

1. Describe the proposed ordinance or resolution.

The Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) is the fiscal agent for a multi-jurisdictional traffic safety task force comprised of MPD, Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Police Department, and Marquette University Police Department. The task force goal is to decrease traffic crashes and obtain voluntary compliance with traffic regulations so that fatalities and serious injury collisions are reduced. This grant will fund a campaign targeting seat belt enforcement. MPD will conduct enforcement activities in high traffic areas to improve compliance of motor vehicle occupant restraint laws and encourage use of seat belts.

2. Identify the anticipated equity impacts, if any, of this proposal.

No equity impacts are anticipated. The Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) strives to be a department where every member works with our community to help build sustainable healthy neighborhoods, free of crime and maintained by positive relationships. MPD is committed to transparency, including transparency related to community engagement efforts and our ongoing constitutional policing efforts.

3. Identify which minority groups, if any, may be negatively or positively impacted by the proposal.

Seat belt enforcement funded in part through this grant is intended to reduce serious injuries and fatalities resulting from vehicle collisions and improve the safety of Milwaukee streets and neighborhoods. The enforcement campaign will include enforcement and education to enforce vehicle occupant restraint laws and promote seat belt use. Enforcement is not expected to negatively impact any minority group.



4. Describe any engagement efforts with minority communities potentially impacted by the proposal.

No engagement efforts with minority communities are included as part of this grant. The proposal focuses specifically on traffic enforcement focused on motor vehicle occupant restraint violations and encouraging seat belt use.

5. Describe how any anticipated equity impacts of the proposal will be documented or evaluated.

Milwaukee Police Department leadership will continue to enforce standards-based compliance for field interactions within its membership. Any unanticipated equity impacts will be documented, reviewed, and addressed by supervision of the Milwaukee Police Department.

6. Describe strategies that will be used, if any, to mitigate any anticipated equity impacts.

Milwaukee Department leadership will continue to monitor compliance. While, no equity impacts are anticipated, any necessary mitigation strategies will be determined by MPD supervision in accordance with the MPD Code of Conduct and Standard Operating Procedures.
