File #030558 is a resolution authorizing the expenditure of funds to update the City of Milwaukee's Purchasing Power Profiles. (DCD)

#### **Background**

- 1. In 2000, a partnership between the Neighborhood Improvement Development Corporation ("NIDC") and the Helen Bader Foundation expanded to include the Department of City Development and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Employment and Training Institute ("UWM-EIT").
- 2. In 2000, while an agency under the Department of Neighborhood Services, NIDC applied for and was awarded a \$29,000 grant from the Helen Bader foundation to undertake an Asset Mapping Project ("AMP").
- 3. The goal of the AMP was to:
  - Detail purchasing power
  - Generate a demographic profile for each of approximately 50 commercial districts and adjacent residential areas
  - Create databases for the City by geographic level for income, expenditure, housing, and other variables
  - Create an interactive mapping on the internet
  - Present accurate analyses of neighborhood assets
  - Confront damaging and distorting images of Milwaukee's central city
- 4. To qualify for \$25,000 in City assistance, the NIDC provided evidence of receiving the total \$54,000 AMP grant along with a reimbursement request in the amount of \$25,000 to the DCD, which was authorized to front the \$25,000 match through the Advanced Planning Fund via Council Resolution 001178.

## **Discussion**

- 1. In 2001, a profile project outcome was widely criticized for its depiction of some consumers in central city zip codes as it relates to spending habits based on racial profiles.
- 2. Accordingly, DCD and private investors will use the data for recruiting and supporting neighborhood commercial development.
- 3. DCD plans include updating profile information, which is approximately 3-4 years old, and expanding the profile series to include Waukesha, Ozaukee, Racine, Washington, and Kenosha counties.
- 4. The cost is estimated at \$10,000. The funds will be partially used to train 1 or more DCD staff to internally update future profiles.

## **Fiscal Impact**

This resolution authorizes the transfer and expenditure of \$10,000 from the Economic Development Fund to the Consulting Services Sub-account 634001, for the purpose of entering into a Planning Study Agreement with the UWM-ETI to update and expand the geographic coverage of the current "Purchasing Power Profiles".
