There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. See attached police report or correspondence.

**Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:** Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

On Sunday, August 21, my wife ] and I, along with some of our close friends traveled to Revel Bar on Kinnickinnic, owned by Samer Asad (who also owns Jynx nightclub). ] was first in line as security checked her identification and gave her to go ahead to enter the premises. Not a second later Samer, who stood adjacent to the security guard stated to . "I don't like that scarf." The accessory she was referring to wasn't worn in an offensive nor inappropriate manner whatsoever. ] believed this statement to be prejudiced or even racist and let it be known to Samer who deceptively said his name was "John."

What compounded this belief was his confusing retort, "I'm a muslim, how can I be a racist?" I attempted to calmly intercede to no avail. The only answer Samer could concoct, as he stumbled over his words, was that it was "dress code." I believe security would know the dress code as well and if they allowed my wife entry that claim is proven to be false.

I am not one to quickly claim someone is prejudice or racist but it was blatantly clear that my wife's ethnicity, coupled with a head accessory, was all Samer needed to deny my wife entry. When he realized that we were with a fairly big group, and patrons that we're already in the venue, as well as ones about to enter saw what transpired and began to leave, he then stated "I'll let everybody else in, just not her." This is discrimination.

The next morning ] made a post about the events that got a lot of attention. The bar's rating on Facebook began to nosedive. In close proximity to our negative reviews were random, fallacious, 5 star ratings from people who are Samer's friends. I actually could prove these people had Samer on their friend list before Samer deactivated his profile. I began to seek out former business associates of his who asked to remain anonymous, but

told me that they stopped doing business with him due to a number of occurrences similar to what my wife experienced. There is no room for this kind of ignorant, asinine, prejudiced behavior in Milwaukee. Samer should not be allowed to run a business when he blatantly operates in a highly discriminatory way.

This report is written by Police Officer Gilbert Gwinn, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 10/17/08 at 2:24 am, Milwaukee police responded to 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street for a Strong Arm Robbery complaint. Investigation revealed the owner, Samer Asad, who owns the tavern Envy was walking to his car that was parked at the rear of the business when he was approached by two suspects who demanded his property. Asad fled the area but observed the two suspects going through his auto attempting to remove property. Asad stated he called his brother who was in the tavern and that he and another employee came out and they confronted the two suspects. The confrontation became physical when one suspect fled the area in an auto with employees being able to detain the second for police. Police spoke to all witnesses and obtained their statements. Minor injuries were reported.
2. On 12/14/08 at 4:01 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to St Francis Hospital for a Battery complaint. Police spoke to the victim who stated he and his girlfriend were at the Envy tavern when a fight broke out inside which they were not a part of. The victim stated security was pushing everyone out of the tavern when one security guard pushed him to the floor and other subjects began punching, kicking and stomping on the victims' face. The victim suffered a broken nose and received several stitches to his face for numerous cuts. The victims' girlfriend stated she was also punched in the face but an unknown male causing pain and redness. Police went to 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street for follow up but found the tavern closed. Officers were able to speak with the bar owner via phone on a later date who stated he was not there but was told by his security that there was an argument between some patrons in the bar and that security had them leave and that they (security) did not observe any fight outside of the tavern. Officers were told that the security cameras were "under construction".

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3. On 01/26/09, a patron who at Club Envy on 12/20/09 at 12:00 am, called and reported her purse was stolen while she was inside the bar. A report was filed.
4. On 04/04/09 at 1:30 am, a patron called Milwaukee police to report her purse stolen while she was a patron at Club Envy. A report was filed.
5. On 07/19/09 at 5:51 pm, a patron called Milwaukee police to report her purse stolen while she was a patron at Club Envy. A report was filed.
6. On 09/27/09 at 1:35 am, Milwaukee police were called to Club Envy to investigate a Fraud complaint when officers observed a large fight break out outside the doors of Club Envy. Security attempted to stop the fight but individuals from the street began to get involved. Officers called for back up because it appeared that 50-100 people were involved. It took five squads to dispense the crowd and officers spent 45 minutes on scene monitoring the club as patrons left. Officers spoke to the owner Samer Asad regarding the incident and Asad stated a bus parked in front of the tavern to pick up people from a party and an unknown female in a car behind it started yelling obscenities and threats out the windows to an unknown patron who was leaving the club. Asad stated more and more people then got involved and the fight got out of hand. A check of the taverns license found it was not properly displayed and a citation was issued to Asad.

7. On 10/31/09 at 3:52 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to investigate a Battery complaint that occurred at Club Envy on 10/30/09. Officers spoke to the victim who stated she and a friend were leaving Club Envy and walking to their car when three known females began assaulting them. One suspect who was punching the victim stated to her, " Nobody dances on my man without getting their ass beat." The victim stated she and her friend ran to her car where the suspects followed and caused damage to her car as well. All suspects were later identified and ordered into the DA's office regarding possible charges.
8. On 12/12/09 at 1:59 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 5<sup>th</sup> and National for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated while she was inside Club Envy she was assaulted by a known subject. The victim stated the two had a verbal altercation and that the actor pulled out some of her hair. Officers did observe a dollar size area of hair missing. Investigation revealed security and management broke up the fight and had the suspect leave through the back door. The victim was escorted out the front door and she stated that the suspect then ran up to her and punched her two times in the face. Security from another tavern witnessed this and chased the suspect away. The suspect later turned himself in and he was charged with Assault and Battery.

9. On 01/07/10 at 4:00 pm, Milwaukee police conducted follow up at the Envy Club regarding a Substantial Battery that occurred on 01/03/10 at 1:15 am. Investigation found a woman was cut on her face from a plastic cup by another patron while they both were in bathroom. The bathroom attendant identified as Rosetta Farrow stated she observed this incident, got scared and ran out to notify security. Officers spoke to Asad regarding the battery who stated he did not witness it because it occurred in the woman's bathroom but that he did observe the victim leave the bathroom with a bloody face. He stated he didn't call police because he believed that the police who were out front of his business at the time, where there for the battery. Asad stated he later found out the police were outside for another call.

**The following applies to Wisam Asad who is listed as a corporate officer:**

10. On 12/03/09 at 5:00 pm, Wisam Asad, who is listed as a corporate officer, received a citation for Sale of Alcohol To Underage Person at 2631 W Vliet Street.

11. On 01/06/10 at 11:18 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street for an Altered Currency complaint. Police spoke to Samer Asad who stated he received a fake one hundred dollar bill from an unknown patron at 10:41 pm. Asad stated the patron attempted to purchase drinks with it but that he had recognized it to be counterfeit right away. Asad stated he informed the patron right away and stated that he was going to report the incident and turn the fake bill over to the police. Asad was able to provide officers a description of the actor as well as a picture and name of the actor since his security staff scans ID's. Police conducted follow up but was unable to locate the subject. Police did leave a contact number with the subject's mother to have him call police regarding this investigation.
12. On 01/21/10 at 7:47 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street for a Theft complaint. Police spoke to Samer Asad who stated his employee Armando Acosta was observed on video pocketing money from alcohol sales as well as placing alcohol sales money into the tip jar instead of the register. The video was played for police as well as Acosta. The subject was arrested and issued a citation.
13. On 03/05/10 at 1:36 am, Milwaukee police were monitoring the crowd letting out of Club Envy located at 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Police drove down the alley and observed several Envy security staff holding back several subjects. Investigation revealed a fight occurred inside the club between patrons and security broke up the fight and escorted the patrons out of the club. One patron sought medical attention for a minor injury.
14. On 05/14/10, Milwaukee police conducted follow up regarding a complaint of music and dancing inside the club. Officers contacted the License Investigation Unit who advised officers that the club did not possess a Cabaret or Dance license and that both would be needed if

music and dancing were taking place. Officers advised the licensee of such and the club closed for the night.

15. On 07/02/10 at 12:30 am, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Prior to police arrival, officers received a confirmation email from Sgt. Paul Mac Gillis from the License Investigation Unit that the temporary restraining order that was against the City of Milwaukee was dismissed by Judge Brash as of Thursday June 24, 2010. While officers were on scene at 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street, they requested a supervisor to the location due to fact that the club did not have a license for music, disc jockey and dancing that was occurring inside the tavern. A supervisor responded and agreed with officers that the location should be closed for the night. Police identified the bartender as Wisam Asad and Wisam was advised that the business needed to be closed due to the violations. Wisam refused to comply and due to his behavior towards officers, was being held back by staff employees. Officers then spoke with Samer Asad who was asked to close the tavern. Samer stated, "No! Give me the citations I know I don't have a license but we still have a temporary restraining order." Samer further stated, "You can not be on the premise! I won't let you close me down!" After further discussions, Samer agreed he would close the location. Samer did provide officers with a court order for the temporary restraining order with a past court date of 06-19-10. An announcement was made shortly after using a microphone stating that, "if you were white there was nothing to worry about but if you were black you have to look out", which caused the crowd to become upset. Customers in the club were predominately black. When police questioned Wisam as to made the statement, Wisam stated a customer did and that a microphone was not used. Wisam became disorderly with police and was arrested. Police observed there to be about 50 patrons inside the club. As patrons were exiting, an officer heard a patron state that he just paid \$10.00 to enter the tavern and that the sign posted on the entrance door indicated the cost was \$5.00. Samer Asad became disorderly when he learned that his brother was arrested and was removed by his own security personnel in order to prevent Samer from being arrested. Police during the investigation did observe patrons dancing as well as the disc jockey and loud music being played. (not via internet streaming)

16. On 08/15/10, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1556 S 38<sup>th</sup> Street for a Battery complaint. Police were met by three citizens who claimed they had been battered after patronizing the Envy Lounge located at 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Police observed visible injuries to all three victims with the victims claiming that their injuries were sustained when a large fight broke out on the street following the release of patrons from the club. Reports were filed for a substantial battery, battery and a property damage complaint in which the victim's car window was broken during the melee.

17. On 10/02/10 at 11:20 pm, a police detective advised officers that a known subject wanted on felony charges could possibly be at Club Envy and in the VIP section. Officers attempted to enter Club Envy but were refused entry by a security guard identified as Robert Mitchell. Mitchell grabbed a microphone from his portable radio and announced that police were here. Mitchell then was physically moved by officers who proceeded to the VIP area. No patrons were found upstairs however Samer Asad and a female were found an office located on that floor. Officers spoke with Asad and asked to view surveillance in attempts to see if the wanted felon was in the club. Asad refused stating that police have no right to look at the monitors. Asad then proceeded to walk over to the monitor and turn it off, obstructing officers' attempts to locate and arrest a felony suspect. Asad then stated to police, "Get the fuck out of my office. If I don't want you to look at the security cameras then you can't look." Asad further stated that if officers didn't leave his office, he would file a police report stating that the officers had stolen \$10,000. Asad then proceeded to pull out a official Milwaukee Police Department citizen complaint form from his desk and stated to officers that if they left now he wouldn't file a report. Officers ask Asad if it was his intention to file a false police report and Asad replied, "Yes". Asad was advised he would be arrested if he filed a false police report, to which Asad replied, "Prove it". Officers asked the DJ to stop playing music until the investigation was completed and the DJ complied, turning off the music. This enraged Asad who ordered that the music be turned back on which it was. Asad was then arrested and conveyed to District Two for processing. Due to the uncooperativeness of both Mitchell and Asad, police were unable to investigate the subject wanted complaint. No charges were found in CCAP for Asad and a citation that was issued to Mitchell for refusing police entry was not found in the Municipal Court system.
18. On 10/08/10 at 1:46 am, Milwaukee police were monitoring closing time at Club Envy located at 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. This was the only establishment open on this block at the time. In attempts to prevent cruising, police conducted traffic control at 740 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. A fight broke out and officers attempted to investigate when they observed a subject with injuries. This subject when approached by police was uncooperative and began to fight with police. Once the situation was under control, the subject admitted that she was involved in a fight but didn't know who hit her and that her reaction was to fight back. She also admitted that she was very intoxicated and was ashamed of her actions. The subject was cited for disorderly conduct and resisting/obstructing an officer. An officer who witness the fight and assisted in breaking it up also cited the other party involved. While this was occurring, subjects in autos stopped to watch the incident with 25-30 patrons from Club Envy standing in front of the club. They were advised by officers to leave the area in which they complied. Samer Asad was also observed to be outside on the sidewalk videotaping. Police to also asked Asad to leave the sidewalk area to which he stepped inside the front door of his club. Asad kept the door ajar and would step back out onto the sidewalk taunting police. Asad was arrested for obstructing and processed at District Two.

19. On 02/18/11 at 1:32 am, Milwaukee police were monitoring the closing time at Envy and observed patrons yelling and screaming as they exited the club. As more patrons left the club, traffic congestion was observed due to patrons who were walking in the roadway. Officers observed security personnel standing in the front of the club and not attempting to move patrons along. Congestion became so bad that an officer called for additional units to help assist with moving traffic and pedestrian traffic along. Within 20 minutes, the area was cleared. Officers then observed the licensee Samer Asad come out onto the sidewalk and video record police while he was attempting to provoke a negative interaction. An officer advised Asad that a report would be filed but Asad refused to acknowledge police.

20. On 02/21/11, Lt MacGillis of District Two went the Milwaukee County Courthouse to obtain a court order for Envy Nightclub to release the video of a substantial battery that occurred inside the club on 02/19/11. The owner, Samer Asad has not cooperated with police from the start of the investigation. Asad refused to release the video when asked to by police. Officers obtained a court order and went to Asad home address to serve him with the court order. Asad was not home but spoke with Lt MacGillis by phone. Asad agreed to meet officers at the club at 9:30 pm. Police met Asad and his attorney at the stated time and served Asad with court order. The order stated the Asad must turn over the video tape to police by 02/28/11.

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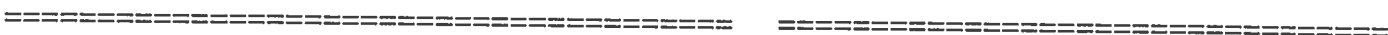
21. On 04/10/11 at 3:57 am, Milwaukee police investigated a Battery complaint at District 6, which allegedly occurred outside of Club Envy. Police spoke with the victim who stated she and her cousin were at Club Envy when she observed a female who she was previously friends with, but no longer was. The victim stated neither party made contact with one another inside the bar, but that upon her and her cousin leaving the bar, she was jumped on the female she knew who began punching her several times to the face. The victim stated she believe security separated the two and escorted them to their vehicles. Police did observe swelling and redness to the victim's face. Officers later issued a citation for battery to the suspect. On 04/11/11 at 8:00 am, officers left a message for Samer Asad via his cell phone to contact police regarding this incident and police obtaining video of this incident but as of 04/13/11, officers did not receive a call back from Asad.

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22. On 10/20/12 at 2:22 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 715 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street for a Sexual Assault complaint. Police spoke with the victim who stated a member of security for Club Envy sexually assaulted inside the club. The victim stated she was in the ladies room when a security guard entered and put his hands on her. The victim further stated the guard put one arm around her waist and his other hand put it inside her shirt, touching and squeezing her breasts. The victim stated the guard then positioned her up against the wall and began to kiss her face, neck and breasts area. The victim pointed out the guard and he was identified as Henry Blancovitch. Police attempted to interview Blancovitch who refused to talk with police and requested an attorney. On scene, police also spoke to Samer Asad who stated as soon as the victim brought the incident to his attention, he called police at the request of the victim. Asad later provided police with a copy of the video surveillance from the night of the incident. The suspect was arrested as a result of the investigation.

23. On 02/09/13, Milwaukee police were dispatched to a Shots Fired complainant at 625 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Investigation revealed a patron who had been at Club Envy, suffered a gunshot wound to the left lower flank and lower back area. The victim stated he was in the club with friends all night and observed an unknown male staring at him as though he was angry. The victim stated he and his friends left the club when it closed and walked to the parking lot where his friend's car was parked, when words were exchanged between his friend and an unknown male. The unknown male then punched his friend in the face and that is when the victim observed the male to be the one who was looking at him inside the club earlier. The victim stated he told his friend to drive off when the suspect began firing a handgun at them, striking the victim. Investigation further found the victim and one of his friends to be under the age of 21 and were both consuming alcohol. Police found five 9 mm spent casings that were recovered in the parking lot of 625 S 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Officers' also obtained witness statements from the victim's two friends. On 02/09/13, officers met with the licensee of the Envy Nightclub, Samer Asad, regarding the incident. Asad was unable to retrieve video of evidentiary value regarding the incident due to computer problems and officers were told that Asad might have to send the hard drive to a professional recovery service. Asad was unable to confirm or deny whether the victim or suspect were in the establishment prior to the shooting.

24. On 02/14/13 at 3:00 pm, Milwaukee police personnel, along with ADA Ann Lopez and City Attorney Jarely Ruiz, met with Samer Asad and his attorney, Mike Maistelman. At the meeting, police received an update status of the video and Asad explained the policies and procedures he has in place to run his business. Asad also explained that there was a virus that caused problems with the video and that his IT person was unable recover it, so he had to send out his hard drive to have it be recovered. Asad also provided a receipt. Asad stated once everything was done, he would provide a copy of the video to police, but that based on the location of the shooting, it would not be on the video, but that he could confirm whether the suspect and victim were inside the club that night. Also discussed were the plan of operations and how Asad is working with other clubs in the area to stagger bar closings as to not be releasing patrons from all the establishments at the same to time to avoid any further issues.



25. On 03/17/2013 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a Property Damage complaint at 715 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street (Envy Lounge and Night Club). Investigation revealed a patron of the business kicked the glass in the rear door of the building, shattering it. The patron was cited. No other violations were observed.

26. On 04/19/2013 Milwaukee police were dispatched to an Armed Robbery complaint at 606 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Investigation revealed that at 11:38pm a patron of Club Envy (705 South 6<sup>th</sup> Street) exited the business to put something in her car that was parked in front of 706 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street. When she turned away from her car to return to the bar, she was confronted by 2 subjects who robbed her at gunpoint. An additional victim had been outside Bucket Works (706 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street) smoking a cigarette. This victim was approached by a subject who struck him in the back of the head with a handgun, causing the gun to discharge. Milwaukee police incident report #131100009 filed.

27. On 11/24/2014 Milwaukee police conducted follow up regarding a fatal crash that occurred at 330 West National Avenue. The applicant provided officers with a video file of the ID scanner that captured information for all patrons who entered the business on 11/22/2014 to when the business closed on 11/23/2014.

28. On 02/06/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at South 5<sup>th</sup> Street and West National Avenue (Jynx Nightclub). The caller stated that his friend had been punched in the face by a security guard. Officers were unable to locate the caller/victim.

29. On 02/18/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a burglar alarm/vehicle crash/fire at 715 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street (Jinx). Officers observed a vehicle had crashed into the rear of the building and was engulfed in flames. Officers also observed that there was a brick on the accelerator pedal of the vehicle and the ignition lock cylinder was missing. Milwaukee police incident report #150490017 filed.

30. On 02/24/2015 Milwaukee police responded to Jynx Nightclub to retrieve video of surveillance from two arson incidents (Milwaukee police incident report #150320022 and #150490017). The applicant was cooperative with officers, but the video was recorded in a manner that is incompatible with department computers.

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31. On 09/09/2015 Milwaukee police, along with Agent Georgeann King of the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, conducted a licensed premise check at 715-717 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street (Jynx). During this check, 8 contaminated bottles of liquor and unreported tobacco purchases were discovered. No other violations were observed.

32. On 10/17/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a wanted subject complaint at Jynx Nightclub. Officers were unable to locate the wanted subject.

33. On January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2016 Officers responded to Jynx(715 S 5<sup>th</sup>) regarding follow up to an aggravated battery. The suspect in the battery battered the victim and bit off a portion of the victim's nose, this occurred on 01/01/16. The victim and suspect had been in a group that patronized the premises and the incident occurred after they left the location. The agent provided video regarding the incident.

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34. On 01/15/2016 a meeting was held at Milwaukee police district #2 regarding a recent mayhem that took place outside Jynx Nightclub. This meeting was attended by the applicant, a member of his family, his attorney, Captain Heather Wurth, Sgt. Chad Raden, Assistant City Attorney Nick Desiatio, Officer Guadalupe Velasquez and Officer Kevin Vodicka. The applicant stated security officers use an ID scanner as patrons enter, there are several cameras inside and outside the business, he pays to have Milwaukee police monitor the business on busy nights, he staggers the close of the business so all patrons do not leave at the same time, he intends to reach out to other business's to see if they would be willing to expand the paid police presence, that he would resolve situations where his patrons caused damage to other business's and that his security is very proactive.

35. On 07/03/2016 Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check at Jynx Night Club (715 South 2<sup>nd</sup> Street) based on an aldermanic complaint that the business was using traffic cones to reserve parking spots on the street. Officers spoke to William Daniel, who stated he would address the parking with his staff. No violations were observed.
36. On 07/12/2016 a Milwaukee police officer spoke with the applicant by phone regarding a complaint received from the office of Alderman Perez that the business was reserving/restricting parking spaces on the street with parking cones and charging people to park there. The officer advised the applicant that he cannot reserve or restrict public parking.
37. On 07/17/2016 Milwaukee police, working in plain clothes, pulled up in front of Jynx Nightclub and observed several orange cones blocking unused parking spots on the west side of South 5<sup>th</sup> Street in front of Jynx Nightclub. The officers asked an employee of Jynx if they could park where the cones were and if there was a charge for parking there. The employee stated he believed it would cost \$20.00 to park there, asked the officers to wait and entered the front door of the business. Several minutes later another subject, later identified as Rodolfo Corchado, exited Jynx Nightclub and told the officers they could park in the spot blocked by orange construction cones, but it would cost \$50.00. The officers stated they had to get the money and drove away. The officers returned with additional cars and spoke with the applicant. Corchado admitted to the applicant that he had attempted to charge \$50.00 to park on the street in front of the establishment.
38. On 01/01/2017 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting at Mt. Sinai hospital. The victim, who had been shot in the buttocks, was unable or unwilling to state where and how the incident had occurred. Eventually, he told officers he had been in route to Jynx Nightclub (715 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street) when he was struck by gunfire. Officers met with the applicant who was cooperative, and allowed officers to observe video surveillance from the interior and exterior of the building. Officers determined that the incident likely did not occur when or where the victim had described it.
39. Currently the applicant is past due on payments to the City of Milwaukee for the hiring of Milwaukee Police officers at the establishment. The applicant currently owes \$2,436.26.

Detectives spoke with the victim, Travis BULLOCK (M/B 06/05/89), who had been shot once in the buttocks and was in custody regarding a separate warrant with another jurisdiction. BULLOCK and his girlfriend, Breanna L FRANKLIN-GEROU (F/B 12/27/90), who had dropped him off at the hospital were unable or unwilling to state where and how the incident had occurred. BULLOCK eventually stated that he had been en route to Jynx Nightclub, 715 S 5th St, with an unknown subject in an unknown vehicle when he was struck by gunfire.

On Monday, January 2, 2017, at or about 5:34 PM, Squad 2266 (P.O. Matthew DIENER and I) met with the licensee of Jynx Nightclub, Samer L ASAD (M/W 06/02/88), at the premises. ASAD provided video surveillance from the interior and exterior of the building and upon reviewing the video, it was determined that the incident likely did not occur when or where BULLOCK described it.

The investigation remains open.

ASAD stated that his security officers are very proactive and deny entrance to subjects who are loud outside of the premises.

On Tuesday, July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016, I, PO Matthew DIENER, called the licensee of Jynx Nightclub, Samer ASAD (w/m, 6-22-82), regarding an Aldermanic complaint, sent from the office of Alderman Perez. The complaint was regarding Jynx Nightclub illegally restricting/reserving city public parking spaces in front of their business to be used as "VIP" parking and charging people a fee to park there. I received an email with an attached photo showing the parking spaces in front of Jynx being marked with orange parking cones. I called ASAD on 7/12/16 at approximately 4:08pm, and identified myself as Officer DIENER from District 2. I advised Sam that we had received complaints about the "VIP" parking and the parking cones. I advised Sam that neither he or Jynx Nightclub have any rights to charge patrons for VIP parking for their establishment. Sam stated that he understood, and stated that the cones were not their last week. I advised Sam again that he cannot reserve or restrict public city parking places for his establishment.





This report is submitted by P.O. Erin JACKSON, assigned to District 2 – Late Power Shift.

On 07-17-16, at approximately 10:30PM, my partner (P.O. Kenneth JUSTUS) and I were working in a plain-clothes capacity in the area of Jynx Nightclub (715 S. 5th Street). P.O. JUSTUS and I had been informed that the employees of Jynx Nightclub were blocking the city street with barricades and charging subjects money to park on S. 5th Street in front of the establishment. P.O. Matthew DIENER had informed us that the owner of Jynx Nightclub (Samer L. ASAD) had already been advised that they could not charge subjects to park their vehicles on the city street.

At 10:30PM, P.O. JUSTUS and I were in an undercover vehicle and pulled up and stopped in front of Jynx Nightclub. P.O. JUSTUS was seated in the drivers seat and I was seated in the front passenger seat of the vehicle. It should be noted that we observed construction on the east side of S. 5th Street between W. National Avenue and W. Bruce Street. The west side of S. 5th Street, in front of Jynx Nightclub, had several cars parked on it. We observed that orange construction cones blocked several unused and available parking spots on the west side of S. 5th Street in front of Jynx Nightclub. We observed a male employee of Jynx standing in front of the establishment on the city sidewalk. This subject was wearing clothing that indicated he was employed by Jynx and he was keeping waiting patrons from entering the establishment because they had not yet opened. We also observed a sign on S. 5th Street at W. Pierce Street indicating that patrons could park in Jynx' parking lot for \$20.00. This parking lot is accessible through a north/south alley that is between S. 5th Street and S. 6th Street.

P.O. JUSTUS called to the subject at the door and asked him if we could park where the cones were and pointed towards a parking spot just north of W. National Avenue on the west side of S. 5th Street. This employee stated that we could. P.O. JUSTUS then asked if we had to pay to park our vehicle. The employee stated that we did and that he believed it would cost us \$20.00. He then told us to wait and we watched him enter the front door of Jynx Nightclub. Several minutes later, another subject (later identified as Rodolfo CORCHADO M/W 02-06-85) exited Jynx Nightclub and approached the open passenger side window of our vehicle. P.O. JUSTUS asked CORCHADO if we could park by the construction cones and pointed towards the parking spot on S. 5th Street that was blocked by orange construction cones. CORCHADO stated that we could but it would cost us \$50.00. P.O. JUSTUS and I stated that we had to go get money and drove away from the location.

We then called for additional cars and were met by Sgt. Matthew KALTENBRUN and P.O. Zachary BURCZYK. We responded back to the location of Jynx where we interviewed CORCHADO. CORCHADO stated that he has been employed by Jynx Nightclub for 1 year and stated he asked for \$50.00 to valet our vehicle. I brought up the sign that was clearly visible that parking was \$20.00 and the fact that we had specifically asked to park by the construction cones on S. 5th Street. CORCHADO could not explain his actions.

We then interviewed the licensee of the establishment (Samer L. ASAD M/W 06-22-82) who had talked to CORCHADO after we arrived to the location with uniformed officers. ASAD stated that CORCHADO admitted to him that he attempted to charge us \$50.00 to park on the street in front of the establishment.

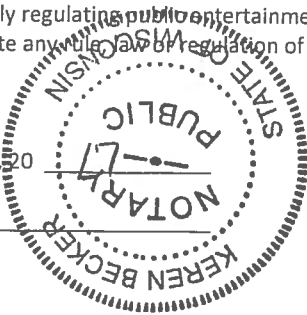

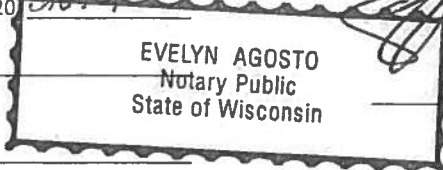



The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

The following incidents occurred under the current licensee Melissa Zanzig however Howard Zanzig, who is now applying as the licensee, is a corporate officer and was the bartender on scene when these incidents occurred.

1. On 11/09/09 at 1:47 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 8<sup>th</sup> and Becher for a Fight complaint. Investigation found two victims who were at Parks tavern got into a fight with some other patrons who struck them with pool sticks. Police spoke to the bartender Howard Zanzig who stated that he was in the process of closing the bar and that's why the lights were turned off. It should be noted that Howard Zanzig did not notify police regarding this incident. Melissa Zanzig was cited for Licensed Premises-Safe Egress Required and Licensed Premises-Open Entry Required.

2. On 01/03/10 at 9:30 pm, Milwaukee police received information from a confidential informant that a subject known as "Dano" works as a bartender at Park Shadows and would have cocaine on his person. Because of prior drug investigations, officers' known "Dano" to be Daniel Zanzig and found that there were open warrants for his arrest. Officers conducted a license premise check and found "Dano" and placed him under arrest. During a custodial search, officers recovered a folded up piece of white paper that contained a white powdery substance. Tests conducted at the district station confirmed this substance to be cocaine. Daniel Zanzig was charged with POCS WITD-Cocaine.

A physical fight started with one patron getting hit in the head with a bottle causing an injury. Bar employees' removed all parties involved in the fight to the outside when some subjects began to break out the window of the front door and side window on the east side of the bar. Police found that no security guards were on duty at the time of this incident. The patron injured in the fight sought medical attention and did not want to prosecute. Report was filed.

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5. On 03/08/13 at 11:15 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 2709 S 8<sup>th</sup> Street for a Subject With Gun complaint. Investigation found a patron was inside the bar with her daughter when two males and three females entered the bar and started to argue with the bartender. 


