	Items Recommended to Retain:
1	Amend Wis. Stat. § 346.94(tp) to prohibit the stopping of motor vehicles for purposes of soliciting prostitutes in violation of Wis. Stats. § 944.32 or § 948.08.
2	Allocate a greater share of the State's Transportation Fund to local transportation projects. (CC#140770)
3	Minimize the impact of the I-94 East-West corridor reconstruction project on city neighborhoods and tax base.
4	Allow a municipality to create a municipal fee for lead abatement and exempt the proceeds of that fee from expenditure restraint and levy limits. (CC#161073)
5	Amend Wis. Stat. § 341.35 to allow municipalities to charge the motor vehicle registration fee to vehicles weighing greater than 8,000 pounds.
6	Amend Wis. Stat. § 66.0602 to create an exemption from property tax levy limits for costs arising from an approval by the Public Service Commission of We Energies' rate requests. (CC#140699)
7	Amend Wis. Stats. § 79.05 and § 66.0602 to exclude local expenditure increases related to a successful referendum from budget calculations used to determine expenditure restraint payments. (CC#160519)

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8	Amend Wis. Stat. § 66.1109 to allow for multijurisdictional Business Improvement Districts.
9	Amend Wis. Stat. § 119.61 to restore local control over the Milwaukee Public Schools Real Estate sales process.
10	Amend Wis. Stat. § 234.621 to raise the income threshold to \$30,000 for the WHEDA Property Tax Deferral Loan Program and to increase funding for the program. (CC#050275)
11	Seek additional state funding for traffic safety enforcement and amend Wis Stat. 346.60 to allow an increase in fines for speeding (CC#161606) and (#040889)
12	Amend Wis. Stat. § 167.10 to prohibit the possession and use of fireworks statewide, to strengthen state law for permitting of fireworks granted by the state or any local jurisdiction, to establish a penalty for fireworks violation and straw purchase and to establish enforcement jurisdiction where a violation occurs. (CC#070741) and (#190580)
13	Amend Wis. Stats. Ch. 218 and Ch. 180 to provide uniform statewide solid waste regulatory reform for dealing in discarded, salvageable and recyclable materials. (CC#111628)
14	Amend Wis. Stat. § 125.68(3) to prohibit Class A and B liquor licenses within 300 feet of a day care center. (CC#081575)
15	Amend Wis. Stat. § 134.65(2)(b) to authorize adoption of reasonable health, safety and welfare standards for issuance, renewal, nonrenewal, suspension and revocation of a tobacco license, including overconcentration and other adverse neighborhood effects. (CC#120216)

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16	Amend Wis. Stat. Chs. 256, 450, & 961 to address the objections and concerns identified by the Police and Fire Departments regarding the health and safety of individuals suffering from overdose or misuse of prescription and controlled substances (heroin). (CC#131005)
17	Conduct immediate and thorough inspections by state and federal regulators of the railroad tracks, crossings and bridges on which Bakken crude oil is carried through Milwaukee. (CC#150076)
18	Amend Wis. Stat. §344.65 (1) and (2) to increase penalties for motorists who operate vehicles without the State minimum liability insurance. (CC#180853)
19	Support legislation for the reduction of poverty in the State, including reforming the EITC, funding transitional jobs, a higher minimum wage and a tax credit for seniors and adults with disabilities as a means of strengthening support for Community Advocates poverty reduction plan. (CC#131304)
20	Amend Wis. Stat. § 71.54 to provide an annual inflationary adjustment to the Homestead Property Tax Credit Program retroactive to 2001 and to provide future annual inflation adjustments. (CC#050275)
21	Prohibit the use of financial incentives to recruit students for enrollment at charter and choice schools. (CC#141047)
22	Seek introduction and passage of legislation that decreases the ages at which young people are eligible for certain types of employment. (CC#171046)
23	Secure state funding to facilitate a locally-driven community policing model enabling the creation of Community Oriented Policing (COP) houses. (CC#170816)
24	Advocate for expungement reform as recommended by the Wisconsin Policy Forum report, <u>A Fresh Start</u> .

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25	Change State law to restore the right of felons to vote, change information required on voter registration forms and voting procedure for persons who are convicted of felonies. (CC# 191090)
26	Amend Wis. Stat. §62.50 to allow suspension of police officers charged with serious felonies without pay, and amend Wis. Stat. §175.47 to require outside investigations of all officer-involved deaths. (CC#200197)
27	Support Governor Tony Evers and Lieutenant Governor Mandela Barnes’s policing accountability and transparency reforms in LRB nos. 6273, 6274, 6275, 6276, 6277 6281,6283, 6289, and 6292. (CC#200317)
28	Allow municipalities to obtain workplace and other data that would help facilitate debt collection. (CC#160845)
29	Seek introduction and passage of legislation that directs the State Legislature to employ bi-partisan redistricting of state legislative boundaries as sought by the plaintiffs in William Whitford, et. al. v. Beverly R. Gill, et. al. (CC#161757)
30	Seek passage of state legislation to provide for voting pre-registration of 16- and 17-year-olds. (CC#180474)
31	Seek passage of state legislation to provide for universal voter registration.(CC#180474)
32	Seek introduction and passage of State legislation making domestic partners of City of Milwaukee employees and their dependent children eligible for all City benefit programs for which spouses of City employees are eligible. (CC#181643)

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33	Seek introduction and passage of state legislation that requires mandatory, periodic, and uniform testing for the presence of lead in the water of all State-licensed child care facilities and all schools (public, private, and charter). (CC#161645)
34	Seek introduction and passage of state legislation relating to energy procurement regulations, including reverse energy auctions. (CC#131809)
35	Amend Wis. Stat. § 940.208 to make an assault on any city employee who is providing service in a city-owned facility or is working in his/her official capacity a felony. (CC#190238)
36	Create Wis. Stat. § 346 to allow for the use of Automated Traffic Enforcement Cameras for the purpose of speed, red light running and accident reduction at certain qualifying intersections.
37	Amend Wis. Stat. Ch. 50 to require community notification and the formation of community advisory committee regulations for all adult family homes.(CC#151381)
