building to its original condition. The historic architectural fabric includes all terra cotta ornament; all pressed metal elements including the cornices, pediments and oriels, and all carved and cast stonework."

I do think you have a great opportunity for some additional signage in the transom. Gilt letters? Neon? LED channel letters? I think that would be more appropriate and more effective fore drawing attention to your business. (I apologize for my similarly slapdash drawing.)
