The purpose of this report is to provide an overview of the 2022-2023 Programs and Activities the Milwaukee Safety and Civic Commission has completed and continues to work on with Local officials, City of Milwaukee Departments, Local businesses, Non-profit groups, Places of Worship and Milwaukee residences in the City of Milwaukee.

The Milwaukee Safety and Civic Commission is comprised of Safety and Civic Commissioners with three Mayoral Appointments and Fifteen Appointments representing each City of Milwaukee Alderperson for the City of Milwaukee. The Milwaukee Police Department Safety Division provides supports for the Commission.

The Milwaukee Safety and Civic Commission has been tasked with improving the quality of life in Milwaukee by improving safety and addressing citywide problems through effective targeted public education and public information efforts to achieve behavior modification to lift the community as a whole.

There are five Subcommittees that have been formed to support the Milwaukee Safety and Civic Commission mission by working with City departments and connecting Milwaukee residents with targeted information and resources to improve safety and their quality of life here in the City of Milwaukee as set forth by City of Milwaukee Ordinance 320.27.

There have been challenges with the Milwaukee Safety and Civic Commission as with any Commission or Board, however, the victories have outweighed the challenges with committed Commissioners, vested Stakeholders and steadfast Milwaukee residents who want to have an active role in addressing city wide problems and become a part of the solution for this great diverse and rich City of Milwaukee that we all either reside, work, worship, support businesses, and or enjoy leisure recreational and entertaining venues.




3000 Postcards Produced and Distributed to Milwaukee Residents in English & Spanish









Milwaukee Residents place the signs in their windows as a deterrent for Individuals pulling up in front of their homes in their vehicles and doing illegal drug transactions.




