If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. 4. On 02/05/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a Theft complaint at 4024 South Howell Avenue (Jersey Pub & Grill). The caller, Scott Rick, identified himself as a bartender at the business and told police that a customer had taken a green vinyl bag containing \$2860.00 from behind the counter. Milwaukee police incident report #140360134 filed.

5. On 12/24/2014 Milwaukee police responded to an armed robbery complaint at 4024 South Howell Avenue (Jersey's Bar and Grill). Investigation revealed the business was robbed at gunpoint. Milwaukee police incident report #143580128 filed.

- 6. On 02/19/2015 Milwaukee police responded to an anonymous complaint of gambling, smoking and underage patrons at 4024 South Howell Avenue (Jersey's Pub and Grill). Officers observed no violations, but were told by the applicant that there is a card tournament at the business every Saturday. The applicant also told officers this tournament is a fund raising event for softball teams and does payout small amounts to the winners. The applicant was advised by officers not to host gambling events.
- 7. On 04/15/2015 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, was able to purchase two Miller High Life brand beers from the bartender, Scott Rick, at 4024 South Howell Avenue (Jersey's Pub and Grill). Officers informed Rick of the Respect 21 program and that forms would be sent to the bar. The applicant did not enroll in the Respect 21 program and two citations were issued on 06/25/2015.

10. On 10/19/2019 officers conducted underage tavern enforcement in District 6. An underage Police Aide attempted to gain entry to Jersey's Bar and Grill. The Police Aide was allowed entry and ordered a beer from the bartender, who asked for ID. When the Police Aide stated he did not have an ID he was told the leave the bar.

11. On 07/15/21 at 10:45pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 4024 S.

Howell Avenue. No violations were found.

12. On 02/01/22, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 4024 S. Howell Av. No violations were found.

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13. On 07/09/23 at 2:18a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a local hospital for a Battery that occurred at 4024 S. Howell Av. The victim stated they were at the bar earlier and there were patrons drinking outside of the bar, which the staff told them not to. The victim stated an argument took place between the patrons and the victim's family member. While trying to leave, the victim was attacked from behind by an unknown subject, which caused the victim multiple cuts, scratches and bruises. The officer later interviewed the General Manager who stated they were working the night of the incident, however, did not witness the incident. The GM was asked why they did not call police, to which they replied it was all over and everyone was leaving. They were advised in the future to call the police for incidents. The GM was cooperative and provided officers a flash drive from the video surveillance which depicts the incident.

#### LICENSED PREMISE REPORT

Sheremeta, Mark J 028487

This reports is written by P.O. Mark SHEREMETA, assigned to District 6 Late Shift.

On Sunday, July 09, 2023, at 2:18AM, Squad 6320 (myself in full duty uniform, equipped with BWC, and operating a marked MPD squad #545) was dispatched to St. Luke's Hospital (2900 W. Oklahoma Avenue) for a Battery complaint.

Upon arrival I spoke to the victim, Abigail M. LAIRD (W/F, 10-18-01), in ER room #24, where she was being treated for multiple facial injuries (scratches, cuts, swelling and bruising). One of the cuts on her lower lip required a stitch.

Abigail reported that she and her family were at a gathering at Jersey's Bar & Grill at 4024 S. Howell Avenue at approximately 11:30PM (07-08-23), when some unknown patrons were drinking outside in front of the bar. They were told by staff that they could not drink outside. Abigail stated that her brother, Cole R. LAIRD (W/M, 03-25-03), was upset by the patrons who were aggressive. Abigail stated that her father, Derek J. LAIRD (W/M, 03-21-72), is in some way involved with one of the bartenders, and he told Abigail and Cole to just leave, which they tried to do. Abigail stated that when they went outside to leave, one of the male stranger patrons through down a cigarette and approached Cole aggressively. Abigail stated that she got between them and said, "we're not gonna fight." Abigail stated that then two female associates of the male (a H/F, 40-50 yoa, wearing a black shirt and with curly dark hair, and a H/F, 40-50 yoa, wearing a light color shirt, with dark hair) attacked her. Abigail stated she just put her hands up to cover her face, and then fled to her home after the attack. Abigail stated that suspects fled in a white car. Abigail stated that Cole was also injured by the male and others, but he did not seek medical help. Abigail stated that she came to the hospital with her friend who was not a witness to the incident. Abigail was admitted to St. Luke's ER room #24 at 1:13AM, under the care of Dr. Michelle HIEBERT.

Abigail stated that her father likely witnessed the incident, as well as her cousin, Ella R. WYSKOCHIL (W/F, 03-21-06). I attempted to contact Ella but got no answer. I also checked the bar for a scene, and exterior cameras. The bar was closed but had two exterior cameras that likely captured the incident. Abigail stated that there are also cameras inside the bar that would have captured the suspects. Abigail stated that she did not consent to being struck or injured and does want to prosecute her attackers.

No witnesses were with Abigail or on scene and live in various different locations.

On Monday, July 10, 2023, at 1:10AM, Squad 6320 (myself and P.O. Omar PEDROZA-BELTRAN, both in full duty uniforms, equipped with BWCs, and operating a marked MPD squad #098) conducted Follow-Up at 4024 S. Howell Avenue (Jersey's Bar & Grill). Reference CAD #231910088. Upon arrival we noted that the bar was closed at this time. We then changed locations to 3707 S. Whitnall Avenue in an attempt to locate and interview Derek LAIRD. We got no answer upon multiple knocks.

At 6:42AM, we again conducted Follow-Up at 3707 S. Whitnall Avenue. Reference CAD #231910304. Upon arrival, I spoke to resident/Jersey's Bar & Grill General Manager, Megan M. SANTOS (W/F, 10-28-87), who stated that she was working on the evening of the incident which occurred between 11:30PM and 12:00AM but did not witness it. SANTOS stated that there were patrons that she did not know (not regulars) who were outside with their drinks. SANTOS stated that they had to be told to stop going outside with drinks. SANTOS stated that the bartender that was working was "Scott RICK." SANTOS stated that there is video, but she has not reviewed it yet. She stated that she would review it today and put it on a flash drive for me to pick up tomorrow. When I asked why the bar staff did not call police during the incident, SANTOS stated that it was all over, and everybody was leaving. SANTOS stated that at the time, Abigail was just going to go home, and they found out later that she went to the hospital. I advised SANTOS that the bar needs to be calling for a fight like that, even if it's outside. There was no security working at the bar.

I also interviewed, Derek LAIRD, who also lives at this location. Derek stated that there were two Hispanic female and one Hispanic male subject that were involved in the incident with Abigail. One female was wearing a white shirt. Derek stated that he asked the subjects to bring their drinks inside, and there was a back and forth between the subjects and Derek's son, Cole. They were all talking trash, but Derek stated that Cole kept running his mouth. He did not say that Cole instigated the incident, however. Derek stated he told Abigail and Cole to just leave, and as they were attempting to do so they were attacked from behind by the subjects. Derek stated that he had to get involved and pull the male subject off of Cole. I observed scrapes on Derek's elbows, and he stated that was from the incident.

I sent an Axon Community Request for the video to SANTOS, who later uploaded the video to Evidence.com.

I was later able to view the video, which did appear to depict the incident (details as reported) which occurs on the video's time of 10:48PM on 07/08/23.

I did not get to enter the Licensed Premise as it was closed during the times, I attempted to Follow-up there. Therefore, I did not observe any posted Licenses. This could have been remedied if the business personnel had called police at the time of the incident.

Those wishing to provide oral testimony via phone or internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

# Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen: (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
