2020 Budget reflects a 31% increase in Port expenses and revenue

Driven primarily by changes in special fund accounts

2020 Budget Overview

- Increase in expenses matched by increase in revenue
 - Reinvestment in Port infrastructure
 - Continued financial support through General Fund transfer
- \$571,000 increase in Special Fund accounts
 - Previous budgets focused on smaller projects, repairs over time
 - 2020 plan focuses on larger deferred maintenance projects
 - Includes demolition, roof repair and replacement, and site preparation
 - Infrastructure strategy to expand Port domestic and international customer base
- Milwaukee World Festival transfer to General Fund
 - \$2.5 Million in 2020
 - Substantial lease payment every 5th year (2020, 2025, 2030, etc.)
 - 2019-2020 Total Increase: \$971,000

Port Revenues

- 2020 budgeted revenues total nearly \$6.5 Million
- Port operating revenue (\$3.9M) is generated by:
 - Tenant Leases & Agreements: \$2.12M / 53.49%
 - Cargo Tonnage/Wharfage & Passenger Fee Revenue: \$750K / 18.9%
 - Includes cruise ships and Lake Express ferry service
 - Docked Vessel Revenue: \$452K / 11.41%
 - Billable Port services: \$375K / 9.46%
 - Other: \$266K / 6.75%


2020 Capital Projects

- Roadway Paving \$200,000
 - Overdue paving work on Jones Island
- Rail Track Upgrades \$275,000
 - Improvements to address safety and service load requirements
 - Ongoing improvements make the Port more attractive to potential intermodal tenants and enhance its competitive advantages
- Pier, Berth, and Channel Improvements Funded with Carryover
 - Ongoing maintenance and improvements to the City's heavy lift dock, mooring basin, and the outer harbor
 - The State Department of Transportation provides 80% of the cost associated with this program
 - In 2020 this program will be supported using existing capital balances

General Cargo & Steel	175,407	97,973	121,109 (24% increase)	Robust international steel imports (despite tariff environment); first-time general cargoes at Port Milwaukee (e.g. lumber)
Liquid Cargo	81,359	46,647	34,008 (27% decrease)	Late start to the tug/barge season; optimism about late-season surge through HwyH2O toll benefit award
Grain (COFCO)	239,352	168,413	57,478 (66% decrease)	Significant decrease in export of Wisconsin-grown corn (due to international tariffs); Wisconsin soy "okay"
Port Milwaukee	1,753,828	1,182,309	1,501,699 (27% increase)	Overall Port Milwaukee cargo performance remains strong.
ALL CARGO	2,393,897	1,350,722	1,559,177 (15% increase)	Overall public (Port) AND private (e.g. companies in Milwaukee Harbor) remains strong.


