The grant project will essentially charge tavern owners and customers using the service for transportation back home. The grant will help set up the project, allow for some social marketing and administration costs. The project will involve a community coalition, oversight committee, fiscal monitoring body and a program coordinator. The program will have a six-month set up period and a twelve month operational plan. It is projected that 8400 rides will be provided. The project area will be the Southside, District 13, by the airport (Howell Ave/Morgan Ave/Oklahoma Ave.). The project will involve 16 taverns and a limo service. The intent of the grant by DOT is to keep drunk drivers off the streets. It is intended to deal with the behavior modification of not driving when you drink. 2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives: The grant aligns itself to our Healthy Behaviors Division goals concerning mental health, AODA recovery and injury prevention. Behavior modification is key to reducing the accidents caused by drunk driving. 3.
