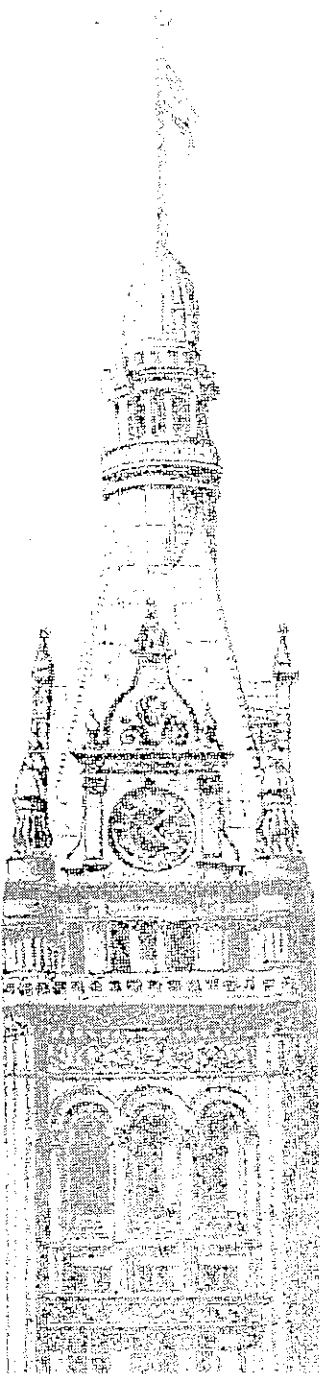

Dear Resident:

This letter is to notify you that the renewal application for a hotel/motel license for Economy Inn at 7284 W. Appleton Ave. will be heard by the Licenses Committee on May 28th at 2:30 p.m. in Room 301-B of Milwaukee City Hall. Milwaukee City Hall is located at 200 E. Wells St.

There is an objection to renewal from the Department of Neighborhood Services, which includes a report from the Milwaukee Police Department. A copy of this objection may be found at www.city.milwaukee.gov under council file 080086. The local alderman and neighbors may also be present to testify and their objections include racing and loud vehicles, loud music and noise, loitering, littering, illegal drug activity, prostitution, performance of illicit acts and vulgar behavior, cruising, fighting, drunkenness, public urination, trespassing, vandalism, damage to private property, parking on private property, disturbing the peace, causing the normal flow of traffic on roadways to be impeded, excessive and inappropriate use of police resources, neighborhood problems due to mismanagement, endangering safety by exceeding capacity, shootings and gunshots, premises is operated in such a manner that it causes a public nuisance and a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety, convenience, or property interests of the neighborhood, and conduct by the residents or guests of licensed premises has had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety, convenience or property interests of the neighborhood.

Testimony must be limited to items contained in the Department objection, the police report or to items listed above that may be



testified to by the alderman or the neighbors. Feel free to call
