NOTICE OF CLAIM

I James Johnson, pro se intend to find Milwaukee Police officer Dennis Wallich liable, negligent, and responsible for leaving a knowingly reported stolen vehicle unattended on the street whereas it was later stolen a second time. The vehicle was and is the source of evidence in a criminal investigation.

COMPLAINT

September 3, 2011 The plaintiff's Gold 1998 AUDI A6 Sedan VIN*WAUBA34B2WN164037 Plate: WI-167-PBR was stolen from Pic 'N Save on 35th and North avenue Milwaukee, Wisconsin

September 4, 2011 The plaintiff reported his vehicle Stolen Incident No: 11-218-0104. Called City tow lot.

October 31, 2011 The plaintiff's vehicle was suppose to have been recovered in good condition by officer Dennis Wallich, during a traffic stop. Suspect Lazar Burnstein was arrested, the keys was confiscated and logged in at the City of Milwaukee police property located at 27th street and Wisconsin avenue. The vehicle was left ~~on~~ the street. Officer Wallich notified the City ^{to} not to authorize a tow then I was notified later by phone.

The plaintiff immediately went to the confirmed location being 1827 West Hopkins street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The vehicle was not there, nor was there any signs that the vehicle was ever there, as I questioned occupants at the above address.

The plaintiff proceeded to the City police property and retrieved the keys and papers. Then returned to the 1800 block and surrounding blocks of West Hopkins street anticipating that the alarm remote will activate the alarm to make noise with the panic button; if the vehicle was in range.

That idea was unsuccessful.

November 1, 2011 The plaintiff reported vehicle stolen for the second time Incident No: 11-248-0104 Officer Wallich stated that he did not know where the vehicle was, but an arrest was

made, so it's not logical to leave the evidence on the street.

The plaintiff called the City tow lot every other day to locate his car. I also called officer Wallich many times, requesting information on the vehicle. Plaintiff contacted Department of Motor Vehicle, North Shore AUDI, and International Autos Dealership to confirm that no extra keys were made.

February 22, 2012 The plaintiff called Milwaukee Police District No. 3 just to request the status of the vehicle. I was told that the vehicle was recovered in Zion, Illinois by Zion police Department.

The plaintiff was given a Zion police contact number (847) 872-8000. Then the Zion, Illinois City tow lot number; Roger Towing (847) 872-2707. The tow lot personale stated that the vehicle was drivable but minor front end damage.


The plaintiff drove from Jackson, Mississippi; to Zion Illinois (900 miles) all to see a vehicle stripped of doors, hood, trunk, sunroof, TVs, \$2,000 sound system, lights, seats, wheels, even the carpet. \$5,000 mechanical tools.

I really would like to know how did this good condition vehicle slip out of the hands of Milwaukee police during a traffic stop, no keys, suspect arrested and the
