Hi Andrew,

Thank you! Okay, the thought was to use treated lumber for the visible elements and then stain it. But we can update to untreated pine for the visible elements and will still stain if needed.

We were planning on 4 inch spacing of the spindles to follow code regulations, but we can update according to the document you sent to be 3.5 inches center to center if needed. The top railing would be thick and molded and the bottom railing would be 1.5 inches thick similar to the one attached image.

Let us know what you think and if there is anything else you need. Thanks, Isabella

Isabella,

Thanks for the application and scope of work. A few items with the proposal – we can approve pressure treated lumber for the structural elements (stringers, framing) but the visible elements (rails, spindles, decking, posts, etc) will need to be untreated lumber. Generally cedar is used. We will also need to know the spacing for the spindles and design of the rails and post cap. Plain 2x4 lumber would not be approved for rails. I've attached some examples from our *Living With History* chapter on porches. The porch would need to be stained or painted following installation, no bare wood would be allowed. No issues with the concrete steps.
