File # 070209 is a resolution relative to application, acceptance, funding and expenditure of the Weinhardt Computerized HIV Intervention Grant from the Medical College of Wisconsin.

Background

- 1. This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) to apply for, accept and fund the Weinhardt Computerized HIV Intervention Grant project from the Medical College of Wisconsin.
- 2. This is a continuing grant supporting research sponsored by Dr. Lance S. Weinhardt, PhD, of the Medical College of Wisconsin's Center for AIDS Intervention Research (CAIR).

Discussion

- 1. The purpose of the project is to assess the effectiveness of HIV risk reduction counseling delivered by a computer.
- 2. This research project provides an opportunity for clients accessing services for sexually transmitted diseases at the MHD Keenan Central Health Clinic to interface with a computer program in order to receive risk reduction information. Clients are compensated separately for project participation in the amount of \$157 covering an initial 2-hour interview and a 12-month follow-up.
- 3. This research study provides information for evaluation of various riskreduction counseling methods. MHD is providing the Medical College with space to conduct the study as well as access to the clinic population.
- 4. This grant encompasses the period of April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008.

Fiscal Effect

- 1. The total amount of this grant is \$93,859, entirely from the grantor. This is approximately 3.2% greater than the previous annual award.
- 2. This grant funds one existing MHD position within the STD Surveillance and Treatment Program, Nurse Practitioner, SG 670, with salary and fringe benefits.
- 3. The resolution in File #070209 authorizes the City Comptroller to commit \$93,859 grantor share funds within the Project/Grant Parent of the 2007 Special Revenue-Grant and Aid Projects Fund and to create appropriate

Special Revenue Fund-Grant and Aid Project/Grant and Project /Grant levels.

4. The resolution further authorizes the Health Department, consistent with the terms of the grant, to: expend from these budgeted amounts; enter into subcontracts and leases; to expend 2007 budgeted grants for equipment deemed necessary to the operation of the program; and to expend funds for training and out-of-town travel of departmental staff from the grant funds in 2007.

Fiscal Impact

- 1. The proposed \$93,859 in non-O&M funding will support continuation of activities and services that would not be provided absent such funding.
- 2. There is no impact on the tax levy.
