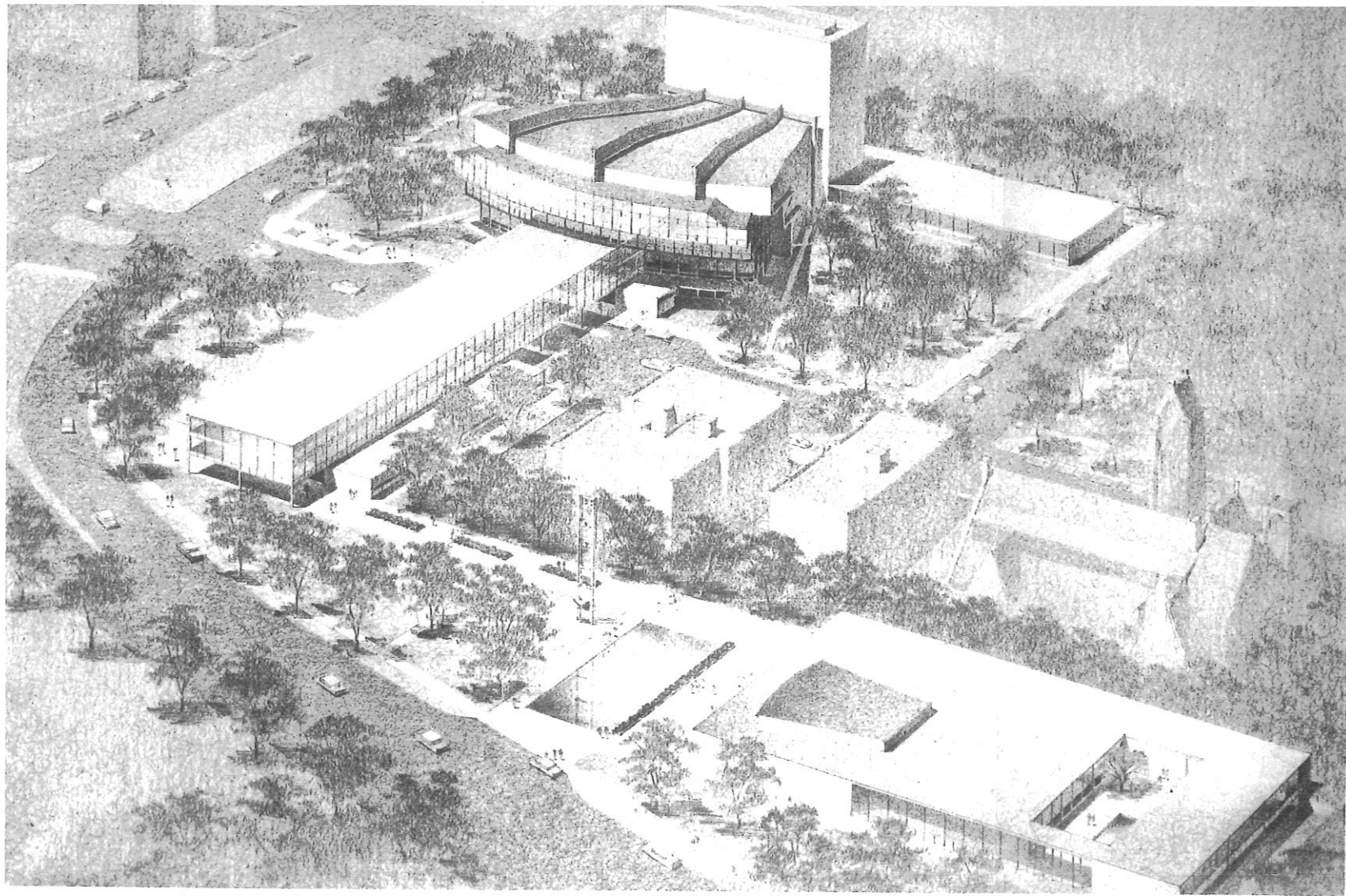

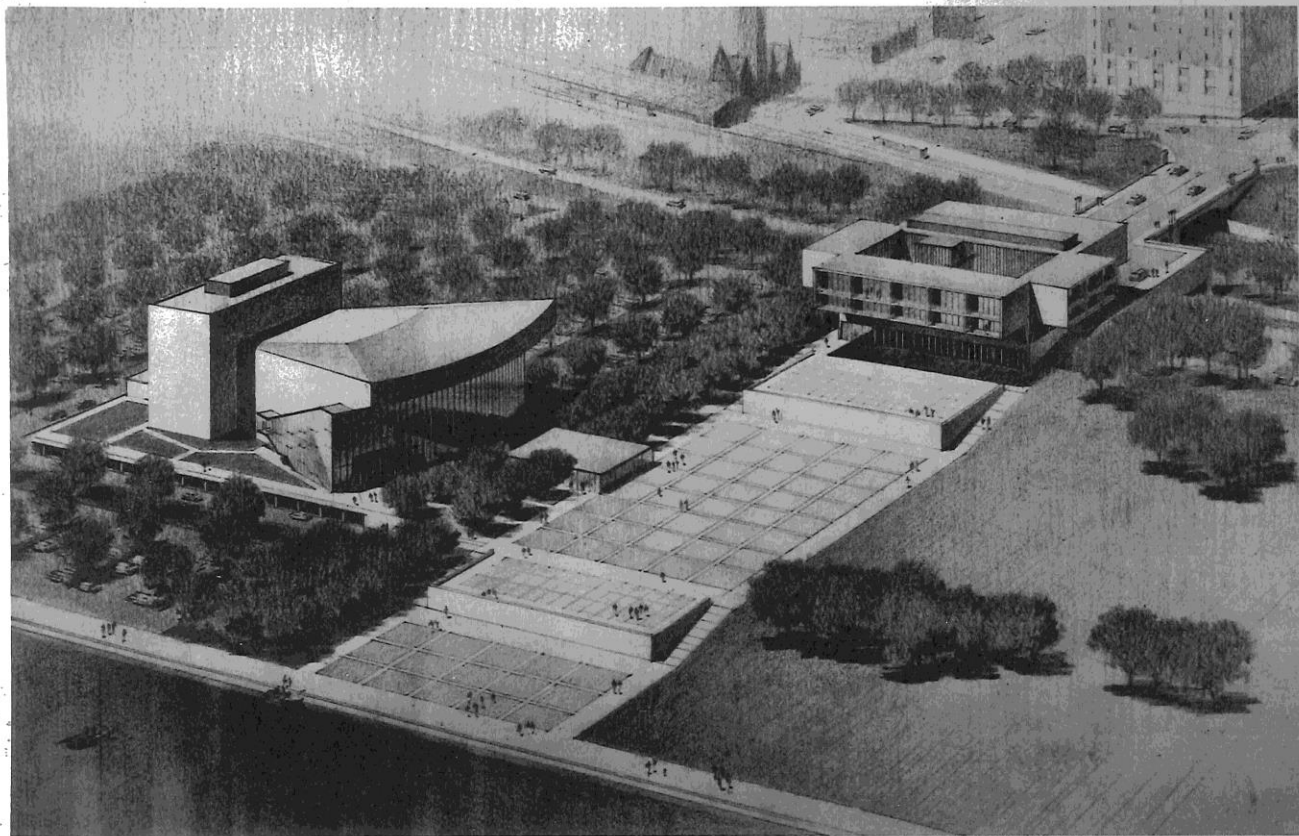
SITE PLAN SKETCHES of the WAR MEMORIAL BUILDINGS located in the MEMORIAL PARK

The original lakefront proposal showing the veterans building, the art museum and the performing arts building.

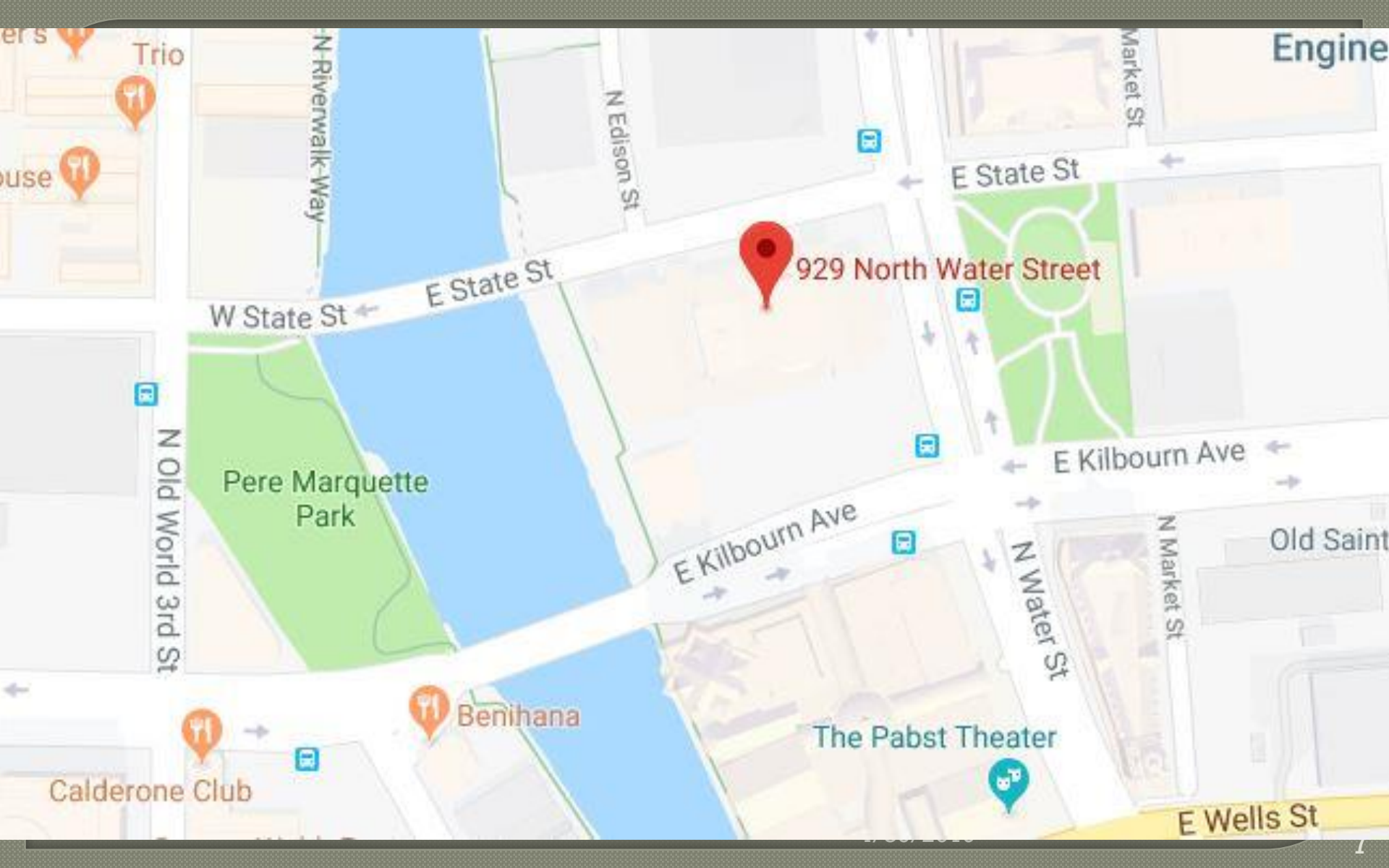

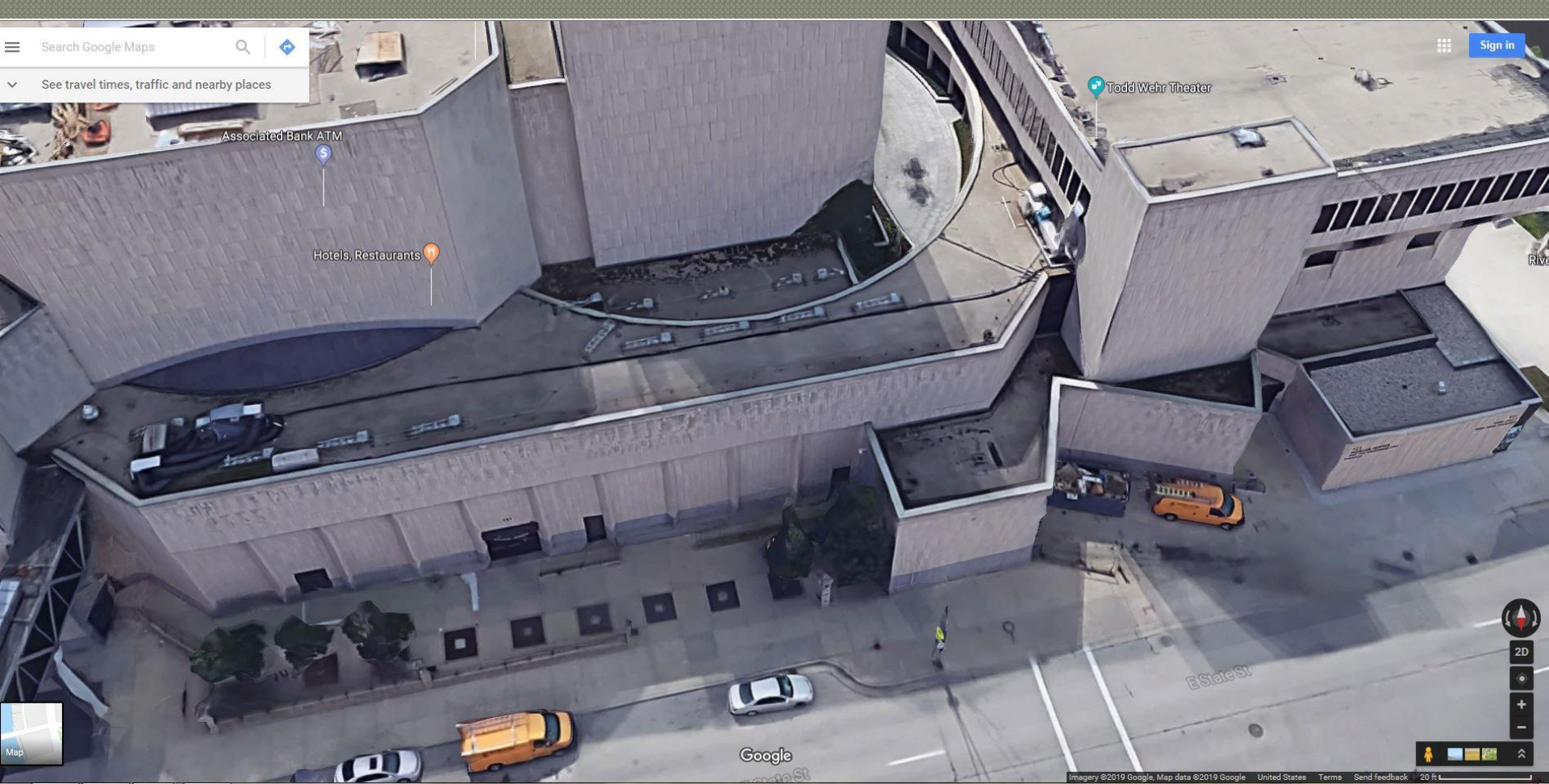


THESE ARE ALL ON SOUTH ELEVATION

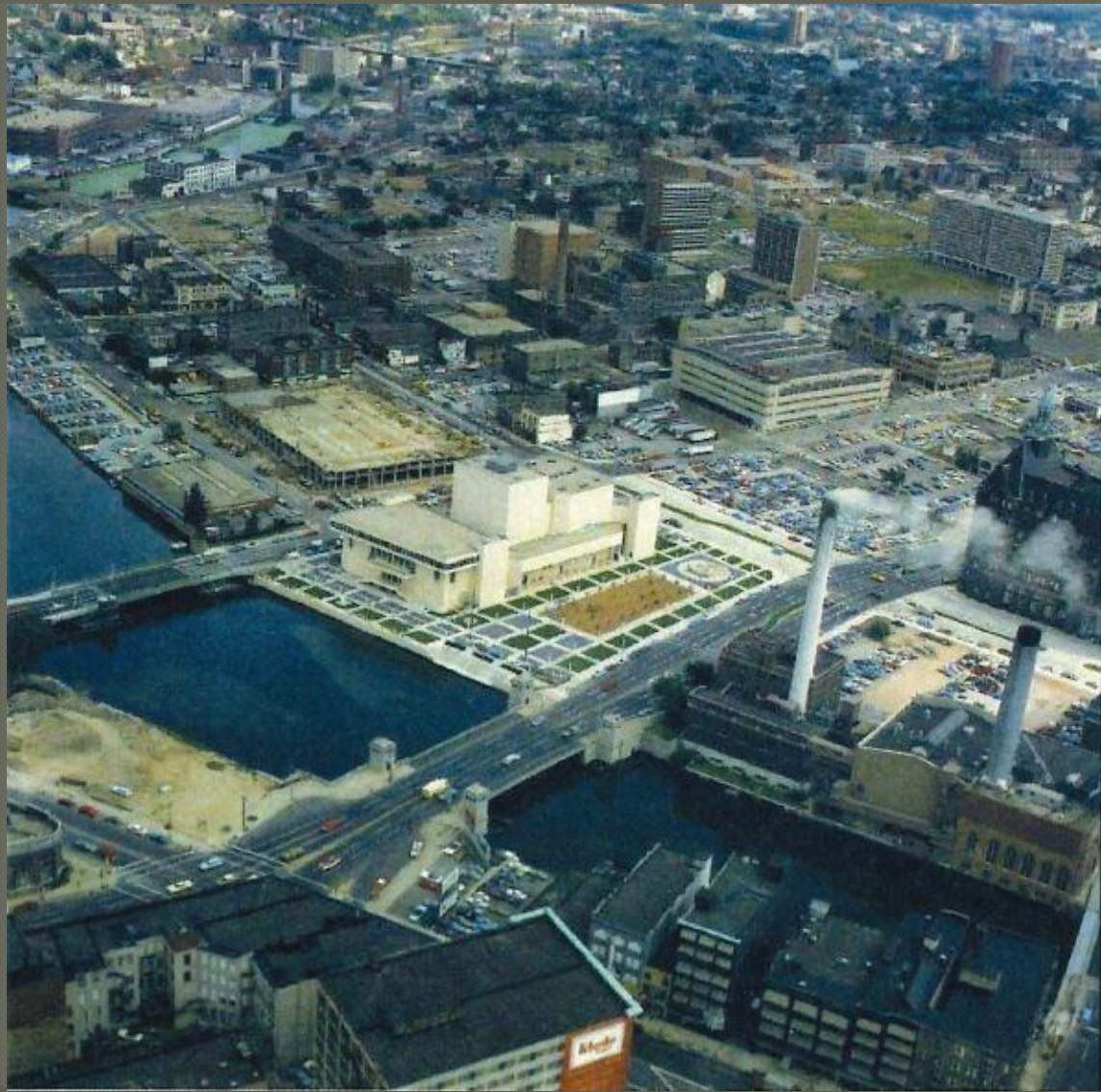

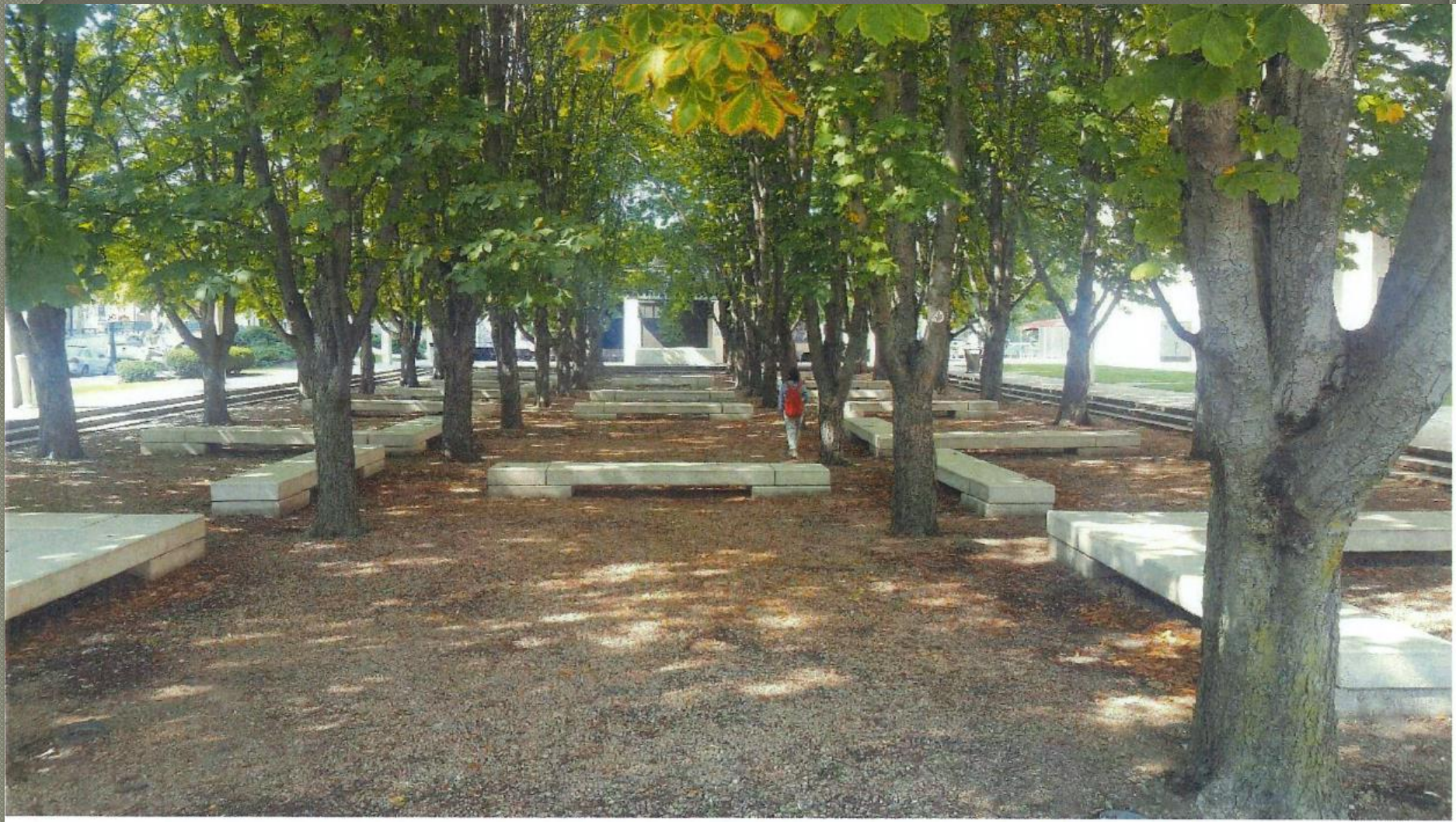
THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY WAR MEMORIAL CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS - PLANTING PLAN

LAUREATE. Sculptor Seymour Lipton. 1969. Donated by Mrs. Harry Bradley after Allen Bradley Corp. donated \$625,000 in honor of her husband



TRIGON. Sculptor Allen Ditson. In honor of Ida and A.P. Rosenberg by their daughters in 1970

RIVER WALKWAY. Built with \$275,000 donation from First National Bank



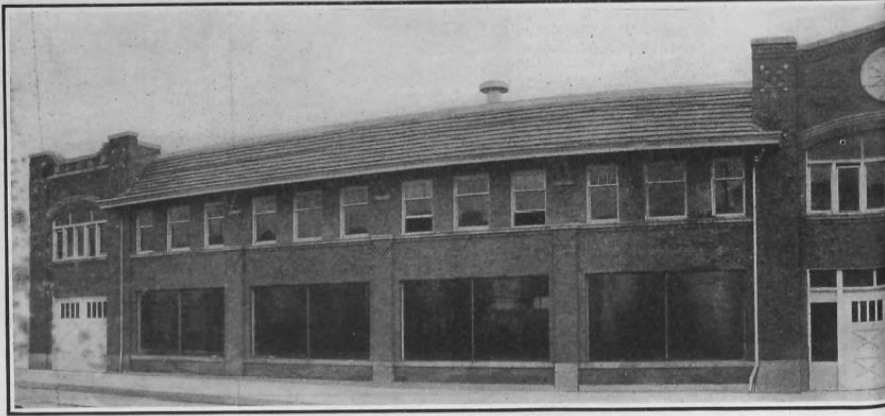

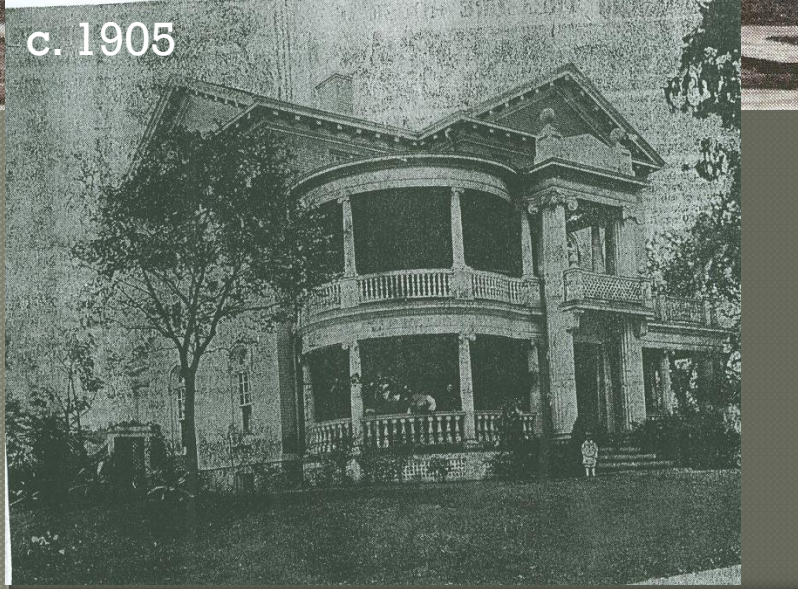

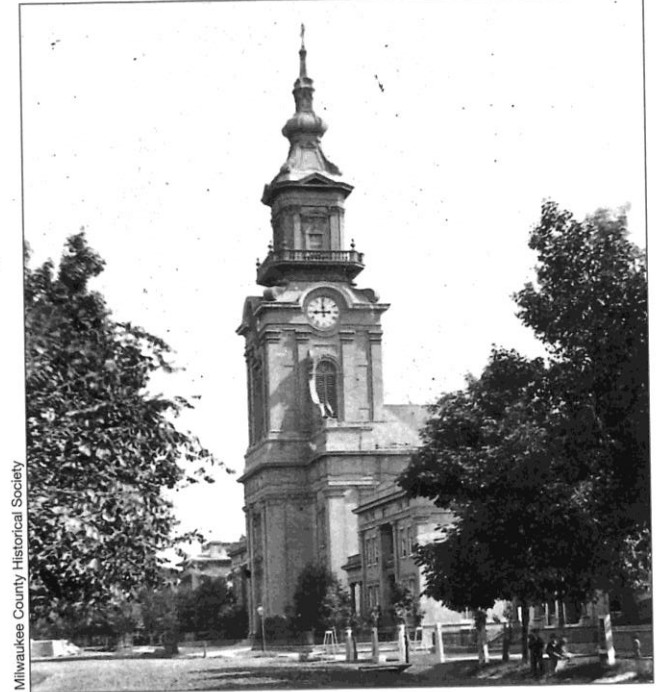

MEETS THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA OF THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION ORDINANCE:

1. E-1--Its exemplification of the development of the cultural, economic, social or historic heritage of the City of Milwaukee, State of Wisconsin or the United States
2. E-5—Its embodiment of distinguishing characteristics of an architectural type or specimen
3. E-6—Its identification as the work of an artist, architect, craftsman or master builder whose individual works have influenced the development of the city
4. E-9—Its unique location as a singular physical characteristic which represents an established and familiar visual feature of a neighborhood, community or the city
