3. On 03/02/2008 at 8:34pm Milwaukee Police responded to an armed robbery at 3700 North 26th Street (Angel's Food Store). Initial investigation revealed 2 subjects entered the store around 8:30pm. Subject #1 displayed a black handgun and demanded money. The subjects obtained \$400.00 in various denominations of US Currency from the cash register and fled on foot. No injuries were reported and no violations observed. Incident report #080620133 filed.

Police spoke with the manager who said he was fed up with people loitering in front of his store and always calls police, but that they take a lengthy amount of time to respond.

Police spoke with the cashier, who was the only employee on scene, and advised him that police were there due to a complaint of single cigarettes being sold at the business. I entered the store and identified the cashier based on the description. The cashier/agent was identifed as: Chidi ONUKWUGHA A/M 02/01/79. ONUKWUGHA admitted to the sale and apologized. I explained I will be mailing out a MARTS enrollment packet.

- 13) INCIDENT: On 05/11/90 at 11:19PM Officers responded to a shooting at the Cap Tap located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. Investigation revealed that a bartender of the Cap tap got into an argument with a patron and told him to leave the premises. This person left but returned a short time later with several others, and on of these persons shot the bartender in the face with a shotgun and killed him.
- 14) INCIDENT: On 11/20/93 at 12:51AM, Officers were dispatched to a shooting at the M & J Cap Tap Lounge located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. A Patron was shot once in the chest, and once in the neck by another patron who fled the scene.
- 15) INCIDENT: On 03/24/94 at 1:05AM, Officers were dispatched to the M & J Cap Tap tavern located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. regarding trouble with juveniles refusing to show Identification. One subject was placed under arrest for open warrants.
- 16) INCIDENT: On 03/24/94 at 1:55AM, Officers were dispatched to the M & J tavern located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. regarding trouble with a subject. Upon their arrival, they spoke to Milton Pointer who stated that a patron was breaking glass, hit a female, and threatened to kill the Security Guards. - 17) INCIDENT: On 05/28/94 at 2:04AM Officers were dispatched to the M & J Cap Tap Lounge located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. regarding a reckless use of a weapon complaint. Upon their arrival Officers spoke to a security person who stated that a Female patron entered the tavern and was recognized to be a person who was banned from the tavern about a Month ago. She was asked to leave and did so but returned a few minutes later holding a small silver handgun. She stated she could "Blow her way back in" and then she left, and did not return. Criminal Complaint filed.
- 18) INCIDENT: On 06/27/94 at 12:10AM, Officers were dispatched to the M & J Cap Tap Lounge located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. regarding a reckless use of a weapon. A security person escorted a patron out of the tavern and she went to a car, got a gun, and pointed it at the security guard threatening to shoot him. The subject was arrested by Officers.
- 19) INCIDENT: On 04/05/95 at 2:00AM Officers were dispatched to the M & J Cap Tap Lounge located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. regarding a battery which occurred inside the tavern. One person was struck in the face and required stitches. One patron was arrested.

- 20) INCIDENT: On 07/02/95 at 12:31AM Officers were dispatched to the M & J Cap Tap Lounge located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. regarding trouble with a patron. A security person reported to officers that a patron attempted to fight with him after he tried to get the patron to leave after he was causing a disturbance.
- On 01/08/96 at 1:15AM Officers conducted a check of the Cap Tap tavern located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. Officers observed Alan T. Pointer serving patrons alcoholic beverages. Officers checked licenses, and found that Alan did not have a Class D Bartender license. He told Officers that his Mother was the licensee; however he does not live with his Mother (Jane Pointer). Both Jane, and Alan Pointer were issued citations which were not issued by the City Attorney's Office.

- 25) INCIDENT: On 08/22/98 at 12:29AM Officers came upon a disturbance at 4228 W. Capitol Dr. A security guard working at the Cap Tap tavern located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. advised Officers that a patron was attempting to prove a fight with numerous patrons, and made threats to security personnel. This person was escorted out of the tavern, and very forcefully opened the front door causing damage to the door. This subject appeared to be highly intoxicated. The suspect was arrested, and issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.
- 26) INCIDENT: On 12/19/98 at 2:15AM an Officer on patrol in the area rear of 4221 W. Capitol Dr. (Cap Tap Bar) heard the sounds of shots being fired in the parking lot of the bar. As the Officer came around the corner, he noticed what looked like a white 4 Dr. Oldsmobile flee the scene. A description of the vehicle was broadcast, and the area checked with negative results. At the scene there were shell casings found on the ground, and the right rear fly window of the bar owners (Milton Pointer) auto had been shot out. Criminal Complaint filed.
- 27) INCIDENT: On 05/08/99 at 2:09AM Officers were dispatched to a subject with a gun at the Cap Tap located at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. Upon their arrival Officers found a battery victim being treated by EMS personnel. Investigation revealed that no witnesses saw any actors with a gun. The bartender on duty (Michael Henderson) stated that he saw the argument in the bar. He observed security break up the argument, and walk several subjects to the door. The bartender was not able to identify any of the actors. The owner of the bar, Milton Pointer

- stated that he did not see the argument in the bar. The victim was treated at St. Josephs Hospital where he received four sutures above his left eye. Criminal Complaint filed.
- INCIDENT: On 06/25/99 at 12:26AM Officers were dispatched to 4221 W. Capitol Dr. to investigate a shooting. Upon their arrival Officers searched the East, and West parking lot of the M & J Cap Tap, in an attempt to find any evidence regarding the shooting. Officers found broken glass which may have been from the shooting. Officers interviewed George Ramsey who is a security guard at the tavern. He stated that at about 12:10AM he stepped out of the tavern, and heard two gunshots from the west side of M & J's. Also interviewed was Tyron Ramsey (Security guard) who stated that George told him that he had heard two gunshots come from the west side of the bar. Tyrone stated he went outside and saw a Male standing next to an auto, and Tyrone asked him what was going on. This person stated that somebody had just shot out his front passenger side window of his auto. This person left the scene in his auto. Milton T. Pointer stated to Officers that he had been in the bar all night, and has not seen any argument, or fight inside the bar, nor did he hear anything from outside the bar. Criminal Complaint filed.

NOTE: On 10/05/99 the Common Council voted to grant this Class B Tavern License with a ten day Suspension.

- 29) INCIDENT: On 12/17/99 at 1:15AM Officers while on routine patrol heard roughly three shots come from the area of the Cap Tap Tavern (4221 W. Capitol Dr.) Investigation revealed that tavern security had put a patron out for causing problems inside the tavern. This subject then fired two shots outside the bar, and two in the bar. The subject fled the scene in an auto. Further investigation revealed no injuries or bullet holes found at the scene. A witness stated that two of the shots were fired at a window, but the window was not broken. It appears that blanks were fired. A criminal complaint for Disorderly Conduct was filed.
- 30. On 11-5-2001 at 1:08am police were sent to subjects with guns at the Cap Tap, 4221 W Capitol Dr. In route, they were informed that the subjects were in the restaurant next door, 4231 W Capitol Dr. Officers found the suspects in the restaurant and one had a small chrome pistol in his pants pocket. A Ramsey, a bouncer employed by the Cap Tap, stated that one of the suspects attempted to enter the tavern without and ID card. He became engaged in an argument with Ramsey outside and then the other suspect, who was in the tavern sitting at the bar, came outside and pulled out and pointed a small chrome pistol at him (Ramsey). Ramsey then went into the tavern and while the door was closed one of the suspects pointed the gun at Ramsey through the door window.
 - 31.On 11-23-2001 at 2:05am Milwaukee Police were sent to a fight at The Cap Tap, 4221 W Capitol Dr. They were met by the tavern security personnel who stated that they were attempting to close the tavern and escorted out a patron by the name of Morse, who was intoxicated and yelling that he wasn't going anywhere. When they got outside the security persons where struck several times by acquaintances of Morse. During the fighting, Morse hit the front door plexiglass damaging the door. Although the security persons sustained injuries to their face and heads, they refused medical treatment and did not wish to file complaints. A complaint was filed to Damage to Property.

^{32.}INCIDENT – On 1-31-2007, police officers in uniform and marked squad car observed a hand to hand transaction on the sidewalk in front of M & J's Barf, 4221 W Capitol Drive. The officers pulled up to the two men, and one, Tyrone Roby m/7-28-63, ran into the bar and down stairs,

- into the storage area, pursued by an officer. He was found hiding behind some beer pallets. In the immediate area, the officers found a blue non-latex rubber glove, which contained a plastic corner cut baggie containing a white powder, later determined to be cocaine, 4.41 grams. Also found on the subject was 4 blue pills (Viagra) which he did not have a prescription for. Also the subject had \$1,688.00 on his person. He stated he was not working, and the cash was placed on inventory and suspected proceeds of drug sales. The subject has two prior drug convictions and is on probation for Possession of Cocaine. The amount of cocaine along with Roby's actions are consistent with the distribution of Cocaine. One arrest-report filed.
- 33. INCIDENT On 6-8-2007, 12:20AM, officers were dispatched to M & J Cap Tap, 4221 W Capitol Drive, regarding a man with a gun. Security guards told officers two patrons got into an argument inside the premises, with each threatening to harm the other. Around midnight, 3 subjects came to the premises with guns stating they were there to protect their mother. The three never got past the front entrance. Subsequently, the three along with one of the patrons in the argument left the premises. The bartender, Bonnie Zadi, stated that she could see the subjects in the doorway but had not seen the guns. The owner, Milton Pointer, stated he had been in the basement during the incident, and hadn't known anything about it until the guards had told him after the fact. The premise has many cameras inside and outside, monitoring the premises. The officers asked Mr Pointer, and the bartender, both to view the tapes but were denied by both, Mr Pointer told the officers the cameras to not show the front entrance to the tavern, and since the subjects never got past the front entrance, there was no point in viewing the tapes. Report filed.

- 34. On 08/30/07 at 1:30 am, Milwaukee police conducted a tavern check at 4221 W Capitol. Police spoke to the bartender Bonnie Zadi who stated she applied for a bartender's license however did not receive one in the mail yet. Zadi stated the licensee was in the basement and watching Zadi from a security camera. Officers then spoke to Mr. Pointer who stated he was the licensee and directed officers to where the licenses were posted stating the licenses were in his name. The name on the license was Jane Pointer. Mr. Pointer was asked if there were any guns or drugs in the tavern and Mr Pointer stated he had a gun. The gun was recovered under the cash register and placed on inventory. Several bags of marijuana were also found on the tavern floor and placed on inventory.
- 35. On 11/04/07 at 1:09 am, Milwaukee police were on routine patrol when officers observed several people yelling and pushing one another in front of the tavern at 4221 W Capitol. Investigation revealed an argument started between patrons who were leaving as other were arriving at the tavern. Both parties then started to physically fight outside the tavern. Police spoke to the bartender Vanessa Alcantar who stated she wasn't aware of any problems in the bar but heard that several people were fighting outside and that police were on scene. Citations were issued to the subjects for Disorderly Conduct.

36. On 07/01/08 at 1:57 am, Milwaukee police were in the alley behind 4206 W Capitol when four to five gunshots were fired. Officers drove around to the front and observed many people leaving the M & J Cap Tap at 4221 W Capitol Drive. As officers approached, several people yelled to police that a man with a gun had fired shots and then left the tavern. Officers entered the tavern and spoke to the bartender Bonnie Zadi who stated she heard gun shots and came out the rear door to see if everyone was ok when two males came past her and pointed a gun at her telling her shut up or they would shoot her. Police spoke to the owner, Milton Pointer, who showed officers video recordings from the cameras that are inside and outside the tavern. Pointer stated he did not know any of these subjects who were viewed in the video. Officers received an anonymous call at the bar and was told that the woman first name was Dena and that she and her son were involved in the shooting and advised officers of where they lived. When officers asked Pointer about Dena, he denied knowing who she was. It was later learned that Pointer knew "Dena" and that she was a regular at the tavern. Pointer then stated that he had barred "Dena" from the tavern from a previous incident. Both Pointer and Zadi were uncooperative at times in regards to information on Dena and that witness advised police that Dena was never barred from the bar. An arrest was made of the shooter and he was charged with ESBUODW and Disorderly Conduct While Armed.

NOTE: Milton Pointer is not listed on the application as the licensee or as an officer, nor does he hold any bartenders or Class B Managers license. The licensee is listed as Jane Pointer.

37. On 09/27/08 at 2:18 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4221 W Capitol Drive for a Fight complaint. Officers spoke with Dontaye Hall who stated he work as a security guard at the tavern. Hall stated there was a fight inside the tavern but that he had pushed them all outside and that the subjects left the scene. Police also spoke to Milton Pointer and was asked for the taverns license which was found to be under the cash register. A citation was issued to the licensee Jane Pointer for Display of Liquor License Required.

Pointer also demanded that a sergeant be called to the scene because he refused to close the tavern. A supervisor responded and advised Pointer of the city ordinance. 42. On 05/11/12 at 12:23 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4221 W Capitol Drive for a Battery/Fight complaint. Police found a battery victim who had a large bandage around her head and it was covering her left eye. Police observed blood all over the upper portion of her body. The victim told police she was in the bar with some of her friends when a male who was sitting nearby on one the bar stools mentioned something about her tattoo on her arm. She stated she talked to him for a minute when notice a female sitting next the male who seemed to be getting upset that she was talking to the guy. The victim further stated that the woman started calling her names and called her a "Bitch". A security guard came over and told the victim and the other woman to stop arguing, with both subjects stating, "I'm good". As the guard was between the two women, the suspect then grabbed a glass and threw it over the head of the security guard, striking the victim in the head, cutting her. The security guard then escorted the victim outside the bar and waited for the police and medical attention to arrive. The victim was treated at a nearby hospital and was told that she had internal damage to her retina and was advised to see an optometrist. The security guard, identified as Ken Carter, also had minor injuries from being hit by glass as well.

- 43. On 01/01/13 at 6:22 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to a Shooting at 4221 W Capitol Drive. Investigation revealed that no shooting occurred, however, an armed robbery took place. Police spoke with the victim who stated he and some of his friends had an argument with another group of people in the bar with bar employees pushing both groups out of bar. The victim stated he went to his auto to leave when he was approached by one of the subjects who was armed with a gun. The suspect demanded money from the victim who was then struck in the head with the gun. The victim fell to the ground and then heard a gunshot. The victim stated the suspect then went through his pockets and grabbed his wallet and cell phone before fleeing. Police recovered a single casing in the alley next to the location of the incident. The victim's cell phone was found further down the alley, which appeared to have been thrown.
- 44. On 01/10/13 at 2:00 pm, Jane Pointer from the Cap Tap met with an Officer from District Seven to discuss how the bar was being run and what security measures they already had in place. Pointer provided several course of actions she was going to enforce and submitted to police a written course of action to abate the problems that were occurring at her bar. Police accepted the written course of action.
- 45. On 04/13/13 at 1:27 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to a Shooting near N Sherman Drive and W Capitol Drive. Investigation found three men entered the bar highly intoxicated and was refused service due to their intoxication and removed by security. Shortly after the subjects' removal, several shots were heard being fired. The bartender told her security to not go out there because it was too dangerous, however she did not call police either. Further investigation found a patron who was inside the bar and who had been talking to some female patrons, upset the boyfriend of one of the females and had apologized to the guy for talking to his girlfriend. The patron then left the bar with the male subject following him and once outside, the subject fired one round into the air. The patron had entered his friend's auto when the suspect fired 3-4 more shots at the direction of the victim, striking him once in the ankle. Police recovered one bullet from the auto and 4 casings in the parking lot. The incident was caught on video surveillance.

46. On 07/17/2016 officers investigated a subject with gun call at 4221 W. Capitol Dr. The caller, William WILBORN, stated he won \$200 on the video machines on 07/16/2017 and went to collect when the business opened. He stated Milton POINTER shorted him \$57 and they got into an argument. He then stated POINTER pulled a gun and told him to leave. POINTER stated WILBORN was making threats and due to his age he grabbed his gun but never pointed it at WILBORN. There was video but it did not show the incident. POINTER gave

WILBORN the rest of the money and he left the location.

47. On 11/04/2017 officers were dispatched to 4221 W. Capitol Dr to investigate a shooting. The investigation revealed a subject entered the business armed with a hand gun and stated it was a robbery. The subject fired 5 to 6 shots and the bartender, Milton POINTER, fired a shot back. The suspect was then wrestled to the ground by POINTER and a customer, who detained him for the Police. No one was struck by the gun fire.

48. On 06/16/2018 at 2:32am a subject approached the victim, who was sitting in his car in front of 4221 W. Capitol Dr. The suspect then shot into the car striking the victim to the side. The victim had been a patron of Cap and Tap bar prior to the incident. The officer spoke with the applicant who stated there had been no problems that night. She was cooperative and allowed officers to view the surveillance system.

This report is written by Police Officer Zachary CVETAN, District #7, Late Power Shift, Squad #7431.

On Saturday, November 4th, 2017, Squad 7431, (Officers Seth EDWARDS and myself), were dispatched at approximately 9:08 PM to 4221 W Capitol Dr, M & J Cap-Tap(bar), which is located in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin to investigate a shooting complaint.

We arrived on scene at approximately 9:10 PM. Upon arrival, I observed Squad 7420 (P.O. Zachary JOHNSON & P.O. Cameron SCOTT) enter the location. We entered into the location after Squad 7420 and ensured the safety and security of the people inside. Upon entering the location, I observed an unknown black male laying face down on the ground next on the West side of the bar. I observed Squad 7420 taking this suspect into custody(see supplemental reports regarding).

The licensee/victim, identified as Milton Pointer (b/m, 3/28/1931), stated the suspect entered the front door at approximately 9:00 PM and pointed a firearm at him. POINTER attempted to retrieve a handgun from behind the bar to defend himself and heard five to six gunshots being fired. POINTER stated he ducked behind the bar to avoid being struck with gunfire. POINTER stated he fired one shot at the suspect to defend himself. POINTER stated he is not a CCW permit holder, but keeps the handgun behind the bar as protection.

POINTER stated after the exchange of gunfire he began to physically fight with the suspect. POINTER stated he was able to remove the handgun from the suspect's person.

POINTER stated he has been in the bar business for approximately fifty-two years and this is the second time he has been the victim of a robbery.

Witness/security officer, identified as Kenneth MARTIN (b/m, 12/17/1962), stated he observed the suspect enter at approximately 9:00 PM. MARTIN stated the suspect pointed a gun at him and said "this is a robbery, empty your pockets and give me your money." MARTIN stated he layed on the floor to show compliance and heared approximately seven to eight gunshots. MARTIN stated when the gunfire ended he observed the suspect continuing to pull the trigger, but could hear clicking as if the weapon was empty.

MARTIN involved himself in the fight between POINTER and suspect. MARTIN stated he was able to help remove the firearm from the suspect. MARTIN stated he sat on top of the subject to restrain him. MARTIN was the one who called police.

No one involved in the incident was struck with gunfire.

Detectives have categorized this incident to be an attempted armed robbery. (See supplemental reports regarding.)




