Proceedings had and testimony given in the above-entitled matter, before the UTILITIES & LICENSES COMMITTEE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE, on the 31st day of May, 2005, reported by Donna Gulczynski of Milwaukee Reporters Associated, Inc.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Neighborhood Services?
MR. KAUFMAN: No objection.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Sergeant Ulickey?

SERGEANT ULICKEY: On March 19th of '04 at six p.m., two underage police aides under the direction of police officers purchased beer from the applicant without showing I.D. He was subsequently found guilty and fined \$152.

And on 3/30 of '05 at 3:38 a.m., officers were investigating a cutting complaint at West Allis Memorial Hospital, and that investigation revealed that a patron of the bar was attacked and cut by a person in the parking lot of the tavern after closing time, and a suspect was arrested in that incident.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Mr. Amann, do you have any questions of the police report?

MR. AMANN: No, I don't.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Any comments on it?

MR. AMANN: The minor was -- I was working that day, and yes, I was at fault, and that was my first offense in three or four years. And yes, I was at fault.

The next one with the cutting, it happened at three in the morning, and the bar closes at two, and there was no charges filed, I understand. So what

we're doing now is we have somebody outside working security, -- not security, but mostly for watching people coming in and leaving for noise or protection, you know.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you. Could I see a show of hands? Is there anyone here to testify on 9131 West Beloit Road? Would you come forward, please, sir?

(Whereupon Mr. Janson was sworn under oath.)

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Your name and address

for the record?

MR. JANSON: My name is Frank Janson. The address is 2817 Jacqueline Drive, Waukesha.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And are you here in support or opposition?

MR. JANSON: In opposition or caution.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Could you tell us what your testimony is?

MR. JANSON: I'm the property manager of the next-door building, and I had a tenant leave because of loud noise, and I think you were the alderman that was involved in it. The owner contacted the alderman about problems that there were. I think it's gotten better because he received a letter about the liquor license coming up, but it's just a caution that it

The noise complaints from the previous tenant were the doors were open after 10, and I mean if the bar's open till two, people in that building really are right next to it, and the loud bass in the building is -- I don't know if you lowered it down, MR. JANSON: But I just want to make sure that it doesn't reoccur and spread up. I don't know if you can put a caution on the liquor license or like Okay. What sort of CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Apartments? MR. JANSON: Rental units for Landl One. CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: How many units? MR. JANSON: There's 24 units in one building, so there's 48 units that I manage in the complex which are right next to Beloit Road.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Puente.

25	would like Miss Elmer to pass out a letter that I

sent Mr. Amann, and a letter that I received from his employer, Miss Palmer. I would ask that they be entered into the record.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Dudzik moves to make the police report a part of the permanent record in this matter. Hearing no objection, so ordered.

Alderman Dudzik moves to make this letter dated November 29th, 2004 from his office a part of the record. Hearing no objection, so ordered.

And Alderman Dudzik moves to make this copy of a fax that's dated March 29th, 2005 from Landl One, LLC to his office part of the permanent record in this matter. Hearing no objection, so ordered. This fax is a cover page and then two typewritten pages. Hearing no objection to that, so ordered.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Mr. Chairman?

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Dudzik.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Mr. Amann, on more than one occasion you've observed me at your establishment?

MR. AMANN: Yes.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Accompanied by my wife, frequently?

MR. AMANN: Yes.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: On more than one occasion

I've been at your establishment and have indicated to you or your staff that the music is too loud. We can hear it 50, 60 feet away easy. I just want to make it very clear that I have been working with you and Miss Palmer to try to iron out this problem.

You do have a situation where your business is very close to her apartment, so I do realize it makes it difficult, and I know in conversations that I've had with you that you're making attempts, but I want to make it very clear to you here and now that if that continues, you do jeopardize your license at some point in the future.

MR. AMANN: I understand.

ALDERMAN DUDZIK: Thank you very much.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Any other questions by members of the committee? Anything in closing to say, Mr. Amann?

MR. AMANN: No, no. I think we covered most of it. But as far as with the tenant, we put a sign out that says, "No motorcycles in the parking lot, only on the street." We put out a sign, also, "Please respect our neighbors." So we're -- If I could give you my phone number, --
