Dear Alderperson,

I'm a member of Enough is Enough ~ A Legacy for Erin. ENE (Enough is Enough) was created after Erin Mogensen and her unborn child who were killed in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin by a driver speeding and driving recklessly **AFTER police stopped pursuing him while driving a stolen car.**

We are a non-profit, 501c3 that has chosen to focus primarily on Judicial Accountability in Milwaukee County. At any given time, for the past two years, we are tracking, monitoring and attending (over 1,000) cases for Fleeing a Police Officer and/or Recklessly Endangering Safety while driving.

In a program we call, "Court Watch" we advocate for District Attorneys and Judges to hold individuals **breaking the law** ACCOUNTABLE for their actions and to protect the Community from the perpetrator. I personally have attended over 100 hearings (spending hundreds of hours in our Courtrooms) and as a law abiding and tax paying citizen I have learned how inefficient, expensive (without positive results) and unaccountable our Judicial system is in Milwaukee County.

I have yet to attend a hearing in which a defendant fled from Police because he/she was NOT breaking the law. Whether it is illegal guns, drugs, stolen property, stolen vehicles and/or bail jumping. Most alarming to me is that many of the charges for illegal guns, drugs, stolen property and vehicles are often "Dismissed but Read in" for the purposes of expediting cases in the Judicial system. **That is the Judicial system failing the Community not the MPD and their policies!**

In all of our research, communication and participation with members of the Milwaukee Police Department...**they are working hard to do their jobs, enforce our laws and doing their best to keep the Community safe.**

The city of Milwaukee (per Milwaukee County's Vision Zero website) had 16,300 crashes in 2025. After adjusting for population, the city of Milwaukee had 49.31% of the Stolen Vehicle Crashes and 23.09% of the Hit/Runs Crashes **in all of Milwaukee County.**

As our largest city, Milwaukee is where people live, work and play. If we do not get control of the guns, drugs, stolen vehicles and reckless driving many individuals will avoid the city going forward.

The Milwaukee Police Department needs the ability to pursue individuals breaking the law to combat these crimes.
