This is a statement of events of which I feel the City of Milwaukee should be held liable for. :-

On 05/09/05 at approximately 10:30 P.M. I summoned the 7th District police station to dispatch a squad in regards to a burglary at my home - 3130 N 38th St. Milwaukee - I went out to check on my dog in the back yard and discovered when I opened the side door of my garage that someone had broken into it. I had my 1985 Chevy Suburban parked in it. My truck was pushed halfway through my garage door. The burglar had gained entrance by cutting off the lock and chain I secured the door with. They stole my amplifier, my subs (box with 15" speakers) and over 50 CDs. When the police arrived, they looked at where the locks had been cut, and verified by the cut wires in my truck that all my stereo equipment had been stolen. I requested someone to come and fingerprint the Plexiglas window that they broke out of my back

door. They called for someone to come to fingerprint, told us to go inside and they said they would get us when the other officer arrived. They then went and got in their car. About 40 minutes later the fingerprint Officer arrived and I went down to the garage to meet him. He went in and looked inside my truck then asked what I wanted him to do. I asked him to fingerprint the Plexiglas broken out of my back window. He took it to the front, fingerprinted and returned it to my garage. During the whole time, neither officer looked or searched my garage. ~~As~~ they looked it up for the night with a new lock and I went inside. The police left. They said before leaving they would be in contact with me in 48 hrs. regarding prints. The next morning, I went to get my truck out to take it to fix the broken window and the tailgate. Once again I found my garage open. I thought they had broken in again. I again called the police to report it, but told them not to send officers again. Upon looking after I got the truck out, I discovered that the burglary suspects had been locked in the garage when I closed

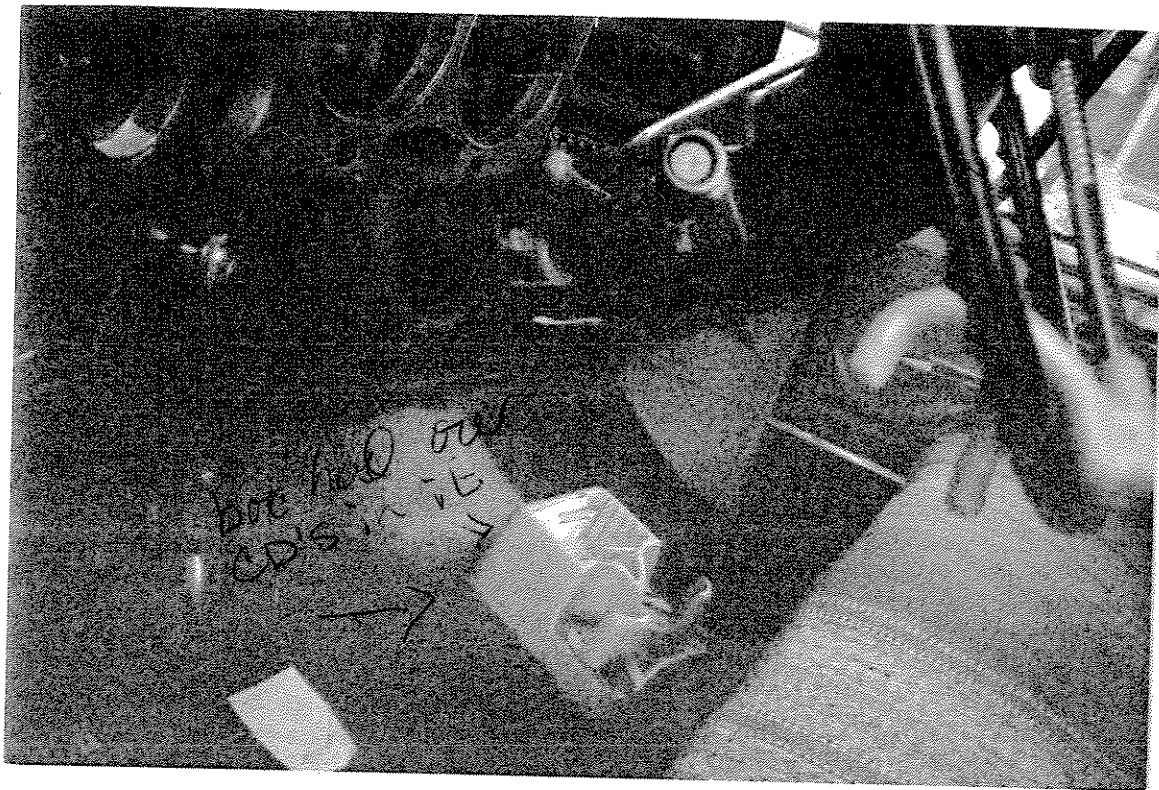
it up after the officers had left. There were oil foot prints on top of the car and on my truck. Also upon investigation of the broken door, I discovered it was broken from the inside. The burglars hid in the rafters of my garage and kicked the doors open to get out. They again stole some tools, my ~~gun~~ dialysis bag, which contained a Walkman CD player and 5 to 10 CDs, some tennis shoes, a blanket and other miscellaneous articles. Once again I called the police and they sent Sergeant Ellis out to investigate. When he came he went into my garage, looked into rafters, saw where the burglars layed, where the items stored up there had been moved and were falling down. His statement to me was the officers that had been out did not do a thorough investigation. That the rafters should have been searched as well as the alley and surrounding areas.

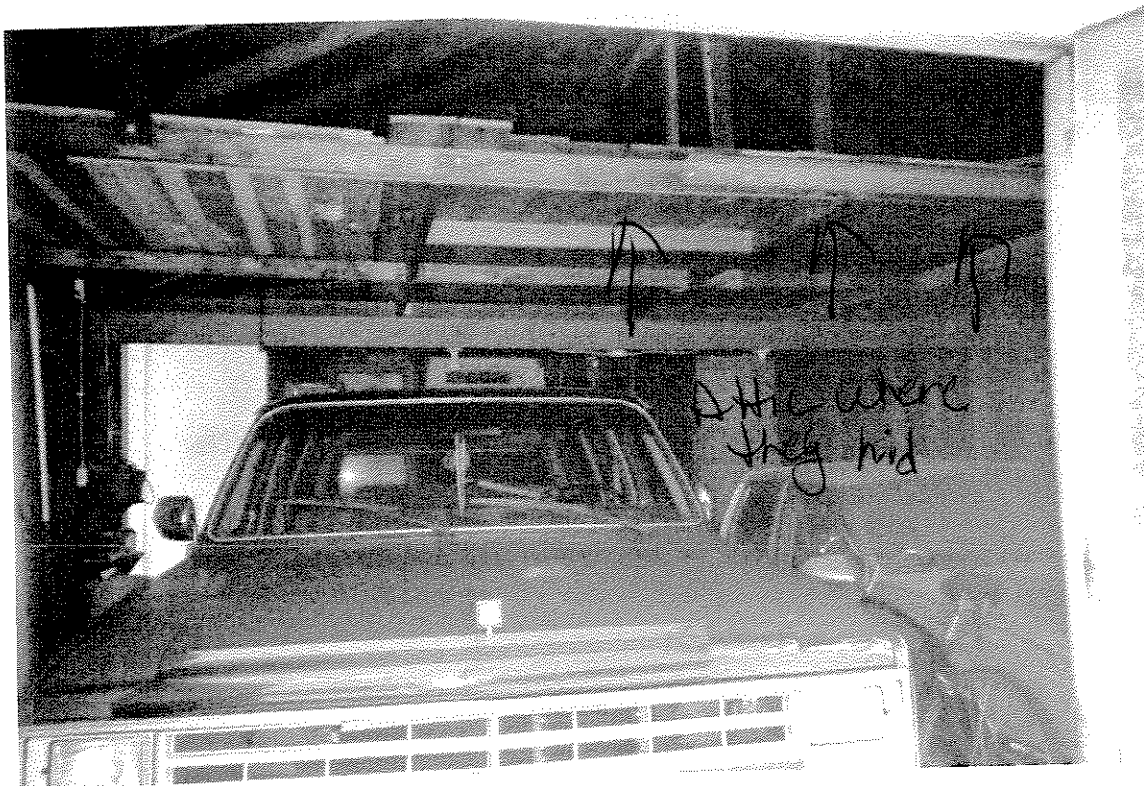
I personally feel your officers were very negligent because of the fact that they were very casual about the circumstance, and that they seemed to not really care. They didn't search my garage or anywhere else surrounding

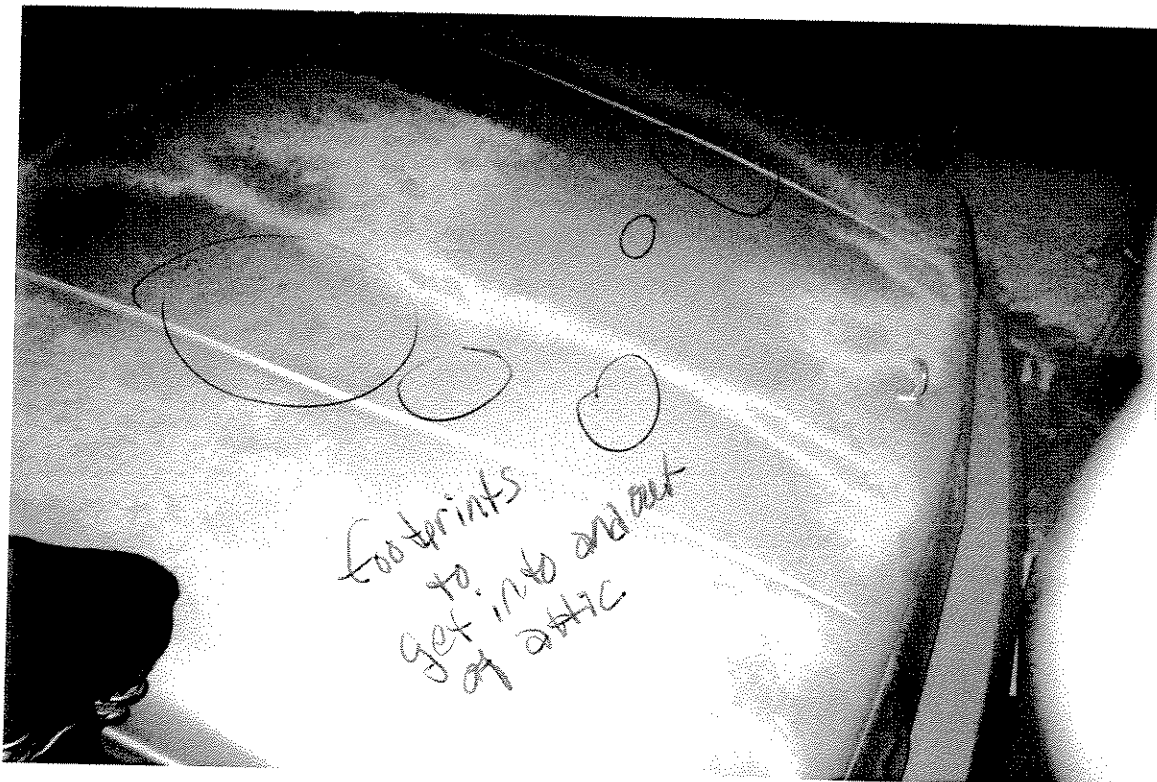
my garage. I have enclosed an estimate for the damage to my garage and feel due to your officers negligence, that you should be held liable and accountable for the items stolen from my truck. I will also include estimates to replace these items. Had your officers conducted a thorough search they not only would have caught the burglar, but would have recovered my belongings -

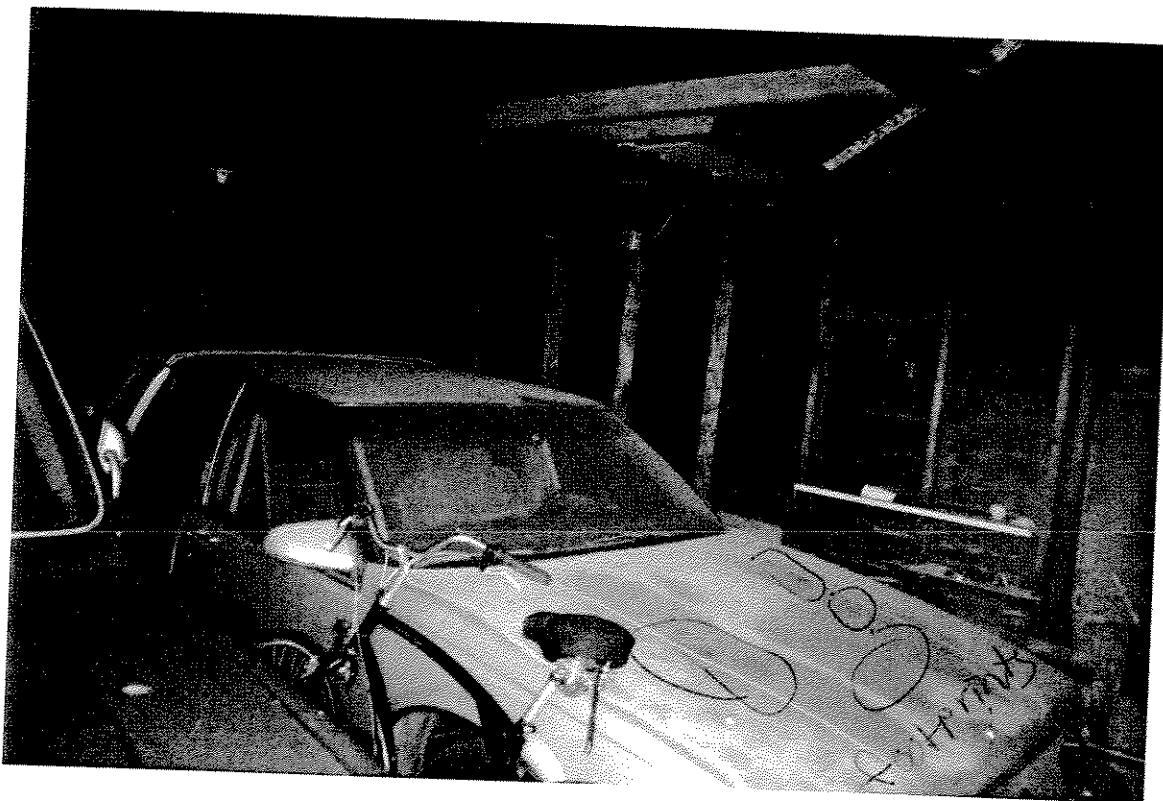
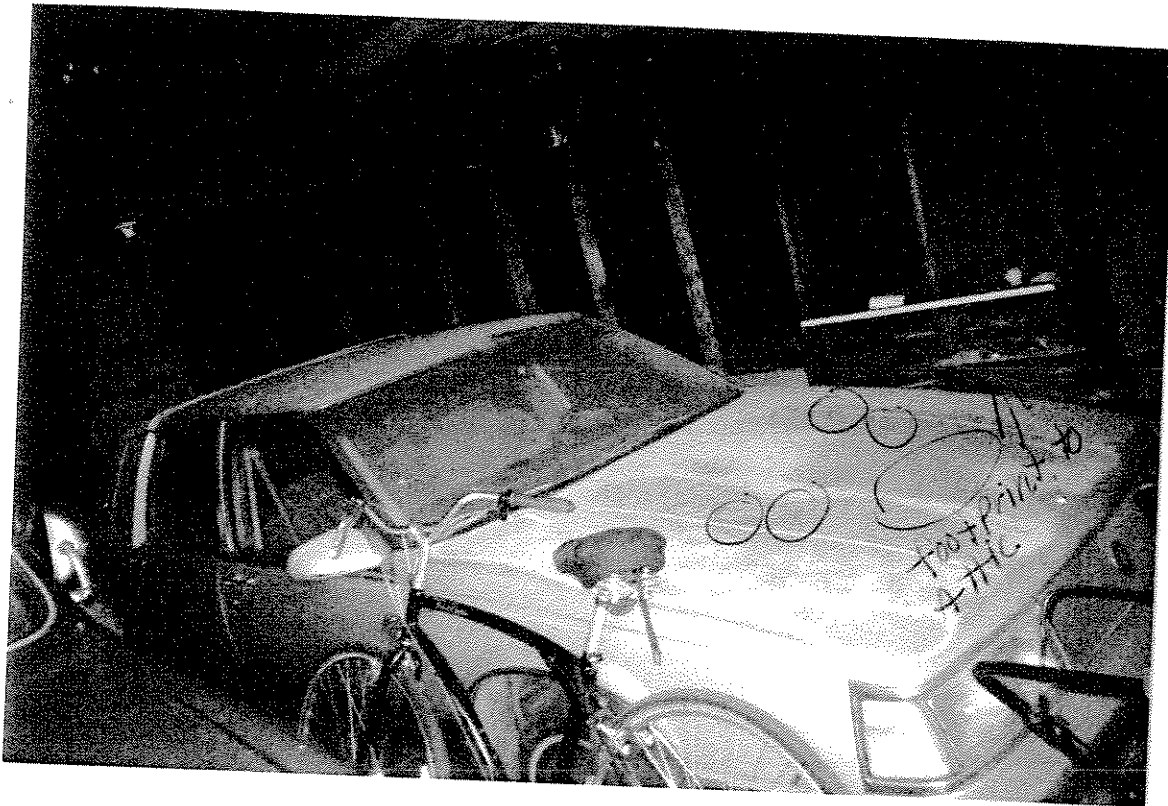

This is the letter you asked us to write in regards to the break in of our garage on 05/09/05 at the address of 3130 N 38th St. Enclosed are the "2" estimates for the stereo equipment that was taken out of our suburban truck. You also said to state that there were 50 CD's valued at approximately \$10 a piece for a total of \$500.00. Also taken was his bag which contained items he took to dialysis everyday. Those items include a Walkman Radio, blankets, a few CD's, a pair of hair clippers. Once again the reason we feel the City should pay for these items is because they never searched our garage or the area around our garage. The perpetrators were in the garage hiding in an open attic area the whole time they were here and when we locked the garage up they were locked up in it. The next day when we went to get the truck out to have the window repaired, we discovered they had kicked the lock off the door to get out. There were footprints on

the vehicle parked next to mine from the oil on the garage floor where you could see where they went up into the attic and where they came down and walked across both vehicles and sat on the hood of our truck to keep the doors open. Also enclosed are pictures of the garage doors and of the attic where they did.

In closing this letter I'd like to say that this situation could have had a devastating ending as Antonio goes to dialyses Monday, Tues, Fri, and sometimes on Sat. He leaves at 4:30 AM, but he had to go to dialyses on this morning, they could have still been in the attic when he went to get his truck out to go, because we only have 1 vehicle, and he would have had to drive his truck. They also tried to peel his steering column but he had a column lock on it and they were unsuccessful.
