Allocation Purpose: The 2026 Beat Patrol grant will partially fund salary and fringe benefits for two police officers to conduct proactive community policing beat patrol. The required grant match will be funded by MPD through the remaining in-kind salary and fringe benefits for the two beat patrol officers. Overtime costs are not an allowable expense. The two beat patrol positions are footnoted to expire unless the Beat Patrol grant is extended.

Program Goals: The purpose of the grant is to conduct community policing beat patrol to improve neighborhood safety through proactive engagement and relationship building with the community focused on crime prevention and crime reduction interactions. Beat patrol officers will work collaboratively with the community to identify, reduce, and prevent crime impacting quality of life for residents and businesses.

Programmatic Summary: Beat patrol officers will work in District 2 primarily patrolling Greenfield Avenue with a secondary focus on National Avenue, Mitchell Street, Lincoln Avenue, Cesar E Chavez Drive, and Muskego Avenue corridors. The officers will conduct foot patrol, citizen contacts/connections, business checks, park and walks, vacant house checks, traffic stops, and other patrol activities.
