Returned herewith is Common Council Resolution File Number 061032, which amends a special privilege to Bulk Petroleum Corporation for installation of a fourth monitoring well for the premises at 1909 West Hopkins Street

Bulk Petroleum Corporation requested permission to keep and maintain three flush-mounted monitoring wells, one each within North 20th Street, West Burleigh Street and West Hopkins Street. Permission for the monitoring wells was granted in 1995 under Common Council Resolution File Number 941825. Said monitoring wells continue to occupy the public right-of-way.

The current request is to install a fourth monitoring well into the public right-of-way of North 20th Street. Said monitoring well will be centered approximately 17 feet east of the westline of North 20th Street and 55 feet southwest of the southwestline of West Hopkins Street.

We are not aware that the presence of said monitoring wells has had or will have an adverse effect on the general use of the public right-of-way. We have, therefore, prepared the attached special privilege resolution, which, if adopted, will allow the new monitoring well to occupy the public right-of-way and will also allow the three existing monitoring wells to continue to occupy the public right-of-way.
