1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The Milwaukee Nurse-Family Partnership Program is an intensive home visiting program in which Public Health Nurses provide education, resources, and support to first time pregnant women and their children who reside in Zip codes 53204 and 53212. Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) is an evidenced program used in 290 municipalities in 22 other states. Research conducted on the NFP service delivery model, are improved health, well being and self sufficiency of at-risk low-income parents and their children.

The MHD Center for Health Equity is expected to address health disparities in Milwaukee by working far "upstream" of most medical and even many standard public health interventions. The Center's expected outcomes include the development of a "dashboard" of health indicators in Milwaukee showing clear existing links to poverty, race, and other social and economic factors that influence health, internal coordination of MHD programming to focus on disparities, and increasing awareness and resolve among community leaders and the general public regarding health disparities in Milwaukee.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

This program meets the strategic goal of addressing disparity in birth outcomes and also the reduction of infant mortality.
