Word of Hope Ministries, Inc. Executive Summary 2005-2006

This narrative is only a brief summary of the accomplishments of Word of Hope Ministries, Inc. Word of Hope Ministries, Inc. is committed to helping persons in need. Word of Hope's mission statement and organizational information, along with a list of the services we provide are attached. Word of Hope Ministries, Inc provides services and programs that encourage self-sufficiency and economic development opportunities for individuals and families in the Milwaukee community.

In 2005 WOHM placed 154 individuals in jobs. 56 of these jobs met CDBG requirements relative to wages earned in targeted zip codes. 484 individuals received soft skills training and 350 resumes were developed. 13 individuals graduated from our Technology Program.

In 2006, although all stats are not finalized, 29 individuals were employed that met CDBG requirements. Preliminary figures indicate that 2006 will have exceeded 2005 figures for employment, training, soft skills and other services.

Word of Hope Ministries, Inc. was able to continue serving the ex-offender population through a three year READY4WORK INITIATIVE (R4W) grant from the Department of Labor and the Anne E Casey Foundation. This Initiative continued through August 2006. Through the READY4WORK Initiative 315 ex-offenders were employed in meaningful work.

Also in 2006, Word of Hope Ministries, Inc. received another grant to continue serving the ex-offender population from the Department of Labor. The Prisoner Re-entry Initiative (PRI) to date has placed 63 ex-offenders in jobs.

Since 1996, more than 14,000 community residents have been served by a team of professional paid staff and volunteers with specific credentials and areas of expertise. Word of Hope Ministries', Inc. long standing presence in the community helps to establish strong and lasting relationships with individuals, families and employers.

Word of Hope, Inc. will provide an array of services that support the physical and spiritual needs of individuals and families in the community. We believe that Jesus Christ provided the perfect model for holistic ministries and it is by his example that we choose to model this ministry.

Word Of Hope Overview

Word of Hope Ministries, Inc. provides services and programs that encourage self-sufficiency and economic development opportunities for individuals and families in the Milwaukee community. Programs and services are outcome-based, and are offered in a manner which includes: thorough assessments, case management follow-up, and mentoring. The goals of Word of Hope are consistent with it's mission to build stronger individuals and communities through comprehensive educational, vocational, and innovative programming that meets specific needs of the individuals seeking our services.

Organizational Information

A faith-based community ministry now in its 9th year of operation, Word of Hope provides a range of services in our resource and technology centers that are designed to encourage personal development and responsibility, and to help empower individuals and families to be productive and self-sufficient. Our programs include:

- Social Services assessment and counseling to address the human service needs of individuals and families; the goal is to avoid crisis situations through intervention and education.
- ➤ **ATODA Counseling** state certified counselors whose sole purpose is to assist individuals to live their lives free from alcohol and drug dependency.
- ➤ **Health Care** —licensed medical practitioners screen for high blood pressure, diabetes, high cholesterol, glaucoma, and cancer; treatment referrals to medical providers are made when appropriate. We are partnered with the Medical College of Wisconsin.
- Employment Services assist individuals with development or improvement of their work readiness skills by providing vocational and educational training; job development, job placement, and job retention support services.
- Mentoring group and one-to-one coaching to (1) foster the development of positive attitudes and behaviors (2) improve or establish positive support networks within families and the community; and (3) learn to develop and utilize those life skills that will help build self-esteem and promote self-sufficiency.
- ➤ Technology GED preparation, computer literacy lab; computer software courses including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Access; Children's Academic Enrichment courses emphasize reading, math, and science.

Prisoner Re-entry Initiative — provides re-entry support services to former inmates, ages 18 and up, who have been released within the past 180 days, or are currently in pre-release centers. Service plan includes intensive case management, educational and vocational training; job placement, retention support services, and ATODA counseling when appropriate.

Accomplishments

Since 1996, more than 14,000 community residents have been served by a team of professional paid staff and volunteers with specific credentials and areas of expertise. We have helped them with health screenings and referrals, and substance abuse treatment; to learn new skills; become gainfully employed; combat illiteracy and overcome educational deficiencies through enrollment in the Academic Enrichment Program, which fosters proficiency in learning and self-confidence; and we have also provided individual and family counseling to help them maintain and strengthen family bonds.

Word of Hope's long standing presence in the community helps to establish strong and lasting relationships with individuals and families who come seeking our services.

Amen. Graduation will be held in the near future when there are other participants who are ready to graduate with me. Word of Hope social services assisted me in receiving furniture and other items for my new house. FAMILY TECHNOLOGY RESOURCE CENTER

WHAT IS A FAMILY TECHNOLOGY RESOURCE CENTER?

The Family Technology Resource Centers (FTRC's) are an initiative of Governor Tommy Thompson to bring state-of-art computers and multi-media computer training software into neighborhood schools, churches and community centers in Milwaukee. Through this initiative, convenient access to technology and technology training is provided to people having little or no access today.

WHO NEEDS FTRC'S?

It is well known that technology-related skills will be increasingly important for people competing for jobs in the labor market of the 21st Century. FTRC's are intended to support family learning and parental involvement, which has always been the cornerstone for educational success. It has been nationally documented that minorities lag far behind in acquisition of computer/technology skills. FTRC's are designed to be beneficial to minorities in their personal, business or professional responsibilities. FTRC participants who successfully complete the software curriculum with a score of 80 or higher will receive Continuing Education Credits from the University of Wisconsin Extension-Milwaukee.

WHERE ARE THE FTRC'S?

The Wisconsin Initiative began in three Milwaukee locations: Andrew S. Douglas academy, South Division High School (now Walker Middle School), and Word of Hope Ministries at Holy Cathedral Church. In response to a variety of needs, Holy Cathedral opened the Word of Hope Family Resource Center on May 5, 1996. The Center's mission is to provide supportive services to enhance individual and family development in the areas of Social Services, Job Readiness and Placement, Health Care, and Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Abuse (ATODA) Counseling. The Family Technology Resource Center enhances Word of Hope's mission and helps to strengthen its programs by providing growth and expansion of its existing services.

WORD OF HOPE'S FTRC TODAY

2002 will mark the fourth year of our FTRC operation. As of 06/05/01 we replaced our ITC Computer Training software with KnowledgeBank software. FTRC was expanded to offer a Children's Academic Enrichment, G.E.D. /H.S.E.D. Lab, utilizing Compass Learning software. As a result, we have expanded our FTRC from ten (10)) computers to twenty-six (26) computers.

WHEN IS THE FTRC OPEN?

Word of Hope Ministries FTRC opened April 20, 1998. Our hours of operation are on Monday – Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 Noon, Monday – Thursday from 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. and Monday – Wednesday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m.
