# Introduction

- From the beginning, sister cities relationship ushered in a phase of planning and design for the implementation framework for the partnership. Upon the signing the County government of Bomet focused on unpacking the requirements in the partnership with a view of developing a workable activity plan and expanding the partnership network both locally and internationally.
- The Sister City Program, administered by Sister Cities International®, was initiated by the President of the United States of America in 1956 to encourage greater friendship and understanding between the United States and other nations through direct personal contact. As part of promoting this program, the City of Milwaukee in USA and the County Government of Bomet in Kenya entered into a partnership agreement on the 21st of July 2015. Tom Barrett- Mayor of Milwaukee and H.E Hon. Isaac Ruto, EGH signed the partnership. Bomet County and Milwaukee share a common interest in areas of education, health, culture and business and the desire mutual understanding among its citizens. The people of Milwaukee and Bomet County in a gesture of friendship and goodwill, agreed to collaborate for the mutual benefit of their communities by exploring educational, economic and cultural opportunities; and agreed to support and encourage opportunities for mutually beneficial practical exchanges in the fields of business, culture, health care, education and tourism.

4. Modern eye clinic unit

### 2. Longisa Hospital-Bomet still need medical equipments such as mammogram machines for early detection of breast cancer.

### 3. Training of healthcare and medical professionals including doctors and nurses. Such partnership with the Medical College of Wisconsin is on hold due to the Covid-19 Pandemic.

# Strengthening Resource Mobilization and Investment Unit

- To leverage resource and tap on available opportunities, the County Government of Bomet has developed a detailed investment handbook that captures on the sister city relationship. The handbook provides detailed highlights on investment opportunities within the county and mechanisms for engagement. Once the handbook is launched by H.E Hon Governor, it will be shared with the City of Milwaukee as a tool for fundraising for the projects.

# Tea export

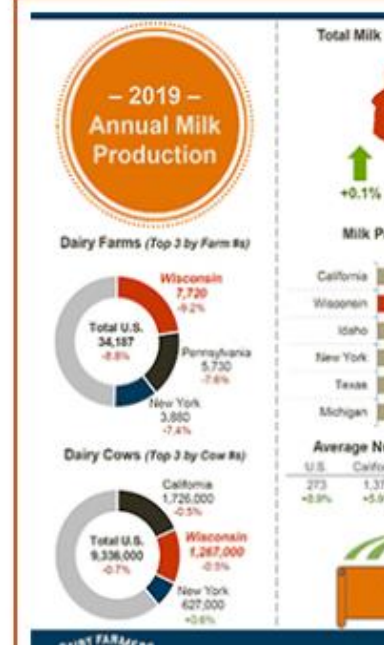
- Training Farmers in Agriculture has improved the quality of tea production.
