1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

Plain Talk is a community-based initiative aimed at helping parents develop the skills and tools they need to communicate effectively with their children about abstinence, healthy relationships, and sexuality, with training and evaluation support by Annie E. Casey. As a nationally recognized evidence-based teen-pregnancy-reducing program, Plain Talk has three components: Community Mapping (surveying the community), Walkers & Talkers (community residents mobilizing their community), and Home Health Parties (for educating parents). The Milwaukee Plain Talk initiative was selected to be the 12th city in the U.S. for replication of Plain Talk. The target area for this initiative is the Midtown Planning area which has one of the highest rates of teen pregnancy and poverty. (11.4% of the 15-17 year old girls are pregnant every year and 45% of families live in poverty). The racial/ethnic breakdown is 76% African Americans, 15% Hmong, 3% Hispanic and 3% Non Hispanic Caucasian. The City of Milwaukee Health Department has joined with New Concept Self-Development Center and several local groups to implement this program.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The Plain Talk Milwaukee Initiative directly addresses the MHD goals of reducing unplanned, non-marital adolescent pregnancies, and reduction of STI's. This program also indirectly addresses the MHD goal of reducing infant mortality.
